Feeding your furry family members

Then putting together your holiday dinner spreads, you might have some food scraps that you want to share with the family dog. There are some great options for sharing with your four-legged friend, but there are also some foods you'll want to stay away from.

It's common knowledge that dogs can't have chocolate, but did you know that ham is also bad for dogs?

Instead, if you have a turkey, your dog can have some, as long as you leave off the skin, fat and bones.

Fruits and veggies that you can share with your pup include carrots, celery, corn (no cob), sweet potatoes, green beans, apples (no core/seeds) and pumpkin.



Loving Leftovers a Turkey Day Tradition

ots of people look forward to Thanksgiving for a variety of reasons. For some, time spent with the family reigns supreme, while others enjoy spending some quality time on the couch watching football. But for most, the best thing about Thanksgiving is the food. Turkey, stuffing, cranberry sauce, and, of course, leftovers.

Perhaps more than the freshly cooked turkey itself, Thanksgiving celebrants love their leftovers. To many, the joy of the Thanksgiving feast comes on Friday afternoon, when they get their pick of the leftovers litter. Among the more popular choices is the turkey sandwich, such as the following recipe for "Open-Faced Turkey Sandwich with Sweet and Sour Onions," courtesy of The Culinary Institute of America's "The Professional Chef: 8th Edition" (Wiley).

Open-Faced Turkey Sandwich w/ Sweet and Sour Onions

Makes 10 Servings

1 pound, 4 ounces onion julienne

4 fluid ounces clarified butter

fluid ounces soy sauce fluid ounces duck sauce

4 fluid ounces water 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder,

or as needed

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger, or as needed

10 slices white Pullman bread, 1/4-inch thick, toasted

pounds, 8 ounces thinly sliced roasted turkey

20 tomato slices

pound, 4 ounces thinly

sliced Swiss cheese

Salt, as needed

Ground black pepper, as needed

1. Saute the onions in the butter until translucent. Add the soy sauce, duck sauce and water. Simmer until the onions are fully cooked and dry. Season with garlic powder, ginger, salt, and pepper.

- 2. For each sandwich, spread some of the onion mixture on a slice of toast. Cover with about 41/2 ounces of turkey. Spread the additional onion mixture over the turkey. Place two slices of tomatoes on top, then cover the tomatoes with two ounces of cheese.
- 3. Bake in a 350 F oven until the sandwich is heated through and the cheese is melted. Serve immediately.


