County fuel, staffing, budget issues discussed

The rising cost of fuel prices in the County's budget as well as staffing shortages and future school projects was discussed at last week's meeting of Bedford County Commission's Finance Committee.

Finance Director Robert Daniel said the County is \$840,000 ahead of last year in their property tax collections. Sales tax collections are up \$1.1 million compared to last year.

"The majority of that is debt service and schools, so when it goes to

debt services, it's going for school construction," Daniel said.

Daniels said the County architect John Davis has got the new Community school wing out to bid, while they are designing plans for

the new elementary school. 'We're excited to get projects started," said Schools Director Tammy Garrett. She also added that lightning had struck the Community School, which damaged the school's (announcement) system. However, the bid came in "better than we thought," according to

Garrett,

Juvenile detention A loss of \$175,000 a year is projected for Bedford County Juvenile Detention Center by officials. This is down from last fall when the Center was projected to lose \$224,000 a

The Center will also be increasing its rates charged to other counties from \$132 to \$145 per day. According to their monthly report,

Graduate credits change will be costly

While it may move the three high schools past the bare minimum requirements for graduation, the new high school redesign, approved recently by Bedford

County Board of Education, carries a pretty significant price tag. The system is planning a phase-in over several years to move graduation requirement

credits from 22 to 28. Next school year will involve teachers only, getting them acquainted with a new 4x4 block learning schedule. First off, the system will have to hire 15 additional teachers

for a 4x4 block schedule. Tim Harwell, assistant director of schools, talked to the board and at Harris Middle School.

The additional teachers will be

spread across all Bedford County high schools, Harwell said. "With those positions in mind, there will be an additional \$900,000 which will be a reoccurring expense in the annual budget. Also the estimated start up cost would be \$600,000, and that would not be reoccurring."

Harwell explained the state's new funding formula, which he said would benefit greatly Bedford County—up to \$11 million. "We're asking that on the start up . . . \$1.5 [million] of that would be helping us redesign our high schools.'

How does this benefit stu-

dents? Harwell explained that to the audience which filled the Harris Middle School Library. "Each student will partici-



Uvalde locals grapple with school chief's role

UVALDE, Texas — The blame for an excruciating delay in killing the gunman at a Texas elementary school — even as parents outside begged police to rush in and panicked children called 911 from inside — has been placed with the school district's homegrown police chief. It's left residents in the small city

of Uvalde struggling to reconcile what they know of the well-liked local lawman after the director of state police said that the commander at the scene — Pete Arredondo made the "wrong decision" last week not to breach a classroom at Robb Elementary School sooner, believing the gunman was barricaded inside and children weren't at risk. Steven McCraw, the head of the Texas Department of Public Safety,

that after following the gunman into the building, officers waited over an hour to breach the classroom. Nineteen children and two teachers were killed in the shooting. Arredondo, who grew up in Uvalde and graduated from high school here, was set to be sworn in Tuesday to his new spot on the City Council after being elected earlier this month, but

Mayor Don McLaughlin said in a

statement Monday that the meeting

wouldn't happen. It wasn't immedi-

said at the Friday news conference

ately clear whether the swearing-in would happen privately or at a later "Pete Arredondo was duly elected to the City Council," McLaughlin said in the statement. "There is nothing in the City Charter, Election Code, or Texas Constitution that prohibits him from taking the oath of

The 50-year-old Arredondo has spent much of a nearly 30-year career in law enforcement in Uvalde, returning in 2020 to take the head police job at the school district.

When Arredondo was a boy, Maria Gonzalez used to drive him and her children to the same school where the shooting happened. "He was a good boy," she said.

"He dropped the ball maybe because he did not have enough experience. Who knows? People are very angry," Gonzalez said.

Another woman in the neighborhood where Arredondo grew up began sobbing when asked about him. The woman, who didn't want to give her name, said one of her granddaughters was at the school during the shooting but wasn't hurt.

Juan Torres, a U.S. Army veteran who was visibly upset with reports coming out about the response, said he knew Arredondo from high

"You sign up to respond to those kinds of situations" Torres said. "If you are scared, then don't be a police officer. Go flip burgers." After his election to the City

Council, Arredondo told the Uvalde Leader-News earlier this month that he was "ready to hit the ground run-"I have plenty of ideas, and I defi-

nitely have plenty of drive," he said,

adding he wanted to focus not only

on the city being fiscally responsible

but also making sure street repairs and beautification projects happen. At a candidates' forum before his election, Arredondo said: "I guess to me nothing is complicated. Everything has a solution. That solution starts with communication.

Communication is key." McCraw said Friday that minutes after the gunman entered the school, city police officers entered through the same door. Over the course of more than an hour, law enforcement from multiple agencies arrived on the scene. Finally, officials said, a U.S. Border Patrol tactical team used a janitor's key to unlock the classroom door and kill the gunman.

McCraw said that students and teachers had repeatedly begged 911 operators for help while Arredondo told more than a dozen officers to wait in a hallway. That directive which goes against established active-shooter protocols - prompted questions about whether more lives were lost because officers didn't

Two law enforcement officials have said that as the gunman fired at students, law enforcement officers from other agencies urged Arredondo to let them move in because children were in danger, The officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they had not been authorized to talk publicly about the investigation. McLaughlin, the Uvalde mayor,

pushed back on officials' claims, including remarks made over the weekend by Texas' lieutenant governor, that they weren't told the truth about the massacre. 'Local law enforcement has not

specifics of the investigation or (misled) anyone," he said in a Monday Arredondo started out his career in law enforcement working for the

Uvalde Police Department. After

made any public comments about the

spending 16 years there, he went to Laredo, a border city located 130 miles (209 kilometers) miles to the south, where he worked at the Webb County Sheriff's Office and then for a local school district, according to a 2020 article in the Uvalde Leader-News on his return to his hometown to take the school district police chief

Ray Garner, the police chief of the district in Laredo where Arredondo worked, told the San Antonio Express-News in a story published after the Uvalde shooting that when Arredondo worked in the Laredo district he was "easy to talk to" and was concerned about the students.

"He was an excellent officer down

here," Garner told the newspaper . "Down here, we do a lot of training on active-shooter scenarios, and he was involved in those." Arredondo, who spoke only briefly at two short news conferences on the day of the shooting, appeared behind

state officials speaking at news conferences over the next two days, but was not present at McCraw's Friday news conference. After that news conference, members of the media converged at Arredondo's home and police cruisers took up posts there. At one point, a man answering the door at

was "indisposed." "The truth will come out," said the man before closing the door.

Arredondo's house told a reporter for

The Associated Press that Arredondo

State Sen. Roland Gutierrez, a Democrat whose district includes Uvalde, said on CNN's "State of the Union" that he's asking a lot of questions after "so many things went

He said one family told him that a first responder told them that their child, who was shot in the back, likely bled out. "So, absolutely, these mistakes may have led to the passing away of these children as well," Gutierrez said.

Gutierrez said while the issue of which law enforcement agency had or should have had operational control is a "significant" concern of his, he's also "suggested" to McCraw "that it's not fair to put it on the local (school district) cop.'

"At the end of the day, everybody failed here," Gutierrez said.

Coal ash workers dying as lawsuit drags on

NASHVILLE (AP) — In 2013, the first of more than 200 workers who labored to clean up the nation's worst coal ash spill filed a suit against the contractor, blaming Jacobs Engineering for illnesses they believe were caused by exposure to heavy metals and radioactive particles in the ash. Nearly a decade later, not a single case has made it through the court system.

As the cases drag on, dozens who believed their work for the contractor made them sick have died.

They include people like Ansol Clark, who arrived at the Tennessee Valley Authority's Kingston Fossil Plant just hours after the Dec. 22, 2008, spill, and got to work. He labored long hours in the coal ash sludge with few or no days off for months at a time until he became

too sick to work in 2013. He died last year from a rare blood cancer that he believed was caused by exposure to

"Ansol never lived to see any justice," his wife of almost 50 years. Janie Clark, said. "He never did on earth."

Over the years, Jacobs has made repeated attempts to have the suits thrown out. The Tennessee Supreme Court is scheduled to hear oral arguments on Wednesday in Jacob's latest challenge to the workers' lawsuits. The company wants a judge to dismiss most of the plaintiffs for failing to follow a procedure outlined in the Tennessee Silica Claims Priorities

The law requires anyone pursuing claims for exposure to silica or mixed dust to file a doctor's report concluding that the exposure is a "substantial contributing factor" to the patient's illness. For plaintiffs bringing wrongful death claims on behalf of a loved one, they must also show the worker was exposed to the dust for at least five years. Workers with lung cancer are subject to the five-year provision too and additionally must show that their cancer was diagnosed at least 10 years after their first exposure to the dust.

In court filings, Jacobs said the vast majority of plaintiffs either didn't file the doctor reports, filed inadequate reports, or didn't meet the time restrictions. For example, one worker died from lung cancer in 2015, less than seven years after the spill, so should not be allowed to sue, according to Jacobs.



Andrea, use sudsy ammonia and water. Half a cup of ammonia to one gallon of water should do the trick. Over time, bleach and even vinegar will eat away at the grout. -- Heloise

Bake in greased and floured tube pan at 325 degrees for about 1 to 1 1/2 hours.

I've been asked when we'll start the Bedford County Farmers Market for this year. We host the market at the Farmers Market Pavilion at the Celebration Grounds in Shelbyville.

We are sending out an email to our vendors this week to check on their vegetable crops progress. Our vendors are here in Bedford County and the lower middle Tennessee area, and the late cold and wet spring delayed their gardening. We'll be letting everyone know by this article, the Farmers Market website, our Extension website and our email newsletter.

We usually get started in mid-June and I hope that's the case this year as well. We expect to have a good group of vendors again this year. Anyone that may be interested in selling at the market should contact me to start the application process. We screen our vendors to verify they grow what they sell. We also operate by the recommended guidelines for these markets from the Tennessee Department of Agriculture. There are some things we don't allow for one reason or another, so we'll need to discuss your products

POISON HEMLOCK

I have mentioned this deadly weed before. It is a bad one, and it is common in the middle Tennessee area. I have real concerns here for exposure to the plant by unknowing adults and children as well. I've attached a picture of this plant I found in a ditch along one of our county roads.

I relayed a few weeks ago that I had read an article about a gentleman who had experienced exposure to the deadly chemicals in the sap when he cleaned up a weedy area on his lot. He absorbed it through his skin and breathed some droplets in when he used lawn equipment that caused the moisture to be in the air. This man was in the hospital in his home town for 109 days and was very critical during

most of that time.

I received a message from one of my coworkers in east Tennessee about a young girl who smelled the flower structure on this plant. It looks like Queen Ann's lace, with a white flower structure containing many little florets.

This youngster's reaction to the plant started out with a rash, and shortly it turned into swelling and a terrible reaction. Just inhaling the pollen and the aroma caused a lot of pain and suffering.

Have I told you about my grandchildren? Most of you readers are aware that we have three grandchildren and Grandee (me!) is pretty fond of them. After I read about this child having a severe reaction, I shuddered to think about Hank, Ford or little Piper getting sick, or worse, from exposure to this plant. We have been teaching Piper about avoiding this plant and poison ivy as well.

Our son has started a campaign to spray this stuff on the farm. I recommend you look around to find it on your property. We have some good products that will kill it. There are several auxin chemicals that works. Our standby 2,4-D will work. The problem is it is in many locations. I've seen them in the ditches along our roads, in fence rows, in patches here and there in pastures. Animals can be affected if they ingest this plant. This poison hemlock is a prolific seed producer, so this project will take time and effort to help reduce them.

I know it sounds like a long and maybe costly process, but if I can help save someone's life, it's worth it all. Think about it.

Eastside teachers receive national donation

T-G STAFF REORT

Two teachers from Eastside Elementary received a combined donation of \$173.00 from DonorsChoose in partnership with SONIC® Drive-In's Limeades for Learning initiative.

Everything is more fun when done on a white board!" she writes. Tannehill met her goal of \$415 for this project. Like Tannehill, Cobb also works

with ESL students. "All of my students are at varying stages of language acquisition. My ESL students are engaged, inquisitive students who love to learn about new and interesting topics," she writes. Her project, "Scholastic News

for Students" for Grades PreK-2, are magazine materials that will not only help build her students' vocabulary, but they will also introduce them to new topics, Cobb explains. "My incredible students speak

two (or more) languages! It is important for ESL students to build academic vocabulary and practice reading skills," Cobb said. She met her fundraising goal of \$822.



Dominant Vols earn top seed in NCAA meet

OMAHA, Neb. — After finishing one of the most dominant runs in Southeastern Conference history, Tennessee was selected the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA baseball tournament Monday.

The Volunteers (53-7) won 31 of their first 32 games, swept the SEC regular-season and tournament titles and have the best pitching and batting statistics in the nation.

They've been the consensus No. 1 team in the polls all but one week since March 28 and enter regionals having won eight straight and 12 of 13.

"It's really cool to win the SEC Tournament," Vols slugger Drew Gilbert said, "but we have bigger goals in mind and know we still have a lot of baseball in front of us."

The 64-team tournament opens Friday in 16 regionals. Winners advance to eight best-of-three super regionals. Those winners move on to the College World Series in

The top eight national seeds are assured of hosting super regionals if they win their regionals.

The national seeds following Tennessee: Stanford (41-14), Oregon State (44-15), Virginia Tech (41-12), Texas A&M (37-18), Miami (39-18), Oklahoma State (39-20) and East Carolina (42-18).

Stanford, which won the Pac-12 regular-season and tournament titles, is a national seed for the first time since it was No. 2 in 2018. Oregon State gives the Pac-12 two of the top three seeds for the first time.

Virginia Tech, which was picked second to last in the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division, has its highest seed in program history and will be playing in a regional for the first time since 2013.

Texas A&M won its last seven SEC series under firstyear coach Jim Schlossnagle to lock up a national seed after not making the tournament last year.

East Carolina will play in the tournament for a 32nd time. The Pirates hold the distinction of having made the most appearances without reaching a CWS.

Seeds nine through 16: Texas (42-19), North Carolina (38-19), Southern Mississippi (43-16), Louisville (38-18-1), Florida (39-22), Auburn (37-19), Maryland (45-12) and Georgia Southern (40-18).

The ACC and SEC had the most teams selected, with nine apiece. The Big 12 and Pac-12 each got five teams in, and the Sun Belt Conference has four teams in the field.

Tennessee opens regional play against Alabama State (34-23). The other teams playing in Knoxville are Campbell (40-17) and Georgia Tech (34-22).

The Vols' surge to their best season in program history, so far, comes in coach Tony Vitello's fifth season. First baseman Luc Lipcius, a graduate student playing his sixth season, was on the 2017 team under Dave Serrano that went 7-21 in SEC play.

"When I came in here we weren't expected to do much we were kind of the laughingstock of the SEC," Lipcius said. "Coach V and the staff came in and did their thing. They recruit players and make them better. It's really awesome to see it come full circle."

The last four teams picked for regionals were Florida State, Grand Canyon, Liberty and Mississippi. The first four out were North Carolina State, Old Dominion, Rutgers and Wofford.

Selection committee chairman and Army athletic director Mike Buddie said Ole Miss got the nod over N.C. State because it performed a bit stronger in regular-season con-

N.C. State and Ole Miss each won four of 10 conference series, but only one of the Wolfpack's was against a team in the NCAA field (Georgia Tech) while the Rebels had series wins over LSU and Auburn.

"That was a brutal one," Buddie said. "When it comes down to the last three or four teams, you have to really split hairs. Baseball is a game played in series. We weren't looking at one-game scenarios unless that was the only data point."

Other notes about the tournament:

— Florida State has the longest consecutive streak with 44 straight appearances. Other notable consecutive streaks include Vanderbilt (16) and Florida (14).

— Coppin State (24-28) and Hofstra (30-21) are making their first appearances. Air Force (30-27) is making its first since 1969.

— The best regional storyline could be a day two meeting between Texas A&M and TCU in College Station. Schlossnagle left TCU for the Aggies' job after last season. TCU's coach is Kirk Saarloos, who was an assistant under Schlossnagle for 10 years.

— Michigan (32-26) was one of the big bid stealers, swiping the Big Ten's automatic berth by winning the conference tournament as the fifth seed and denying Rutgers

- Coppin State is among three teams with losing records. The others are Binghamton (22-28) and New Mexico State (24-32).

'It's all legal': Foreign college athletes go home, cash in

LONDON — Miami punter Lou Hedley had to fly 13,000 miles to western Australia to cash in on his

The tattooed Aussie and thousands of other international athletes at American colleges have been told they can't profit from their name, image and likeness on U.S. soil though interpretations vary about what constitutes work - so some are trekking home to do it.

In Hedley's case, it was a 37-hour journey that included a long stopover

"It's a pain in the backside having to fly over but it's all worth it," Hedley told The Associated Press after a day of filming promotional spots for LifeWallet in the city of Perth, where he was also visiting family before his final season with the Hurricanes this fall. "I feel like I deserve to get a little bit of money, I've contributed wealth to the team (with) my name, image and likeness ... so it was good to kind of get compensated for what I've been doing the last three years."

Hedley declined to specify an exact figure but confirmed his NIL deal is in line with his teammates at roughly \$50,000. Miami attorney John Ruiz has been actively enlisting Hurricanes on NIL deals through his LifeWallet healthcare company. The 28-year-old Hedley, one of

many Aussie punters in college football, said he didn't sign anything until he touched down Down Under. "The work is all done here, paid

for over here. As long as I'm doing all my work in Australia, I'm getting paid in Australia, paying taxes in Australia and all that stuff, it's all legal," he said.

Nebraska basketball player Jaz Shelley also made a trip home to Australia for NIL deals, and teammate Isabelle Bourne planned to follow suit. Mustapha Amzil, a 6-foot-9

forward at Dayton, announced on

social media that when he plays

for the national team of his native

Finland this summer he will be 'open to any business and sponsorship deals."

On the whole, though, international athletes are finding the NIL waters tricky to navigate, with mixed messages about what's OK, even now almost a year after the NCAA lifted restrictions.

Some schools have told them to avoid NIL deals altogether because they could jeopardize their visa status. Others say off U.S. soil is fine. Ultimately, the federal government is the arbiter of visa questions and deportations.

'There's a ton of ambiguity," said Casey Floyd, co-founder of NOCAP Sports, which is working with athletes to secure deals and advocating for regulatory clarity. "You go to some schools and they are very flexible ... and then you have a lot of schools that they just don't want to touch it because they're so scared of the ramifications."

West Virginia's international athletes, for example, "are not participating in NIL opportunities due to the current application of federal immigration regulations," spokesman Michael Fragale said. Drexel asked its foreign athletes to "please refrain from entering into a NIL agreement or engaging in compensated NIL activity," Mladenka Tomasevic, executive director of the International Students and Scholars Services, wrote in February.

It's a different story at Nebraska, where the women's basketball program tweeted: "International NIL made possible!" adding that when Shelley and Bourne arrive on Australian soil "they will be legally eligible to participate in NIL activity." Shelley then promoted her T-shirts and hoodies, as well as a Lincoln restaurant.

The University of Florida told its internationals planning NIL activity in their home countries to "properly document their physical location "by

providing form I-94 arrival/departure

records, "flight itinerary, and port of

entry stamp showing abroad."

"He's literally going to be retweeting content. There's no way that can be deemed as work," said Next Up founder Ryan Cook, who has also explored holding payments in escrow or becoming an administrator of Alajiki's social media account and publishing that way.

letes land scholarships.

'The last thing we want to do is break anyone's visa status," he said. "We're working with the Cal compliance team, as well, to make sure everything is OK. We've not received any pushback."

Just in case, though, the deal doesn't begin until September. By then, there may be specific guidance from the NCAA or relevant government agencies.

The NCAA's initial advice said international athletes are covered by the interim NIL policy but that students "may consider" consulting with their school's compliance official "for guidance related to maintaining their immigration status and tax implications." If they have questions, they should write to the U.S. Student and Exchange Visitor Program. That program — SEVP — "con-

tinues to assess" the issue, said Sarah Loicano, a spokeswoman for U.S. Immigration and Customs Kentucky forward Oscar Tshiebwe

of Congo is among those calling for Congress to help foreign student athletes. The AP player of the year, who is returning for his senior season, recently met with Senate Minority leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., to make his case. The financial benefit to Tshiebwe could exceed seven figures.

Wild 600 was immensely entertaining

CONCORD, N.C. — The Coca-Cola 600 was many things excruciatingly long, wildly unpredictable and perhaps above all else, immensely entertaining.

It was, as William Byron described after getting caught up in a 12-car crash, "chaos out

In race that took five hours, 13 minutes to complete and included 18 cautions and 17 cars finishing in the garage in various states of disrepair, the first Next Gen race at Charlotte Motor Speedway left many shaking their heads over the events of the night. Denny Hamlin ultimately won the longest race in NASCAR history (619.5 miles) by beating Joe Gibbs Racing teammate Kyle Busch to the finish line by 0.014 seconds in double

overtime. Things were so insane at one point that Fox Sports racing analyst and longtime Cup Series driver Clint Bowyer exclaimed, "This is the wildest and craziest 600 that

has ever happened!" And he was right.

Few cars escaped the race unscathed, with Kyle Larson, Kyle Busch and Bubba Wallace among

the many who simply got sideways while racing alone and spun out, often times ending up harmlessly in the infield turf and drawing a yellow flag. Others weren't as fortunate.

Chris Buescher was involved in

a scary wreck that saw his No. 17 Ford flip five times before landing on its hood. Safety crews had to carefully to flip his car over before Buescher could climb out of the vehicle. He walked away sore but relatively unscathed.

"Thank you to everybody working for not slamming it back," Buescher said. "It was nice to be able to get out. The blood is rushing to your head a little bit."

And that wasn't even the craziest wreck of the night.

Last weekend's All-Star Race winner, Ryan Blaney, got too low on the apron at the bottom of the track on lap 192 and spun to the right, heading up the track where he collected 11 other cars in the melee and ended the night for Brad Keselowski, Wallace, Kurt Busch and Chase Elliott, whose mangled cars were taken behind

The most costly wreck, at least for defending race champion Kyle Larson, came when Chase Briscoe crashed with two laps to go while trying to take the lead from him, setting up overtime and adding to the madness.

Larson, who appeared on the verge of becoming the first driver to repeat as champion of the Coca-Cola 600 since Jimmie Johnson in 2005, then got caught up in a wreck a few minutes later when Austin Dillon raced up from behind and went four wide for the lead. Larson nipped Dillon, causing another multicar collision and extending the race even further.

Hamlin somehow made it through the carnage without a nick and held off Joe Gibbs Racing teammate Kyle Busch on the second restart for the win.

"The (Next Gen) car has less side force and less general downforce," Hamlin said of all the wrecks. "In our old car you could kind of hang out. The right side was a billboard, it was flat, so it caught air. Any time you stick your hand out of the window, you could feel it. This one is all rounded. The moment it gets sideways, it just spins out. You don't have as much aerodynamics that keeps the car planted to the track."

That was a point of frustration for Byron, a Charlotte native.

"It's chaos out there," Byron said. "You can't drive the car the slightest bit sideways or you're wrecked. So, if somebody gets a little bit sideways, then we all wreck. It either takes out other people or they spin to the infield. Just chaos."

Cup veteran Kevin Harvick expected as much after seeing the uncertainty the Next Gen car has brought this season.

"I've been to this race a lot and I knew that the way the mile-and-ahalf races had gone this particular year that it was gonna be a war," Harvick said. "There weren't as many tire issues as I thought there were going to be, but it wound up just being spinouts because the cars would just become an incredibly big handful as you'd get toward the end of the run."

Harvick shook his head, adding "it was definitely interesting, to

More interesting than the often mundane 600-mile races here at Charlotte Motor Speedway in the past. In 2016, for instance, Martin Truex Jr. led 392 of 400 laps, repeatedly riding away from the pack in clean air. It was an impressive feat but didn't push the entertainment meter.

Sunday's race, meanwhile, featured 31 lead changes involving 13 different drivers.

"To me, that was the most fun Charlotte race I've ever ran," Briscoe said. "The racetrack was awesome. You could run the fence. You could run the middle. You could run the bottom. You could

throw sliders." He offered high praise for the

Next Gen car, too. "In the past it seemed like we kind of got single-filed out," Briscoe said. "It was a lot of fun. I'd do another 600 miles for sure."

Hamlin acknowledged there is still a lot that teams needs to learn about the Next Gen car but said that will come in time.

"Every time we change cars it takes like a significant amount of time to get it right," Hamlin said. "This was a major overhaul of a car. Other than it had a steering wheel and four tires, there wasn't much that was similar to the previous generation car. That car had been honed in for a long time. This one still has some work to do. We got to do some testing to try to fix it in some areas. But in the meantime, we're still having some pretty good racing."


