County has competitive week

Low turnout in general election

Results at a glance

The total number of registered voters in Bedford County is 28,087. But only 4,332 voters turned out for the last general election, according to the post election summary report.

There were 1,997 votes cast total on Election Day Thursday. Election results also included 74 paper absentee ballots, and 2,261

walk-in/early votes. Overall, this comes to a 15.42 percent voter turnout rate for Bedford County. Despite the low voter turnout,

several districts in the County saw tight races in this year's election District 5 saw six candidates

running. Scott Johnson (R) came in with 477 votes and will be replacing incumbent Jeff Sweeney. Incumbent Linda Yockey (I) saw 461 out of the 1,750 total votes and will continue to occupy the commission seat.

District 1 also saw the replacement incumbent commissioner Don Gallagher (I), who lost by 3 votes to dark horse candidate Eric Maddox (R). New to the commission for this district will also be Eric Maddox (R).

Independent candidate for county mayor Misty Pellar also received a fair amount of votes as a dark horse candidate running against Republican incumbent Chad Graham. From the East Side voting precinct she saw 42.77 percent of the votes and 38.15 percent of the votes from the South Side precinct.

Overall, there were 4,045 total votes for this race. Graham received 2,761 (or 68.26% of the votes). Pellar received 1,250 (or 30.9% of the votes) across the County.

The District 7 race for a seat on Bedford County School Board was the most competitive with 3 write-in candidates vying for the seat. Ultimately, Barton Williams beat out Sandra Avent and Michael Henry. Though this district had the most candidates, it had a total of only 32 votes.

Uncontested school board candidates included Brian Crews (I) of District 2, who received

Judge shows no leniency to Rich

59-year prison sentence

"Mr. Rich has exhibited little or no regard for human life." That's what Senior Trial Judge Thomas J. Wright said to 25-year-old Samuel "Sam" Earl Rich of Shelbyville at a sentencing hearing on Thursday.

"I think you deserve the most (prison) time I can give you. You shot Ms. Perryman and left her for dead. You shot people and just went on about your business. Such despicable acts cannot be tolerated in a civil society," Judge Wright told Rich.

The judge then expressed to the victim, her family and to the family of Will Warner how "deeply sorry" he was for their loss. Rich is currently charged with the murder of Will Warner in Davidson County, with a trial date set for April 23.

Rich faces in Davidson County court two counts of felony murder, 1st degree murder, especially aggravated robbery, felon in possession of a firearm and theft of property (items valued at between \$10,000 and \$60,000.)

Attempted first degree murder

Rich was convicted at a jury trial in late June of seven crimes in connection with shooting Hannah Gracie Perryman in the face during the early morning hours of Aug. 13, 2021. According to prosecutors, Rich stood over Perryman for a few minutes after the shooting to 'see if she was dead."

Judge Wright sentenced Rich to the maximum sentence for shooting Perryman and his other crimes committed that night in Bedford County.

Rich was sentenced to a total of 59 years: 25 for Attempted 1st degree murder, 10 years for employing a firearm during the commission of a dangerous felony, 6 years for theft of property, 6 years for felon in possession of a weapon, 6 years for the aggravated burglary, 12 years for especially aggravated burglary and 6 years for tampering with evidence. (The judgment for especially aggravated burglary was merged into the attempted 1st degree murder charge thus reducing the 71 years total to 59.)

Although the sentences would appear to result in the imprisonment of Rich until age 84, it's unlikely he will remain in prison that long. Under Tennessee law, Rich will be eligible for early release (parole) after 41½ years, at age 66. His sentence may also be reduced further with jail credits (for good behavior while incarcerated, commonly call 'good

Typically, "inmates serve the minimum sentence to make room for dangerous individuals," said Senior Trial Judge Thomas J. Wright as he concluded issuing the sentence to Rich.

Rich tries murder for hire

In the sentencing hearing Thursday, TBI Special Agent Robert "Bobby" Simmons testified that following the shooting of Perryman, Rich made numerous phone calls from jail trying to hire someone to kill Perryman. Rich allegedly said several times that with "Perryman out of the way," police would have no case.

Simmons stated how Rich was hoping he could "hire someone to kill her with a drug overdose to make it look accidental."


In an audio recording played in court, Rich tells a man he was trying to hire he is "...going to do his best to work something out" to pay him. "I'm a good guy," Rich said. Early in the call, Rich identifies himself as "This is the other gangster."

Rich tries to assure the man that he will pay, telling him he has a construction business and giving the man family information as references. Court statements show that Rich gave the man his sister's, mom's and grandmother's addresses and phone numbers. Rich reportedly mentioned to the man that his father was in the judicial system. (Bedford County General Sessions Judge Charles Rich is Sam Rich's father.) The man Rich called told him he needed "10 up front," but when Sam Rich balked, the man said to Rich, "If you can't do 10, can you do it 5?"

One of the last statements on the recording was Rich stating, "I'm a good guy."





BRUNSWICK, Ga. (AP) — The white father and son convicted of murder in Ahmaud Arbery's fatal shooting after they chased the 25-year-old Black man through a Georgia neighborhood were sentenced Monday to life in prison for committing a federal hate crime. District Court U.S.

Godbey Judge Lisa Wood sentenced Travis McMichael, 36, and his father Greg McMichael, 66, in Brunswick. Both were previously sentenced to life without parole in a state court for Arbery's murder. "A young man is dead. Ahmaud Arbery will be

forever 25. And what happened a jury found happened because he's Black," Wood said. In February, a federal convicted

McMichaels and neighbor William "Roddie" Bryan of violating Arbery's civil rights, concluding they targeted him because of his race. All three were also found guilty of attempted kidnapping, and the McMichaels were

convicted of using guns

in the commission of a

violent crime.

The McMichaels armed themselves with guns and used a pickup truck to chase Arbery after he ran past their home on Feb. 23, 2020. Bryan joined the pursuit in his own truck and recorded cellphone video of Travis McMichael shooting Arbery with a shotgun. The McMichaels told police they suspected Arbery was a burglar, but investigators determined he was unarmed and had committed no crimes. Before the sentencings, Wood heard

from members of Arbery's family. His mother, Wanda Cooper-Jones, said that every day she feels every shot fired at her son. "It's so unfair, so unfair, so unfair that he was killed while he was not even

committing a crime," she McMichael Greg addressed the Arbery family, saying their loss

Dear Heloise: I just read the letter about doing your duty by serving on a jury. In my state, there is no law that says a person must be paid his/her salary while on a jury. And of course, there are people who do not work for a company, maybe being self-employed. That small amount of money that is paid to each jury member by the court system cannot come close to paying rent, a car note, etc.

While it sounds wonderful to do your civic duty, people have to pay bills. My employer pays for five days, and anything over that falls on the employee. HEALING FINGER CUTS

Dear Heloise: I'm always getting small cuts on my fingers, and the old procedure was to put an antiseptic on the cut and protect it with an adhesive bandage.

After a couple of hand wettings and washings, the bandage would come loose, exposing the cut. I then tried cutting a small piece of gauze and putting it on water-resistant adhesive tape; this didn't last very long, as water would get into the gauze, loosening the tape.

The next try

using a liquid antiseptic -- such as iodine or mercurochrome -- sealing it with liquid "new skin" and covering it with waterproof adhesive tape. Now, the tape would last a couple days, keeping the cut out of the water. Taking off the tape revealed that the cut had healed in a fraction of the time that the other procedures had taken. -- Bob

Surprise Lillies

FARMERS MARKET

It's just now getting up to speed. We have a dozen or more vendors each week and they are bring some good produce and prod-

The market is each Thursday afternoon at 2:30 at the pavilion next to the big blue water tower at the Celebration Grounds, across from Calsonic Arena. See you there.

WHAT IS THIS?

I never saw these flowers in East Tennessee. They may be there but my grandmother didn't have them. I think they are really neat since they surprise us with an overnight appearance, seemingly from nowhere.

They are actually called surprise lilies. Most of what I've seen are a soft pink and white color on a long stem. They have to experience cold weather, and then they put out leaves that I don't pay any attention to or notice. But the leaves come out unnoticed and then go dormant, and the lilies then shoot up from the bulb.

There are some other colors available, but I've never seen them. The ones at our house were planted by someone a long time ago, but we have no idea who it was. I've attached a picture of ours. But these blooms are in a lot of places around the area. Pay attention to these treats.

AND THIS?

I mentioned earlier that we saw a moth that was orange and white. I had never seen this one before, and I thought it might be called a Vol Moth, or

something like it. Its name is a Regal moth. It looks really pretty and elegant. But I was

shocked that its larval form is one I've seen over time and it's definitely not regal in appearance, not is its name regal. The larval or caterpillar stage is called a Hickory Horned Devil, and it looks like it. I've seen these before, but not often. Here's more about them from the North Carolina State Extension publication by Steven Frank et al. The photo is by Lyle J. Buss, Univ. of Florida.

The hickory horned devil, Citheronia regalis, is the largest caterpillar of the United States. Although it has a ferocious appearance, the hickory horned devil is harmless. This worm starts as a tiny caterpillar after hatching from one of hundreds of eggs laid by a regal moth. Over a matter of weeks, it grows and molts until it reaches its amazing mature size (almost 6 inches!).

The fully-grown hickory horned devil has a brown head, dark green body, black prolegs and numerous spines. Each body segment has four or more short, black spines around in a row around it. The two body segments toward the front have four long projections each that are brown at the base, black at the tip and curve back These are the "horns" that give the caterpillar its ferocious appearance and name. The "horns" are sometimes 3/4 inch long. Mature hickory horned devils crawl to the soil and dig in to form a subterranean cell in which they molt into a pupal stage. The shiny, dark-brown pupa is about two inches long (or even longer) and is somewhat cylindrical.

The fall, winter and spring is spent as a pupa in the soil. Next summer, the insect molts into the regal moth. Regal moths are large and have stout bodies. Females (wingspan up to 6 inches) are larger

than males. The head and body are orange-red and yellow spots and markings. The wing veins are also red-orange. The dark areas between the veins are dull gray. The forewings of males are pointed toward the tips and narrower than the back wings.

Hickory horned devils are sometimes found on walnut, hickories, pecan, sweetgum, persimmon, and even sumac. The small caterpillars eat very small amounts of foliage, but the later stages consume considerable amounts of leaves. One reason that hickory horned devils are such a surprise is that they

are actually kind of rare. In spite of their large and forbidding appearance, birds are apparently fond of them for food. Not only that, but parasites and diseases also kill a portion of the population.

Consequently, very few of the hundreds of eggs laid by regal moths successfully develop and produce offspring of their own. Because hickory horned devils are harmless to humans and are relatively rare, no control measures are needed.

I've attached pictures of both the adult moth that we saw and the caterpillar stage. Interesting.



Titans patient as Willis learns

NASHVILLE — Malik Willis is experiencing some growing pains as the Tennessee Titans rookie works through his first training camp.

Willis threw a deep pass to Josh Malone for a nice connection Friday and came back by finding Mason Kinsey across the middle in coverage. Needing a touchdown to wrap up practice, Willis completed two of his first three passes before running and sliding down around the 10.

Then the rookie overthrew Reggie Roberson Jr. at the back of the end zone before being sacked on a corner blitz by Michael Griffin II as time expired.

That's OK. The Titans can be patient with Willis because Ryan Tannehill is their starter.

"It really is one day at a time. It really is," Titans quarterbacks coach Pat O'Hara said. "And that's OK. And he's been great."

The Titans took the 6-foot-1, 219-pound Willis with the 86th pick overall out of Liberty, trading up to make him the highest-drafted quarterback by the franchise since taking Marcus Mariota at No. 2 overall in 2016. Willis threw for 2,857 yards and 27 touchdowns last season with 12 interceptions and ran for 13 TDs. For his career, he had 48 TD passes and 29 rushing.

Mariota had to start immediately.

Not only does Tennessee have Tannehill going into his 11th season, Logan Woodside has been his backup the past couple seasons. The challenge is whether Willis can progress fast enough to challenge Logan Woodside for the job backing up Tannehill. On Thursday, Willis ran the two-minute offense right after Tannehill.

Willis says he felt light years away from where he was at Tennessee's rookie minicamp in mid-May to just the start of training camp a couple weeks ago. He's processing faster what he needs to be doing on each play and feels much more comfortable running the huddle and at the line of scrimmage.

My coach is making it real easy to just focus on what I need to focus on and let me go out there and play and have fun," Willis said.

He's also learning that fine line that a wide receiver that might appear covered well in college can make the catch in the NFL. Willis has the strong arm, but timing is everything.

"I feel like it's more when you have to throw that ball. and arm strength is not always going to save you because that waiting half a second later, it might be a PBU instead of a completion," Willis said. O'Hara got to spend a lot

of time with Willis before the April draft. He believed Willis would be able to grasp information quickly and retain all he learned. But he has been impressed

at just how "super smart" the quarterback is in dealing with the pressure of going from the college game to the NFL, where even the hash marks are different. "His decision-making,

which we monitor, has been very good for a rookie," O'Hara said. "And things that he hasn't

had to do before relative to working from the pocket, his feet need to catch up with his mind. And it's getting better. It takes time. Malik has a very strong arm and a really cool skill set. But you can't always rely on that all the time."

Rose dismisses misconduct allegations

PHILADELPHIA — Pete Rose dismissed questions Sunday about his first appearance on the field in Philadelphia since the franchise scrapped 2017 plans to honor him because of a woman's claim she had a sexual relationship with baseball's hit king when she was a

"It was 55 years ago, babe," Rose told a female baseball writer for The Philadelphia Inquirer.

Rose, though, had no trouble reminiscing about the 1980 World Series champion Phillies team — it was 42 years ago, Pete — that was honored before Sunday's After initially getting booed lightly, the 81-year-

old Rose received a standing ovation from Phillies fans — many not even born or too young to remember baseball's hit king in his prime — when he walked onto the Citizens Bank Park field for the first time since he received a lifetime ban from Major League Baseball in August 1989.

"They made me feel real good today," Rose said of the cheers. "I don't want to say I expected it. I guess I did expect it from Philly fans. That's the way they are. They love their sports heroes."

Rose's already stained reputation suffered another blow in 2017 when the Phillies called off a planned induction into the team's Wall of Fame because of the sexual misconduct accusations levied against him. Rose brusquely responded to the reporter's question before the game — and later apologized to her following Sunday's ceremony after initially saying, "will you forgive me if I sign 1,000 baseballs for you?" — and was just as combative on the topic after the pregame

"I'm going to tell you one more time: I'm here for the Philly fans, I'm here for my teammates, OK," Rose said. "I'm here for the Philly organization and who cares what happened 50 years ago."

The woman, identified as Jane Doe in 2017, said

Rose called her in 1973, when she was 14 or 15, and they began a sexual relationship in Cincinnati that lasted several years. She also alleged Rose met her in locations outside Ohio for sex. Rose's lawyer had said the woman's claims were

Rose acknowledged in 2017 that he did have a rela-

tionship with the woman, but he said it started when she was 16. He also said they never had sex outside Ohio.

At the time, Rose was in his mid-30s and was married with two kids.

Rose was among many former great Phillies including Hall of Famer Steve Carlton, and fellow World Series champions Bob Boone, Greg Luzinski and Larry Bowa — honored for the 1980 team. Mike Schmidt sent a videotaped message and missed the alumni day festivities because he tested positive for COVID-19.

We've been doing it for a while, coming back every year, and to mix Pete in, I thought, was very special," Boone said. "When I go to (Cooperstown), I always thought he should be there. You can write anything there, but he was the greatest hitter in the league. Put his name up and put he did this, got punished for whatever."

Last month, the Phillies defended the decision to invite Rose to participate in the ceremony.

"In planning the 1980 reunion, we consulted with Pete's teammates about his inclusion," the Phillies said in a statement. "Everyone wants Pete to be part of the festivities since there would be no trophy in 1980 without him. In addition, the club received permission from the Commissioner's Office to invite Pete as a member

of the championship team." The original 1980 anniversary celebration was postponed for two seasons because of the pandemic.

A 17-time All-Star, Rose got 826 of his 4,256 hits during his five years playing for the Phillies from 1979-83. There are no immediate plans for Rose to get inducted in Philadelphia's Wall of Fame.

"Anybody would like to be on the Wall of Fame," Rose said. "I don't know who made that decision, but God bless them. They made it for a reason. I'm still here today for the biggest event in a long time here in Philadelphia. I'm sitting right here to talking to you guys. Everything evens out."

Dixon wins Nashville race

NASHVILLE (AP) - Scott Dixon arrived in

Nashville not really a championship favorite, but still mathematically eligible to win a record-tying seventh IndyCar title. And even though he was stuck in the middle of a

tight pack of drivers jostling for the championship, The Iceman never counted himself out of the fight.

Dixon passed Mario Andretti for second on IndyCar's

all-time wins list with a victory Sunday in the messy Music City Grand Prix — a win that moved that seventh title within his reach. The win pushed Dixon up two spots in the standings and only six points behind leader Will Power with three races remaining.

"You're in it until you're not," said Dixon, noting he trailed Juan Pablo Montoya by 48 points with three races remaining in his 2015 championship season. "That's the point — you're never out of it until you

are, so we'll keep digging." Dixon overcame a poor qualifying effort, damage

to his Chip Ganassi Racing car, a crash-fest around the

downtown streets of Nashville and finally a drag race against Scott McLaughlin in a two-lap push to the finish between fellow New Zealanders. He won for the 53rd time of his career to break a

tie with Andretti for second in the all-time column and now has his sights on A.J. Foyt's record of seven IndyCar titles. Foyt is also IndyCar's all-time winner

with 67 victories.

Kevin Harvick ends 65-race drought, wins at Mchigan

BROOKLYN, Mich. - Kevin Harvick got his groove back, fittingly at one of his favorite tracks. Harvick ended a 65- race winless

drought that lasted nearly two years with his sixth victory at Michigan International Speedway on Sunday. "Good timing, for sure," he said.

Harvick's win shakes up the play-

off race with just three races remaining in the regular season, leaving little time for drivers to earn a spot in the 16-car postseason, and gives a boost for a veteran that entered the weekend No. 17 in points.

"Everybody that doubted us doesn't know us," he said.

NASCAR has had 15 different Cup winners this season. If there are two new winners over the last three races, a driver with one win will be eliminated from the 16-car playoff with a tiebreaker based on points. Ryan Blaney and Martin Truex Jr. are top-10 drivers in points, but they have not finished first to put their postseason positioning in peril.

Harvick's No. 4 Ford pulled away from Bubba Wallace and the rest the field following a restart with 35 laps to go at the FireKeepers Casino 400. The Stewart-Haas Racing driver took advantage of clean air, helping him coast to his 59th victory, including five wins since 2018 on the two-mile oval in the Irish Hills region of southern Michigan.

Harvick had not won since claiming a NASCAR Cup Series postseason race on Sept. 19, 2020, at Bristol Motor Speedway.

"It's been a while," he acknowledged. "Michigan has been a great place for us."

Wallace finished second in his No. 23 Toyota — 2.9 seconds behind Harvick — followed by Denny Hamlin in his No. 11 Toyota. "Second's not good enough for the

playoffs," said Wallace, who needs to win one of the final three regularseason races to earn a spot in the postseason. Austin Cindric, who won the

Daytona 500 for his first career victory, started the day No. 15 in points and finished last in the 37-car race after his No. 2 Ford hit the wall headon in a nine-car crash that knocked Kyle Busch out of the competition. "It was a complete mess," he said.

Bubba bumped

Wallace won his first career pole Saturday, becoming the only driver to break 190 mph in the Next Gen car during qualifying this season and went even faster early in the race after a 90-minute rain delay. Wallace, driving for 23XI Racing

formed by Charlotte Hornets owner Michael Jordan and Denny Hamlin in 2020, stayed out front until he made a pit stop after 21 laps — two shy of his career high — and the decision that cost him track position due to a crash soon thereafter that included one-fourth of the field.

Wallace blamed himself for letting Harvick pull away after the last

Busch's bad day

Busch had another frustrating day, getting knocked out of the race on lap 25 due to the multi-car crash following a restart that also ended Cindric's

"I can't buy a break right now," said Busch, who was the favorite to win the race, per FanDuel Sportsbook.

Busch has failed to finish in the top 10 in eight straight races, the longest streak of the two-time champion's career, and he does not have a contract for next year. Three days before racing at Michigan, he and his wife and their two young children escaped the Mall of America in Minnesota after shots were fired.







James Christopher Leming Century Farm

ometime prior to 1901, James Christopher (J.C.) Leming acquired a piece of land near Normandy in middle Tennessee. There is a record of several transactions where he bought and sold land around Normandy. Our farm is near the Duck River and is about 50 acres in size. It was larger at the time of J.C.'s death and when my grandmother, Lucretia inherited it. She sold a track of the land which is now owned by Bill and Jane Cortner.

J.C. did not know that 100 years later this land would still be owned by his great granddaughter, Patsy Raye Spencer Richardson. The land was originally owned by James Christopher Leming, then passed to his daughter Lucretia Fielder Leming Spencer, her son William Minus Spencer, and great granddaughter Patsy Raye Spencer

J.C.'s handwritten will shows he left land to each of his children. The will indicates that J.C. called this farm the River Farm. I still have a copy of his will.

Our family has a long history in Normandy. William Spencer attended Normandy School through high school and played on the school basketball team about 1919. I attended Normandy School through the 5th grade.

The Normandy Methodist church was an important part of the family. Lucretia Spencer, William Spencer, and Patsy Spencer were all members.

My father, William Spencer can be traced on his mother's side back for many generations. J.C., a farmer and railroad foreman penned a family tree stating he was born Dec. 6,1839 and his wife, Mary Frances Sherrill was born Aug. 23, 1838. They were married June 22, 1861. Their children were: Sarah E. Leming (b. Feb. 16, 1863), Mary Ann Leming (b. Feb 4, 1866), William H. Leming (b. July 7, 1868), Nathan E. Leming (b. Aug. 4, 1871), Lucretia F. Leming (b. Sept. 19, 1873), and James K. Polk Leming (b. March 30, 1877.) J.C. died June 21,1901 and his wife, Mary died May 24, 1904.

The J.C. Leming home was located outside of Normandy on the Tullahoma-Normandy Road. It was later the home of J.C's son, James K. Polk Leming. When this home burned, the large family tree was lost. James K. Polk gave Patsy Spencer Richardson a smaller family tree. This original document still exists. J.C. and Mary are buried in the Green Cemetery near Carr Creek Road in Normandy along with some of their children. Lucretia Spencer was buried at Bethany Cemetery in Coffee County and William Spencer was buried at Hillcrest Cemetery in Shelbyville, TN.

We have many memories on the farm, My Uncle and Aunt, Hoyte and Pansye Spencer, and I, all had October birthdays. We celebrated with a family visit in Normandy. We always went out to the farm and enjoyed fall outings and collected walnuts and hickory nuts, which we later used in Christmas cakes and candies.

The farm was mostly used for cattle grazing until 2013. In 2013, Chris Carney with the Tennessee Division of Forestry helped to transition the farm to a hardwood plantation. In 2014, the farm was planted with 5,500 yellow popular, seedlings and 500 seedlings each of White Oak, Black Oak, Shumack Oak, and Chinkapin Oak. The management objective of this area is to sustainably produce timber/wood products, and to increase wildlife.

This farm was awarded a certificate from the State of Tennessee on May 9, 2001, as
