EDITORIAL

Training to protect ourselves and others

s there a fire in you?" The question posed by the Join Sullivan Fire initiative as a means of recruitment and retention has been answered by many throughout history, whether they realized it or not.

At its core, the volunteer fire service is a means of protecting your community. Firefighters volunteer their time to train on ways to provide more effective responses to emergencies.

Departments around the county work together to coordinate their responses to mitigate emergencies. Knowing your neighbor's resources and creating a network of mutual aid adds a layer of comraderie to the fire service that extends beyond one's home department.

Roscoe-Rockland Fire The

Department (RRFD), host of the 2023 SCVFA County Parade, expanded upon this layer of comraderie this year. A joint drill that began in the firehouse between members of the RRFD and Roscoe-Rockland Volunteer Ambulance Corp. caught the attention of other departments around Sullivan County.

The drill that they've gone on the road to demonstrate across the county is a Firefighter Down CPR scenario. The hands-on training simulates getting a firefighter out of their gear rapidly to begin providing life-saving care.

"Firefighters wear heavy turnout gear and work in stressful atmospheres," Sullivan County Fire Coordinator John Hauschild explained. "Unfortunately once in a while, a firefighter goes down."

A lot of the training that first

responders attend are necessary, house and meet the members. although it is the type of thing you hope you never have to encounter.

"We never want to see one of our own go down," Hauschild said. "But it is important to know what to do if it happens."

First responders all over the county have been busy, with the number of calls up from 2021 to 2022. According to the data, there was a 2.6 percent increase in calls from June of 2022 to June of 2023 as well.

For anyone interested in joining a local fire department or learning more about the fire service, John Hauschild's message is simple.

"Come down to the fire

There's something for everyone to do in the fire service."



Healthiest Fire Department Challenge



n January, Sullivan 180 kicked off the Healthiest Fire Department Challenge. The intention of the program was to support and serve the firematic community, most of whom are volunteers serving others, sometimes at the cost of their own personal health.

According to the Firefighter Cancer Support Network, from the moment the tones drop, a firefighter's heart rate increases 47 beats per minute. At any time of day or night, in any type of weather conditions, firefighters stop what they are doing and respond to an emergency. They are consistently managing the balance between family, work and community service. Disturbed sleep patterns, typical for firefighters, take an enormous toll. Absorbing the trauma of each call has impacts that are not always immediate or obvious. For these and other reasons, firefighters face significant and unique health challenges. Research shows more than 50 percent of all firefighters have elevated blood pressure, are obese and pre-diabetic. 90 percent or more have poor diet or exercise habits. Firefighters hold the highest suicide rate of any first responder.

Since the challenge launched, 17 departments have engaged in activities (challenges) to enhance the physical and mental health of their members. Departments received credit in the form of "turtle points" for each health focused activity they completed. The challenges were meant to be easy and attainable but impactful.

Activities ranged from serving healthier meals during drill and meeting nights; joining as a department family and hiking or walking local trails; attending health related seminars and becoming trained in suicide prevention. There were even water consumption and weight loss challenges.

"Traditionally, the chosen meal for after departments hold their drill and/or their

History of the Roscoe-Rockland Fire Department

f you're traveling through the hamlet of Roscoe, it isn't hard to spot the Roscoe-Rockland Fire Department, as they've been a true pillar in the community for several decades. They're a 100 percent volunteer fire department, currently covering a sizeable district as well as many protection districts. They operate with two Class A pumpers, a 100' Saulsbury Aerial Ladder truck, 3,000 gallon tanker, a mini rescue, and a utility truck/Kubota for ATV accidents and fire police usage.

But like every department, there's a storied history, and what is currently one was once two departments. The Roscoe Hose Company was formed in 1892, and two years later, the Rockland Hose Co. was organized. Rockland charged 10 cents a month dues, Roscoe is unknown at this time. In order to raise money back then, they'd have oyster suppers. The oysters arrived the morning of the fundraiser on an O & W train, and were served up that night. Both fire companies had their mettle tested in the horrific fire of November 1916, when a fire destroyed 23 buildings in Roscoe. The canvas hose burned off the fire hydrant and the heat was so intense that the hydrant couldn't be turned off. The men had to resort to bucket brigades and hand pumping water from the river.

The Spring of 1927

The Roscoe Fire Laddies were burned out of their home, a loss of around \$25,000. A big fire started in a garage next to the fire station and spread to the fire station occupied by the fire department...the Roscoe firemen were able to save their apparatus. Also that year, Roscoe floated a merger idea to Rockland. On May 26, 1927 Rockland rejected Roscoe's plans for a joint fire district. Their reasoning: 'We can take care of our own town. Rockland now has its own company and equipment and has always been able to take care of its own fires with the exception of the Methodist Church which burned several years ago. The Rockland



water main does not carry enough water for two pumpers to work at the scene.'

The Rockland Fire Hall is large, having a seating capacity for 200, a stage and a fine dancing floor."

Both companies began to fund raise in earnest with pancake suppers and dances held at the respective fire halls. Finally, in 1929, the new Roscoe Fire House was built, "at a cost of \$27,000." This building is now owned by Prohibition Distillery.

Hotel fires were always a problem...

In 1932, the Lakewood Inn burned to the ground despite the best efforts of both Roscoe and Rockland Hose Companies. Eventually both departments merged to form the Roscoe-Rockland Fire Department in 1996!

Some general fire history

So why did the members volunteer? The ultimate goal was to protect homes and property. It was only open to men at the time, but later, women formed an auxiliary to provide sandwiches and coffee to exhausted men during and after a fire.

As far as equipment, they had hose carts only to start with. These were canvas hoses coiled around two big wheels and pulled by hand or by a horse. There were no light trucks, no turn-out gear, no air DEMOCRAT FILE PHOTO

bottles, and most importantly, no radios to call for more manpower. Huge iron rings stood outside of the fire station and were struck with a hammer to summon the volunteers, usually at night and from a warm bed. Horses were saddled, lanterns were lit, (there was no electricity and certainly no flashlights!) and the men banded together to fight a common enemy... the fire. Firefighting originally involved squads of men roving through city streets seeking fires. The squads were sometimes called the 'Rattle Watch' because they 'rattled the alarm'.

Other groups sounded a bell and then organized a bucket brigade; everyone was expected to help. Pretty much all of the groups later formed clubs or mutual fire societies, hence the fire companies or 'a company of men'.

Ben Franklin is thought to be the first fire chief because in 1735 he formed a fire brigade called the Union Fire Company. They met monthly to discuss firefighting techniques... sound familiar? Even George Washington was a volunteer and later purchased and donated a new fire engine. Years ago, fire departments often became powerful political machines, too.

The Civil War era saw entire fire companies joining up together and that's where the current rank system came about. The army soldiers received a rank, i.e.; captain, lieutenant, sergeant, and continued to use that title when they came home to their local fire brigade. Now after the Civil War, fire companies were either government established or private.

The government run fire companies became the paid departments of today. However, some of the private groups were owned by fire insurance companies! Those companies then put symbols or 'fire marks' on buildings to show that the burning building received money from the insurance company! In Roscoe, the Sanborn Insurance Company carried this idea a step farther and started mapping towns while identifying fire risks. It is because of this map that we know where the Roscoe Hose Cart was located in 1904, coincidentally, on the site of the later 1929 firehouse.

Mr. Maus had a livery stable next door and would allow the firemen to use one of his horses if needed in a fire. Unfortunately, Sanborn didn't map out Rockland as that was considered a residential area. The failed fish hatchery building became the first firehouse in 1975.

According to their history, there was a garage built in 1946, a meeting room added in 1958, and when the old fish hatchery building was torn down, a new building was constructed around the old in 1975.

Firefighting has come a long way since 1892. The equipment is modern, ladders higher, the very best turn-out gear, helmets, boots, and let's not forget better communication!

But the level of dedication remains the same! The fire whistle sounds and volunteers rush towards a fire with the same determination, bravery and courage as those hardy souls in 1892!



125 years of tradition in Wurtsboro

n October 20, 1898, a group of community-minded Wurtsboro residents gathered together to form the Wurtsboro Hose Company. Fast forward 125 years to today, that same fire company still stands strong, protecting the surrounding area as the Wurtsboro Fire Department.

Despite a number of company mergers and name changes, the dedication to protect people, preserve property and prevent fire stands as a staple in the community. Over the past two decades, the department has seen remarkable changes in numerous ways and has settled into the present.

This year, the fire department is expecting to reach nearly 300 answered calls to duty, with roughly 70 members currently active. 15 of

those local heroes are lifetime members of the company who continue to remain active in the defense of their community.

Wurtsboro Fire Chief Dustin Graham has been with the department for 30 years.

The fire apparatus located at the department backs up the statement, as it is noted to be some of the most modern in the tri-county area with state-of-the-art equipment and updated fire fighting techniques. On top of that, the fire department moved into a new home just three years ago.

In December of 2020, the new firehouse was opened and became the new home for the Wurtsboro Fire Department.

"Our Board of Fire Commissioners has worked diligently and within the fiscal parameters of the tax base to achieve this goal. Our Officers and Commissioners continue to work, hand in hand, in a team effort for the betterment of the fire district, department and community," said the fire district's Chairman Bill Lothrop.
