## cute, quirky and so practical

The red and green exterior of the Forestburgh General Store is fun and bright, matching the interior where you're sure to find just about anything you're looking for from clothes, to food and drink, and gifts.

Porestburgh is one of the smallest towns in Sullivan County, but the hearts of the people you meet there are big. Tyler Jagel and sister Courtenay Hawvermale at the Forestburgh General Store are two of those kinds of people.

The General Store was once a gas station and convenience store with a small garage on the side, standing on Forestburgh's main street for more than 50 years. As businesses in the town slowly began to close, the gas station was the one place close by that people could go to, and when it too eventually closed, it left a big hole that needed to be filled.

"My family has had a house in Forestburgh for a long time, and when this place closed, it was sad," said Tyler. "My sister Courtenay and I eventually saw it on the market, and after talking it through, decided to buy it."

Renovations needed to be done in order to give it a general store vibe, including the ceilings and floors, and converting the garage, but the work was worth it as the store came to life.

It's now a daily destination for local Forestburghers, including the school kids who are often there in the mornings and then again in the afternoons after school

for cookies and ice cream. Members of the Monticello Motor Club, the construction and roadway crews, dam workers from the nearby dam, and now weekend home owners and weekend AirBnB visitors are just some of the many different faces that come and go.

The General Store has morning breakfast sandwiches, coffee, lattes, and cappuccinos. They have lunch and midday sandwiches - on a roll or sub - daily soup specials, as well as fresh cookies baked daily, and pies baked to order.

Craft beers, beverages, cheeses, meats, and various produce can be found in the coolers on the back wall. Clothing hangs on racks in the center, cards to the left, skin care products to the right, jewelry, kids toys, puzzles, miscellaneous gifts - there's a little bit of everything for everyone.

"Maybe we have a little bit too much of everything," Tyler laughed, "but I also think that's what makes it unique here. We try to have one of everything."

The Forestburgh General Store is open everyday 7am to 6pm, so stop in, say hello, and see what you find.

Co-owner Courtenay and her brother Tyler make the shop the bright place that it is, from the delicious sandwiches, soups, and cookies, to the unique selection of local goods that are on display.



## plant paradise

ore than ever before, there is a massive disconnect between people and food - knowing what we're eating, where it comes from, and what happens between harvest and plate. With that disconnect has also come both simplification and lack of variety of what is available to us, as plants and as produce, but not at Wild Yarrow Farm in Cochecton.

Jeffrey Rose has lived in Cochecton with his husband Fernando for more than 20 years, establishing Wild Yarrow Farm back in 2016, after spending years working with his mentor Trina Pilonero at her heirloom organic nursery in Jeffersonville.

Initially when Jeffrey went to work with Trina he was interested in medicinal herbs, but knew he wanted and needed greenhouse experience.

"I worked for plants the first year, and I loved it so much that the next year I asked her to hire me," Jeffrey said with a laugh. "When Trina was moving, she tried to sell the farm as a business but unfortunately I didn't have the means to purchase it. I did want to give it a try though."

Trina gave her entire seed library to Jeffrey, which was quite extensive, as well as a lot of the ancillary stuff

he would need to get started like plant signs and her tag printer. She also introduced him to the market in Union Square, helping him to get accepted

there.

"I still do medicinal herbs here at the farm, but I'm in love with working with such a large variety of plants."

Trina's seed library is of course gone now, but Jeffrey spends plenty of time and money each year selecting seeds. He selects what he knows works and what people like, but he also enjoys exploring and experimenting with plant varieties he's never seen before.

Wild Yarrow Farm promotes genetic diversity, offering over 800 varieties of plants which includes close to 200 different types of tomatoes, along with a broad selection of vegetables, native flowers, and herbs. The farm follows strict organic practices, using only OMRI approved products and natural biological controls like lady beetles and other beneficial insects.

For six years, Jeffrey traveled to the Union Square Market in NYC twice a

week with his seedlings, but this year decided to skip the market in order to focus more extensively on the gardens and the work at Wild Yarrow Farm.

"The demographics have changed so

much in this area that I really feel I can build this up better, and by focusing where I am, I can do more and offer more," Jeffrey said, opening the gate to one of the large greenhouses on the property.

This winter, they started making hypertufa pots and learning about the different alpines and hardy succulents that are well suited for that material.

Hypertufa pots are made of portland cement, peat moss, and either vermiculite or perlite. While the process of making them takes quite a bit of time, they can last more than 10 years outside.

"The succulents are new to me," Jeffrey said, "but I'm really loving it. Some of them just really surprise me." He pointed out one variety that looks like a star constellation.

Jeffrey has also been busy expanding his personal garden to use as a demonstration for customers, so that those who are new to gardening can see how far apart to plant, what thrives best next to something else, and when to plant certain varieties.

And Wild Yarrow Farm doesn't just offer seedlings for Spring planting, but will be open for the Fall season when planting things like broccoli, cauliflower, cabbages, and kales thrive.

So whether you're trying out vegetable gardening for the first or 100th time, have a weekend home that could use a few flower beds, or are a big fan of succulents, stop in to Wild Yarrow Farm Wednesday through Saturday 10am to 5pm, Sunday 10am to 4pm (Hours may change with the season). We guarantee you'll see varieties you never thought could be real.







## through the lens of Dr. Frederick A. Cook

Dr. Frederick A Cook's expedition took place around the same time as the Eastman Kodak Company developed roll-film photography, allowing him to document the world around him while also acting as the expedition's doctor and ethnologist. comprehensive exhibition of Arctic and Antarctic photography by Sullivan County's very own Dr. Frederick Cook will be on display this summer in the Sullivan County Museum in Hurleyville.

Frederick Cook was born in Hortonville to German immigrants in 1865. He studied medicine at what is known today as NYU's Grossman School of Medicine. He later became known as an explorer and excellent photographer.

The exhibition, presented by the Frederick Cook Society, will showcase over 50 photographs taken by Cook between the years 1891 and 1908, during his expeditions to Greenland, Tierra del Fuego, Antarctica, Mount Denali, and the North Pole. The exhibition will include photos of sailing ships, polar landscapes, and a large collection of rare photographs of the Inuit and Indigenous peoples.

The Sullivan County Museum's visiting hours are Tuesday to Saturday, 10am to 4pm, and Sunday 1pm to 4pm. You can also visit frederickcooksociety.org for more information.






