Inventory down; prices up in Sullivan County real estate market

he Hudson Gateway Association of Realtors (HGAR) recently released 2023 second quarter results, reporting higher demand for properties.

However, HGAR mentioned that "Buyer confidence has been shaken by the banking crisis, high interest rates, inflation and a predicted economic downturn or recession.

"The results of the second quarter clearly show that these headwinds remain a concern for many homebuyers and home sellers here and across the nation," the report continues.

In Sullivan County, the number of sales decreased by nearly 30 percent during the first six months of 2023, but the Average Days on the Market (ADOM) for single-family homes declined by 3.5 percent to 70 days.

Sullivan County was the only county in the six-county HGAR region to show a decrease in ADOM.

Inventory continues to be a problem throughout the Hudson Valley, as every county – Sullivan, Orange, Westchester, Putnam, Rockland and Bronx – was down sharply, the HGAR report stated. In Sullivan County Single-family homes for sale now number 363, a 12 percent decrease from the second quarter of 2022, when 412 homes were on the market. In 2020, Sullivan County had 670 single-family homes for sale during the second quarter.

However, with less homes, prices increased in both the median and mean sale prices.

The median sale price, which is the midpoint of all home sales, increased by \$21,000 to \$280,000. This was a 7 percent increase over 2022.

The mean sales price, which is the average price of all sold single-family homes, increased by 10 percent to \$342,637, the report stated.

National Association of Realtors Chief Economist Lawrence Yun said, "The weaker job market combined with decelerating wage growth and calming consumer price inflation are clear indications for the Federal Reserve to stop raising interest rates.

"The American dream of homeownership has been a challenge for younger adults. High mortgage rates, along with the lack of housing inventory, have been the main hindrance," he said. "More effort should be directed toward raising the housing supply by focusing on worker training in home building and lessening barriers to construction so that once interest rates decline, there will not be a resurgence of rapid home price growth."

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The cost of selling or buying a home

t has been a busy summer for this realtor. Lots of action! The buyers that I have been working with have found their dream homes, and most of the inventory that I have has been sold or heading in that direction.

One of the questions that always comes up as the client gets closer to making an offer on a piece of property, or selling their property is, what is this going to cost?

So, I did some research from both the seller and buyers' perspective.

The seller usually pays their attorney, the broker fees, and the transfer fee. In Sullivan County, the transfer fee is \$4.00 per thousand. The attorney fees vary depending upon the complexity of the transaction.

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If it is a straight land sale and there are no issues it can go from a couple of hundred dollars to the low thousand, depending on the size of the lot. If you are selling a home and there are no issues with the property it would be a low amount as well. It also depends on the amount of the sale, the higher the amount the more risk the attorney has and so on.

The broker fee should not be a surprise. Refer to the contract you signed with your realtor when you put your home or land up for sale, and it is indicated in the contract.

The seller should also make sure there are no outstanding violations on the property. Let's say you are selling your home as a 4 bedroom, but you initially purchased the home as a 2 bedroom. Did you get a permit to put in the extra 2 bedrooms? Did the municipality come in and inspect the addition and close out the permit. It might still be outstanding, so check with your local town building department to make sure all is as it should be.

The buyer has a bit more to pay. When an offer is ac-



cepted on a home, the first thing that the buyer does is order an inspection. The size of the home will determine the amount.

One of my clients had one done recently for a 4300 square foot building and it was over \$1,200. Your realtor will be able to give you a couple of companies that do inspections in Sulivan County and you can reach out and shop around.

You also must pay your attorney. If you are financing the transaction, the attorney fee will be higher than a straight cash deal.

Once you sign the contract, the next step is to order title for the property. The cost of the title is determined by the purchase price, and rates are set by New York State. Title is ordered by your attorney, once the contract is signed by both the seller and the buyer.

The next item you should think about is getting a survey done. The buyer will not always opt to get a survey, but I would recommend it. It's important for you to know what you are buying. So do it!

I wanted to get an idea of what the cost would be, so I called a local surveyor to get an idea. He shared with me that they look at a couple of things, they look at the deed, title, where the property is

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located, and if they have a past knowledge of that area.

If you are purchasing a home or land in Fremont Center, and you are hiring a firm from Monticello, it will cost you a lot more, since they might not have knowledge of the area.

Try to get a copy of a survey from the seller, and if you can reach out to that same company to do your survey. Do your research and again talk to your realtor, they can point you in the right direction.

Hoping the above gives you an idea of what buying and selling property entails. A lot of other things can come up. The inspection is so important, and I always breathe a sigh of relief when it comes back good. In most cases, the seller will have to correct the issue, or lower the asking price.

Looking at the local market in Sullivan County for the end of July 2023, (comparing it to July of 2022) new listings are still running slightly behind at -29.5 percent, Closed sales are at -38.5 percent from 96 (2022) to 59 presently. The median sales price has fallen by -12.3 percent. The inventory of homes for sale is at -28.7 percent. This has been consistent with this year.

I wanted to leave you with this last piece of information. Since we are approaching the fall weather and some of you out there are repainting their decks and porches, I thought you might be interested to know what the "hottest" stain color of this year is.

According to Design

Architecture Trends, it's Behr's first ever stain color: Cordovan Brown. It's a classic dark shade of brown that allows the wood grain to pop through, and it pairs well with light colors.
