



his year marked the three quarters of a century timestamp for the dutiful line firefighters and their chiefs at the Highland Lake Volunteer Fire Department (HLFD), located in the Town of Highland.

It all adds up: countless moments of rushing out the door to help a stranger, endless hours of waiting in the right spot just in case something goes wrong, and years spent honing skills required to fight fires to a tee created the backbone of a fire department for 75 years.


HLFD was formed in 1948 due to the desire and need for a fire protection agency following the boom of the hotel and rooming house industry in the area post World War II.

The coverage area for Highland Lake includes all of the Town of Highland. The department also provides mutual aid for fire in the towns of Lumberland and Shahola, PA. For their water

rescue and dive teams, a number of members of Highland Lake serve within the County Dive Task Force, which oversees all of Sullivan County, and parts of Wayne and Pike counties in Pennsylvania.

The current Fire Chief is Warren Wagner, who took up the prestigious mantle in 2013. The fire district's line of past fire chiefs have offered their

time and service to the protection of the coverage area – alongside hundreds of men and women dedicated to the same cause.

Because of this long line of diligent leaders within the community, the servicemen and women of the Highland Lake Fire Department have upheld the service and are always moving forward to fight the fires that threaten their coverage area.

As one of the four volunteer fire departments in the town, Highland Lake currently has about 25 members. Like many of the volunteer-based emergency services in Sullivan County, they are always looking for dependable, qualified men and women to assist.

Former Fire Chief (1978-1987) Joseph Mellan Jr., noted that those who are interested in signing up should stop by the fire hall for regular meetings on Mondays around 7 p.m., located at 144 CR-47 in Highland Lake.



n 1941, 1,500 people were forced to evacuate from the old towns of Bittersweet and Neversink due to the construction of New York City's benchmark reservoir. Neversink was moved and is still on the map today in a new location.

After the mass relocation in 1941, many of the displaced people moved to what is known as the current Town of Neversink. In 1948 the Grahamsville Fire Department started to discuss fire protection for the new Neversink, asking town residents to start covering

the area. When budget restrictions prevented the Grahamsville Fire Department from placing a truck in Neversink, the town's people decided to create their own town department, starting the Neversink Fire Department (NFD) 75 years ago on May 6, 1948.

Back then, the town of Neversink had "nothing to speak of," according to Past Chief Herb Lepke. "The first big fire we responded to was the Healy Warehouse in the valley. It was a storehouse for all sorts of machinery from the excavation of the reservoir and burned for

hours. The more water we poured onto it, the worse it became," continues Lepke.

In 1956, the department began to grow with the addition of their first real firetruck, and newly built firehouse. That same year, the NFD implemented their EMS squad, only the second to exist in Sullivan County.

Present

Led by current chief Michael Congelosi, the NFD today provides both Fire and EMS protection to about 1,000 people, covering approximately 50 square miles. That number almost quadruples in the summertime due to the influx of tourists.

In the center of Neversink's community, still stands the Neversink Fire Department Firehouse and Community Hall that sponsors annual community breakfasts and dinners, offering free trainings and promoting youth involvement in local events.

The NFD prides itself on being







Sullivan 'The Fire Documentary'

olunteer firefighters are among the most important people in our communities, yet far too often they are overlooked.

It's a conclusion Chris Ramirez, a cinematographer and photographer, came to after serving alongside Sullivan County's volunteer first responders, and he hopes his newest film and photography project - "Sullivan Fire: the Documentary" - will shine a light on their valuable contributions. Ramirez, a volunteer interior firefighter with the Rock Hill Fire Department, has taken a hiatus from active service to work on the project.

The idea for his documentary was inspired by his work with the county-wide Join Sullivan Fire initiative, a recruitment and retention task force organized by the Sullivan County Bureau of Fire.

Sustaining the numbers needed to crew-up a volunteer fire department requires innovative thinking, and departments are seeking new

ways to attract and retain members, Ramirez said. The demands of modern life have made it increasingly difficult for people to commit, but without robust fire departments, residents are left vulnerable.

"(The Join Sullivan Fire Task Force) is reaching out to a wider array of people, people with diverse backgrounds, people who perhaps never even considered the volunteer fire service," Ramirez said. "We're working hard to help people discover the rewards of serving your local fire department and realizing the vital contributions they can make."

"Sullivan Fire: the Documentary," Ramirez said, will provide insight into the courageous decisions our volunteers make, and introduce audiences to these first responders who, literally, are also their neighbors.

"On call 24/7, volunteers can go from playing catch with their daughter to carrying someone else's child to an ambulance," Ramirez said. "They leave their jobs, families, and beds, stepping out of their everyday lives and into bunker gear, racing to the rescue."

As a member of the Join Sullivan Fire Task Force, Ramirez and its members work to inspire others to join. He added that serving doesn't always involve going into a burning building; there are many ways to support fire departments. Helping out at the station, driving the trucks, and aiding at the scene are also part of the volunteer job.

Ramirez admits that he can get anxious when the pager tones go off. He's fought fires, and he understands the risks. Initially, he said, it's fear of the unknown, not knowing what the conditions you'll encounter.

"On the way you visualize the scenario through experience and training," he said. "You go over a check list of things you may have to do to mitigate the risks. Focusing on the job is our coping mechanism."

But for those who do answer the

Chris Ramirez, a cinematographer and photographer with over three decades of experience, including working for The New York Times, is producing portraits and profiles of volunteer fire-fighters from 40 fire departments across Sullivan County. The project is part of a campaign for the Sullivan County Bureau of Fire Recruitment and Retention Task Force called Join Sullivan Fire. The social media campaign expects to profile 60 plus firefighters.

Each portrait and profile will roll out once a week on social media Facebook and Instagram.

call, being part of a fire department becomes more than just a job or a hobby – it becomes a way of life, a source of pride, a second family, and a vital service to the community, Ramirez said.

As he pivots from the role of firefighter to documentarian, Ramirez will capture those experiences through his camera. He'll interview firefighters at all stages of their careers, from first-timers to those who have been in the service for more than half a century, capturing their unique perspectives and experiences.

A preview of the documentary will be shown at the Narrowsburg Union's digital gallery space this July and August. It will also be shown on a 16-foot screen and multiple monitors throughout the gallery, creating an immersive experience.

Brendon and Kathy Weiden, proprietors of the Narrowsburg Union, have been "very supportive of the project, allowing me to conduct interviews in their space," Ramirez said. Also supporting the social media campaign is the Sullivan County Volunteer Firefighters Association.

Ramirez's project is a testament to the power of art and storytelling in creating social awareness and appreciation for the unsung heroes of our communities. By sharing their stories, he hopes to honor and celebrate the bravery and ded-

ication of Sullivan County's firefighters and encourage others to join.


"Real-life superheroes are hiding in plain sight, and their story should be told," Ramirez said. "They include a retiree working out at a gym, the parent in the stands at the high school game, and the tired office worker in line behind you at the convenience store. Some of your neighbors are strangers, but if things go wrong with you and you need help, they're firefighters, and they will do their very best to save the day."

Ramirez expects that the production of "Sullivan Fire: the Documentary" will take more than a year or so, during which he'll be responding to scenes with his camera gear, documenting his firefighter colleagues as they take on whatever emergency they are called to.

Ramirez said, "I can't wait to get back to active duty."

Talking policing with Chief D'Agata

t's been almost two years since Steve D'Agata took over for Scott Kinne as the Village of Liberty Police Chief. The Sullivan County Democrat recently sat down with him to talk about changes he's brought to the department, as well as policing topics in general.

The summer of 2020 was a challenging time to take the reins of a police department, between

COVID, civil unrest and anti-police sentiment in the wake of the death of George Floyd in Minnesota. An Executive Order by then NYS Governor Andrew Cuomo soon followed, mandating police reform, which D'Agata said kickstarted a few initiatives he was already looking at bringing to the department.

D'Agata is thrilled with the partnerships the department formed with various community organizations during that process including Sullivan Allies Leading Above: Sergeant Poppo talks to local youth at Hanofee Park.

> Steve D'Agata has been at the helm of the Village of Liberty PD for the past two years.

Together (SALT) and their Committee for Equity and Justice, whom the department meets with on a regular basis.

D'Agata has also encouraged more non-incident interaction between his

officers and the public. This has been done through increased foot patrols, as well as by appointing one of his officers as a "community liaison," who plans "Coffee with a Cop" and "Pedal with Police" events, litter plucks, etc.

"Doing these activities, you're no



longer just an officer [to the public]," D'Agata said. "[For example they'll also know me as Steve]. Then the next time maybe they have an incident, it's not the best day of their life, and the police get called, now they know Steve. If they are anxious or upset, rather than trying to explain themselves to officers they don't know, they can talk with Steve, starting a bad situation off on a better foot."

The police department has also partnered with the Liberty CSD to offer student internships, giving these young people, with an interest in the criminal justice field, an opportunity to gain valuable experience. In turn, Liberty PD builds a relationship with these students who may one day return to work as a dispatcher or police officer.

Opioid Crisis

One of the biggest issues in Sullivan County is the ongoing opioid epidemic. In fact, the County has the highest opioid death per capita rate in the state outside of NYC. D'Agata said he has a two-prong approach to combat it.

Officer Jones with some young visitors who paid a visit to the Village of Liberty Police Station on Main Street. Who knows, they might develop an interest in criminal justice and intern at the department when they're in high school.

On one hand, D'Agata said they are "laser focusing" their criminal investigations, looking at those selling drugs that are causing people to have both non-fatal and fatal overdoses.

"As opposed to just scattershot techniques at narcotics investigations, we're really zeroing in based on criminal intelligence on the people that are selling the drugs that are the most dangerous. We're trying to get them off the streets and further discourage people from pushing dangerous opioids, especially fentanyl," said D'Agata.

On the other side, D'Agata and the Village of Liberty PD have been active participants in the Hope Not Handcuffs program, getting those with substance use disorder the help they need. It's a partnership he said he's "most proud of."

"It's a win-win and great community building tool," said D'Agata. "When people see that the officers are there, other than to arrest them or respond to the call, but instead they're just of-

fering help, it really changes the dynamic with the public."

He added that the "angels" in the program, who volunteer in the process of getting those individuals help, are also working with the police in a different way, creating new and positive relationships.

As for what's ahead in battling

the opioid crisis, D'Agata said the Hope Not Handcuffs program is looking to create a Quick Response Team. Usually someone comes into the police station looking for help, but the new team would bring the program to the front door of someone who has a non-fatal overdose, within 24-72 hours of the incident.

Mental Health

D'Agata said another area he's focused on is mental health, stat-


ing that the number of people experiencing an acute mental health crisis since the pandemic have exploded.

"Police officers, although we're the ones that go [to a call], really are not the best tool for that situation," he said. "So what I can do is train my officers in critical incident training so they can kind of become Mental Health First Aid for the situation. But we've been working very closely with the County, Garnet health and SALT to try and work on the entire sphere of assisting people who are in crisis."

D'Agata, although not entirely sure what it will look like, sees the partnership between law enforcement and social workers growing in the future.

"We have been working with the County and state office of mental health to expand the mobile mental health team because they are really excellent professionals, but there's [currently] not enough personnel or adequate resources

to meet the needs of the County," said D'Agata.

Future of policing

The use of body cams by police has increased in recent years, and the officers of the Liberty PD recently became equipped with them as well, after receiving an \$80,000 grant that assisted with their purchase. After the trial run, D'Agata said any of his officers that may have had initial reservations about the devices were completely on board with the switch.

In addition to his more seasoned officers, Liberty PD had an influx of young hires who were hired since D'Agata took over in

But D'Agata notes, "What they lack in experience, they make up for in intelligence, work ethic, and they get the mission and what we're trying to build here."

As for what else the future holds, D'Agata noted that he's seen more change in the past five years than his first 10-12 in the profession.

He hopes to see more of a focus on evidence-based practices, looking at the science and why things are done a certain way, as opposed to just saying "that's how we've always done it."

"So looking at if an initiative is actually producing tangible, measurable results ... and if it's not, let's try and find a new way to get that done," said D'Agata.

He also believes programs like Hope Not Handcuffs will continue to play a huge role, noting the shift in addressing the war on drugs from how things were looked at in the 90s and early 2000s, which D'Agata said was "punitive."

"Someone was a drug user, they were a criminal, we arrested them. Now, we're realizing that some of the science is coming around on addiction and how it's a disease and the end user is not really a criminal justice problem. It's a health problem," said D'Agata. "And that's an example of an evidence-based practice that I think policing is going towards.""




