

Get your motors running for the 29th Callicoon Tractor Parade this Sunday, June 8

allicoon will be bursting with excitement on Sunday, June 8 as they welcome the 29th Annual Tractor Parade to town. The Grand Marshal of the Parade will be Town of Delaware Clerk Tess McBeath.

The parade will kick off at noon sharp starting on Lower Main Street. Guests are encouraged to come and join in on the fun and make some grand memories.

After the parade, attendees can keep the fun going by coming over to the Delaware Youth Center (DYC) for a delicious barbecue and some snacks.

In addition, collectors Tractor Parade t-shirts will be available in a limited supply. They can be found for sale in town and at the DYC

Important to note is that tractor registration opens at 8 a.m. at the DYC. There is a nonexistent fee in order to enter the parade but the DYC does accept and appreciate donations of any size to offset the cost of putting the event on.

Some rules to keep in mind

While attendees are encouraged to have a great time, the DYC urges everyone to keep in mind several important things.

They strongly discourage parking at AGWAY. Also, if you have a tractor, you are strongly urged to come early to the DYC to drop off your tractor and to register.

Other vehicles, on the other hand, will be directed elsewhere in town for parking. If you only bring a tractor, then you can just line up at the DYC and drive the tractor in

the parade when it begins.

To help out, volunteers will be on hand along the route and cooperation is much appreciated in following their directions. Children are also strongly urged to not be on laps or fenders, as it is extremely dangerous.

Speaking of driving safely, alcohol is not allowed and drinking and driving will be strictly off limits. To enforce this, police will be on hand keeping a watchful eye.

As the DYC states: "Be smart and careful!"

Pulling tractors will also not be allowed, proof that the tractor can run and has working brakes will be requested. In addition, this parade is not for political or commercial gain, so political signs and advertisements are a big NO.

Guests and registrants are en-

couraged to have fun and come out. It's sure to be a day of excitement, memories and tradition.

And Don't Forget about the Food

Also, Tractor Parade Sunday features a delicious Pancake Breakfast, compliments of the Callicoon Fire Dept. on Route 97, Callicoon.

The breakfast runs from 7 a.m. until 11 a.m., giving eaters time to get downtown and find a place to watch the parade.

And, the Delaware Youth Center will be featuring a chicken barbecue or pulled pork dinner along with a hay bale throwing contest – for all you wanna be farmers out there – as well as a Tractor Parade Super Slide raffle.

There are also plenty of restaurants in Callicoon to enjoy a bite or beverage during the parade.

Tess McBeath to lead the 2025 Tractor Parade as Grand Marshal

Delaware Town Clerk honored for decades of service and community leadership

less McBeath, longtime Town Clerk for the Town of Delaware, will lead this year's Callicoon Tractor Parade as Grand Marshal. The recognition comes as she prepares to retire after 28 years in office.

"I think it's [because] I'm retiring," McBeath said of the honor, "and all the volunteering I've done all the years."

A lifelong Hortonville resident, McBeath reflected on her childhood.

"We just had the run of town," she said. "Nobody's yard was sacred. We were all over the place and in the

McBeath has a long history with the event, which began in 1997.

"It was the brainchild of Rosie de-Christofaro and Kathy Langley of the Callicoon Business Association," she

Once the Youth Center took the reins in 2004, the parade grew expo-

McBeath was integrally involved for eight years. "It's a tremendous volunteer effort," she said. "Back in the day, we had a great board ... and they all worked together to organize



the event."

McBeath explained exactly what goes into planning such an event. "The devil's in the details," she said, "T-shirts, registrations, parking, food, police, ambulance – it all takes time to coordinate."

McBeath was sure to highlight the efforts of the many people that work hard to put together the event.

"I once asked a friend to work in the hot dog stand," she said, "she was there three years before telling me, 'Tess, I'm a vegetarian.' She just did it out of the goodness of her heart."

As Youth Center president, Mc-Beath helped bring the organization back from financial hardship. "We were \$10,000 in debt," she

The Youth Center hustled to raise funds. McBeath said, "We sold hot dogs and candy bars at soccer games. We brought it back after three floods."

Her favorite projects included updating the playground and ath-

letic fields. "We redid the tennis and basketball courts," she said. "We raised money and put clay on the infield – but then the 2004 flood sent all that clay down to New Jersey."

After attending Holy Cross and Delaware Valley schools, Mc-Beath spent 13 years in Colorado, working for the governor's office and social services. She returned home, worked for a lawyer, raised her son, and was elected town clerk.

"Twenty-eight years later, I'm ready to pass the torch to another town clerk," she said.

As Grand Marshal, she's proud to ride in a parade she helped build. "We need farmers, and farmers need tractors," McBeath said. "Today, we celebrate relics from the past—tractors all spiffed out to show the town they're proud of where they come from. It's a chance for locals and new locals alike to come together and celebrate farming."

ennis Eschenberg, owner and operator of John H. Eschenberg Inc., has been part of the family business since 1959, when he began working for his father at just nine years old. Now more than six decades later, Eschenberg still keeps the doors open on Route 17B, running the shop with the same work ethic it was founded on.

"Since 1947," Eschenberg said. "I came to work for him as a kid in 1959... I've been here ever since."

He shared the history of the property — a former farm with roots going back to 1915. He pointed out the original barn floor and the family house, which survived a devastating flash flood in 1947. "My mother stood back in the house... she thought the house

was going to be washed away."

The family originally relocated from New York City during the Great Depression, bringing workers and relatives to the prop-Callicoon erty. "They didn't have anything," Eschenberg recalled. "In the wintertime, they would stay in the house while they built their own homes."

The current showroom has

grown through a series of additions. "When I graduated from school in '68, I said, 'Dad, we need to put more room,' but we couldn't get anyone to do the foundation," Eschenberg said, "of course now you could never get the permit. 'Well,' he said, 'you dig the hole and we'll put the foundation,"

"Everything was done by hard work," he said proudly.

Though he has never driven in the tractor parade himself, Eschenberg is a supporter of the event and its role in the community:

"Anything that's good for the community is good for us. It's good for Callicoon."

Today, the business continues to sell and service a wide range of outdoor equipment.






