




n British slang Clobber (pronounced Claw-bur) is the word for clothes or gear, and was one of the inspirations for the shop Laz Edebiyi and Maxine Edwards decided to open on Barryville's main street in July of 2020, Clobr.

Originally they had looked at opening a place in Livingston Manor, and later considered Narrowsburg, but when they took a trip out to Barryville they quickly fell in love.

Clobr is located at the main intersection with the Delaware River flowing right in front of them and Halfway Brook meeting the river to the side of them. In winter it's calm and quiet, and in summer it's bustling with river-goers.

"When we came out this way, Maxine



saw this little shop and we both thought it was the perfect place to be," said Laz.

Stepping into the shop, it's pleasantly surprising to find that it's geared predominantly towards men.

"We do have some women's stuff in here, but part of the inspiration for opening this shop was not seeing many places around that carry a lot of mens clothing, and that's something that I wanted to offer," explained Laz. "Joan at Narrowsburg Proper actually had some mens items in the back of her store, which she ended up giving to us to help us get started, as she's focusing more on gourmet foods now."

So Maxine and Laz got to work getting the little shop ready to open.

"I'm the front of the shop," said Laz, "but Maxine has been instrumental in the ideas behind a lot of what is in here. I really trust her eye."



There are plenty of walking and hiking trails of various terrain to be found here that are well maintained, and give a glimpse of what makes the Catskills so special.

he old saving April showers bring May flowers couldn't be truer here in the Catskills (it also brings a lot of mud but that's pretty normal for those of us who love it here!). Magnolia trees are in bloom with large pink flowers that fill you with awe. The colors of Daffodil, Crocus, Iris, Trillium, and Common Blue Violets are scattered along the roadways, people's gardens, and shallow woods. Ramps (wild onions), wild ginger, garlic mustard, and wild strawberry are popping up out of the ground if you know where to look. Dogwood trees and forsythia bushes shine with brilliance.

Flowers aren't the only things coming to life, peepers are heard far and wide in all bodies of water, geese are trumpeting their return, deer are nesting in the fields, turkeys are dancing and puffing their feathers, and birds are singing in the mornings.

It's a beautiful time to get out and get hiking.

Some of the most beautiful hiking trails in NY can be found right here in the Catskills, ranging from easy walking to intense climbing.

Frick Pond Loop, located at Beech Mountain Road in the Willowemoc Wild Forest is an easy to moderate 2.2 mile loop that travels through varied terrain from forest and meadows, to wetland. Boardwalks have been installed in certain areas of the trail, making it a family-friendly hike.

The Neversink River Unique Area,

or the Neversink Gorge Trails, is a harder 8.4 mile trail located at Katrina Falls Road, south of Rock Hill. Most of this loop follows the banks of the Neversink River, but you can follow off-shooting trails that lead to Denton Falls, High Falls, and Mullet Brook Falls. It's a well maintained continued on page 18

and marked trail with several bridges here and there, but it can sometimes be slippery with the abundance of surrounding water, so bring sturdy hiking shoes.

Tusten Mountain Trail, or Ten Mile River, located on Tusten Road just a few minutes drive on Route 97 from Narrowsburg is a moderate trail about three miles long. Red Ten Mile River and yellow Scouting symbols mark the trail that begins along the river and then crosses over a stone bridge.


The BashaKill Area has a few loops you can take that range in difficulty. Haven Road to Tower, out and back, is an easy 2.3 mile walk through the marsh toward the rail trail and observation tower. Haven Road toward Wurtsboro is a moderate 4.7 mile round trip, while the BashaKill Southern Loop is a more strenuous 10.4 mile hike. Whichever loop you choose you're sure to see geese or ducks in the water, water lilies and cattails, various birds, and maybe even a beaver or two.

Jensen's Ledges, or the Bouchoux Trail is a moderate 2.1 mile hike located near Lordville that leads up to rock ledges overlooking the Delaware River and the Catskill Mountains. It's perfect for an early morning with the sun coming through the trees, a stop at the waterfall to the right along the way, and the stone quarry where visitors have constructed stone seats, benches, and art forms.

The Rail Trails have been a big focus in Sullivan County the last few years. They are easy, accessible trails that follow the O&W Rail Trail. Some parts are now pavwwwwwed for access to wheelchairs, bikers, walkers, and hikers alike. There are Rail Trails in Parksville, Liberty, Hurleyville, and Fallsburg.

Other walking and hiking trails can be found at Walnut Mountain in Liberty, Balsam Lake Mountain in Beaverkill, Circle Park in Glen Spey, Crystal Lake Loop in Fremont, Huggins Lake Trailhead in Andes, or the Minisink Battleground Park near Barryville.






n order to beat the heat of July, the annual Callicoon Country Fair has bumped up their fun-fair date to Saturday, June 24.






