Who inspires you: My Aunt, Loretta Saltzman. She is 104 years young! Lol





- Make to-do lists with future-you in mind by adding extra details. For example, instead of just writing "Call the dentist," include the phone number. This small step saves time and makes it easier to jump right in.

These small strategies help keep me on track, even when my motivation is low.

What advice do you have for someone entering your field:

Non-profits need people who genuinely believe in the mission and are prepared to dive in whole-heartedly. For women entering any field, my advice is to recognize your worth and never hesitate to ask for it. This may sound straightforward, but it requires self-reflection to truly understand what you're willing to give and

where your boundaries lie. Once you define these for yourself, decisions become clearer, and you'll start attracting opportunities that align with the life you want to build. Stand firm in honoring your boundaries, and always be willing to advocate for what you need and deserve.
