



The Village Board on June 25, 2018 adopted the following Grievance Procedure as it relates to the Village's ongoing compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

#### ADA GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Step 1 - A written grievance should be filed with the Village Clerk's Office and contain the following information: The name, address and telephone number of the person filing the grievance. The name, address and telephone number of the person alleging the ADA violation, if other than the person filing the grievance. A description of the alleged violation and remedy sought. An oral grievance can be filed with the Village Clerk's Office. The oral grievance will be reduced to writing and will be signed by the grievant.

Step 2 - The grievance will be forwarded to the Village Mayor and Board who will consult the Village's Engineer to determine if the Village is complying with ADA Section 504. If the Engineer decides that the complaint is valid, he or she will provide the Village Board with the recommended solution. If the Village is compliant with Section 504 requirements, the grievant will be notified of the findings. The Village Board will either respond to or acknowledge the grievance within 20 working days of receipt.

This ADA Grievance Procedure is posted on the bulletin board of the Village Clerk at Village Hall, 167 North Main Street, Liberty, New York.
