Current title and duties: I'm the Multi-Platform Content Producer at Radio Catskill. Translation: I wear many hats. I help manage the website and social media, support our expanding newsroom, write and produce news reports, and conduct interviews. I also co-produce two of our signature programs, The Local Edition and Radio Chatskill, and create long-form audio and video content for the station.

Years of experience: I've been in journalism for about 13 years, starting out as a photojournalist with the Bronx Times and New York Post. When I moved from the Bronx to the Catskills, I began reporting more for the Sullivan County Democrat, where I still contribute news stories and special features. Radio came into the picture about five years ago—where I found a way to merge my

love for storytelling, writing, and audio production.

Why did you choose this ca**reer?** Honestly, it chose me. After college, I imagined myself living the artist life—photography projects, gallery openings, the whole scene. Meanwhile, I was doing real estate for 16 years in the Bronx and running a photography business for weddings and events. When I moved to the Catskills, I shifted into writing and reporting full-time. That's when I found my voice—not just creatively, but as a journalist. It was less about chasing stories and more about connecting with the people and places around me. I'm still learning, still evolving.

Favorite part of your job: Meeting interesting people and hearing their stories. There's something special about giving folks a platform to speak about their lives. It's powerful to know that the stories I help tell can spark conversations—or even change something.

Most challenging part of your job: Balancing work and family. You want to give your all to the community and your craft, but not at the cost of missing import-

ant moments with loved ones. For me, that means making time for my daughter Lucy—she's the

heart of it all.

Favorite on-the-job moment, customer or memory: One story that sticks with me involves an older couple who had massive tree trunks dumped on their lawn by NYSEG after some utility work. The mess sat there for months. I took the story thinking it would be straightforward, but instead, I met this kind, welcoming couple who really opened up to me. I made a few calls and let folks know I was working on a story. The next thing you know, NYSEG called the couple, and within a week, those trees were gone. They sent me a thank-you letter I still have. That was the moment I truly understood the power of local journalism. It wasn't just about the story—it was about being part of the community.

How do you manage your time: I live by my calendar, to-do lists, and journaling. I block out time to be present with my daughter while still carving space to write, record, and produce. It's a balancing act—but one I take seriously

How many years of experience do you have: After residency, 10 years.

Why did you choose this career?

Medicine somewhat chose me. I initially went to college with the goal to pursue microbiology/research. I had the privilege of shadowing a pediatric emergency physician in New Jersey. Prior to this experience I only knew medicine to be either primary care in an office, or surgery. Once I saw what emergency medicine was, I never turned back.

What is the most challenging part of your job: My answer is the same to both my favorite and most challenging aspects of what I do: In the emergency department we are faced with multiple complicated patients, often at the same time. Being able to contribute positively to each person's experience is both challenging

and extremely rewarding simultaneously. It's why I come back to this every day.

What is your favorite on-thejob memory: I have many, but the common theme in each experience is being able to connect to patients in a very brief period of time to help them navigate what is often one of the most challenging days of their lives. This can be the unexpected birth of a new baby (and being able to be the first person to say "happy birthday" to a new life), navigating an unexpected death of a loved one, or introducing a patient to a new diagnosis that will have profound impact on the rest of their life. As an emergency medicine physician, I am here to help with all of those experiences.

How do you manage your time: Very delicately. Medicine is a demanding career that I try to balance with my home life including my wife and children. Its important to value what I do professionally and not forget that my life outside of work has equal (if not greater) value. An accurate and active calendar is our starting point as a family.

What advice do you have for someone entering your field: Medicine has many positives, but it is very demanding in nearly every direction. To be successful in this field, you must love it in all its forms. Persistence over time is

a needed personality trait as the path is quite long to get here.

Who inspires you: My kids. Seeing someone learn something for the first time is a constant reminder of how fortunate I am to have had the life-experiences leading me to where I am today. They force my attention away from my career, which is a lesson I try to never forget.

What is your favorite vacation spot: Block Island, Rhode Island. This spot has special significance to my family and has become a part of our family story in so many ways.

Family members: I am married to my incredible wife with three awesome kids aged 7, 5, and 2 years old.

If you could have any job, what would it be: A chef. Food has so many creative outlets while bringing joy (hopefully) and nourishment to those who you serve. I think it is one of the most interesting and, unfortunately, thankless careers.
