

Callaway earns another WGC

Justified Honors won the 2022 Tennessee Walking Horse World Grand Championship for a second year in a row during the Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration in Shelbyville on Saturday night.

Despite some rain delays, due to area storms, Justified Honors was able to finish the last class and make the official spotlight walk with John Allan Callaway up.

This is trainer and rider Callaway's third World Grand Championship win after Justified Honors in 2021 and Master's Razzle and Jazz in 2020. Callaway is the eighth trainer to win back-to-back world

titles and the third to do it on two different horses in the Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration's history. Callaway is from Allan Callaway Stables at Twin Oaks Farm off Highway 41A North in Shelbyville.

Justified Honors was born in April of 2017 and sired by Honors, the 2016 World Grand Champion, and Maypine's Doll Baby. He was bred, foaled and raised by Brian Anderton of Alabama then eventually moved to Layne Leverette's stables in Shelbyville, where his training was continued under owner Jeff Faulkner.

Callaway then discovered the young horse at Leverette's stables. Since May, 2020, the 5-year-old stallion has been owned by Lisa Baum of Shelbyville.

But the wins don't come easy. Callaway told the Times-Gazette last week that he showed against some "really

Northside drainage concerns City Council

The need for work on northern Shelbyville's water infrastructure was the most-discussed topic at Shelbyville City Council's study session Tuesday night.

Jason Reese, general manager of Shelbyville Power, Water and Sewerage Systems, said he feels \$2.9 million in state sewer rehabilitation funds, available through the American Rescue Plan,

is needed to upgrade sewer and water lines in the North Hurricane Watershed, near Hurricane Creek.

Much of that area's water flows toward northern Shelbyville. That area suffers drainage problems during heavy rains.

"With all this expansion going on in the industrial park, we have a real need to upgrade and rehab our existing lines in what we call Little Hurricane Creek Sewershed," Reese said. "Large masses of land on the northern end of town ...basically, we have a pumping station at Shaw Road, which is right along Little Hurricane Creek, that's the far west side of this sewershed."

All sewage from existing industrial developments in northern Shelbyville flows into that pumping station, Reese said. So will sewage from new developments in the new 231 Industrial Park area.

"It also catches a lot of gravity sewer along the McDale Lane area and as far east as Brown Lane, the new developments (or Fairfield Pike) to around Legends Restaurant," Reese said.

"Problems include inflow and infiltration (of lines), old clay lines cracked sewer lines, tree roots anything where we take on a lo of storm water and ground water "Over 50 percent of our lines are over 50 years old, so we would

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Spend a day behind the walls of Graceland as Elvis hosts friends for an unforgettable experience that ends speeding through the streets of Memphis; Hear the encouragement offered by the Man in Black, Johnny Cash, and experience the heartbreak surrounding the death of his beloved wife, June; Sit at the control board and experience the recording process of a great song and watch as it becomes a worldwide hit; and hear the neverbefore-told details of the last time Richard and Elvis were together. All of these great stories plus so much more are part of the 'From Elvis To Elvira' paperback book that Country Music Hall of Fame member, as part of The Oak Ridge Boys, Richard Sterban released.

"I have been blessed! I have lived a life that very few get to experience. A boy from New Jersey singing with Elvis, singing on the stage of the Grand Ole Opry, singing around the world, and still enjoying every moment I walk on the stage," says Richard Sterban. "I have been thinking about updating the Elvis to Elvira book with Steven Robinson and now with all this newly generated excitement about Elvis and his new movie, I think it's time to start that process. Excerpt from Elvis to Elvira: The First Time I Met Elvis

The only member I hadn't yet met was Elvis himself. As I've said, I was certainly familiar with his musicand liked much of it-but I wasn't what would be considered a huge fan. When I met him, though, I immediately understood the attraction that fans had to him. I thought, "Wow, there's a reason this guy is the biggest star in the world." It sounds like a fantasy or a cliché, but I swear you could almost sense him before he walked into a room.

On this occasion, he was "fashionably late." Everyone was ready, even anxious to begin but, as we would learn, rehearsals—like recording sessions and sometimes concerts-would begin only when Elvis was ready for them to begin. Eventually, we heard footsteps coming down the hall and then, suddenly, the door to the ballroom opened and in walked "the guys." It seemed as if there were six or more guys who came in and then parted, like the Red Sea, to reveal Elvis strolling in behind them, looking every bit like the King of Rock. He was dressed exactly like one might expect to see him: a dark two-piece suit with his signature high, Napoleonic collar, a patterned high-collared shirt, and carrying a black cane with a gold ornament on

top. He immediately came over to J.D.

and grabbed him in a bear hug.

While it's been told many times, J.D. had been somewhat of a hero to Elvis when he was growing up. As the bass singer for The Blackwood Brothers, he had allowed Elvis to come in the back door of various Memphis all-night gospel sings—long before Elvis could afford to buy a ticket, let alone became famous himself. Also, when Elvis's mother died, J.D. and the rest of the Blackwoods sang at her funeral. Elvis never forgot J.D.'s kindness, and as he did with so many others, he seemed to make it part of his life's work to repay such kindnesses many times over.

Standing in that hotel ballroom, Elvis and J.D. quickly caught up, and soon J.D. began introducing each one of us to him. Elvis interrupted him to say he didn't need the introductions because he felt as if he already knew us. He hugged me and then we shook hands. I still remember looking into his eyes that first time. The magnetism was indescribable. I couldn't believe that he knew my name and knew that I was the bass singer. I don't know how we gathered ourselves well enough to sing at that rehearsal, but apparently, we did. I just kept thinking over and over that there was Elvis Presley, and here we were singing with him. It was a feeling that would continue every

California sizzles; blackouts possible

ANGELES California is facing its highest chance of blackouts this year as a brutal heat wave continues to blanket the state with triple-digit temperatures. State energy officials said the electrical load Tuesday afternoon could top 51,000 megawatts, the highest demand the state has ever seen. As people crank up their air

conditioners, the state forecasted record levels of energy use, said Elliot Mainzer, president of California Independent System Operators, which runs the state's electrical grid. The state has additional energy capacity at the moment "but blackouts, rolling, rotating outages are a possibility," Mainzer said, calling additional conservation "absolutely essential." The CAISO site Tuesday morning

showed California could fall more than 5,000 megawatts short of its power supply at peak demand, forecasted for 5:30 pm.

The danger of wildfires was extreme as scorching heat and low humidity turned brush to tinder. Four deaths were reported over the Labor Day weekend as some 4,400 firefighters battled 14 large fires around the state, with 45 new blazes on Sunday alone, said Anale Burlew, a deputy chief with the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. In Southern California, two people

were killed and one injured by the Fairview Fire, which started Monday near the city of Hemet, the Riverside County Fire Department said. Roughly 50 miles southeast of Los Angeles, the fire had quickly spread to at least residential structures burned.

2,400 acres, prompting evacuations, and was only 5% contained. Multiple The dead people were not immediately identified. Authorities

said both were found in the same area

but it was not known if they were from the same household. They were apparently trying to flee when they were overcome.

California's energy grid runs on a mix of mostly solar and natural gas during the day, along with some imports of power from other states. But solar power begins to fall off during the late afternoon and into the evening, which is the hottest time of day in some parts of the state. And some of the aging natural gas plants California relies on for backup power aren't as reliable in hot weather.

At CAISO's request on Monday, four temporary emergency power generators deployed by the Department of Water Resources in Roseville and Yuba City were activated for the first time since they were installed last year, providing up to 120 megawatts, enough electricity for 120,000 homes.

AG NOTES

FARMERS MARKET

The market continues, but we have had some vendors to run out of produce due to the continued weather damage to production. We'll continue to monitor available products and we'll let you know about the market.

Remember, it's on Thursday afternoons at 2:30 p.m. at the big blue water tower at the Celebration Grounds.

GRAZING PLANS

I've had more interest in alternative grazing due to the shortage of hay this summer. While some folks are recovering with a better late summer/fall hay harvest, there are still some concerns out there. We do have some options that are old-time for some and new for others.

Small grain crops are widely used in Tennessee for pasture, silage and hay. These crops produce highquality forage during the fall, winter, and spring. Including ryegrass will result in growth longer into the spring, while adding crimson or arrowleaf clover will decrease the amount of nitrogen that needs to be applied.

All these crops are cool season annual plants, meaning they germinate in the fall, grow during the fall, winter and spring and then die in the late spring or early summer. Even though these crops live for only one year, they have potential for use in several ways.

We've got a really good publication that discusses all of these options. It's titled Small Grains, Ryegrass and Clovers for Forage, and it includes a lot of information. The planting dates that are recommended are right here on us. I'll be happy to send you the link. Just email me and I'll reply it. Or give me a call and I'll get it for you. Take a look if you think this will fit into your operation.

BEEF MEETING

The Middle Tennessee Beef Producer Association will meet on Thursday, September 8, at 6:30 p.m. at the Bedford County Ag Center. The sponsor is Trans Ova, one of the businesses that specialize in bovine reproduction. There will be a meal, so we ask that you call in to the office here at 684-5971 to let us know you are coming. This should be a good program.

SOIL TESTING

Now is an excellent time to soil test and add the needed lime to pastures, gardens, lawns, or any soil. With the increased cost of fertilizer, lime becomes a great investment. Lime increases the efficiency of N, P and K.

For example, the efficiency of applied phosphate may be more than doubled when soil pH is increased from 5.0 to 6.1 because of less fixation or tie-up in the soil. Lime enhances microorganism activity.

Acid soils slow the growth and multiplication of certain microorganisms, which in turn reduces soil processes such as the release of nutrients from organic matter decomposition (mineralization) and nitrogen fixation in legumes. Low pH levels also impede root development that effects uptake of plant nutrients.

Lime is one of the less expensive soil treatments available. And with the costs of actual plant nutrients, we need to do everything we can to improve nutrient efficiency. We also cannot afford to just guess with fertilizer prices being what they are.

The UT soil center recommendations are made on a least-cost basis, and results are based on literally years of test data and correlated performance

Now is a good time to get this done, instead of waiting 'til the last minute.

WISDOM

The August issue of the Progressive Farmer's Cornerstone section had quotes on rainfall. This has been a big topic with the cold wet spring, the hot dry summer, and the big washout at the Celebration this past Saturday night. (I was there and got soaked, but I enjoyed every minute...just about.)

Here are some good thoughts on rain. Dolly Parton said "The way I see it, if you want the rainbow, you gotta put up with the rain." Roger Miller said "Some people walk in the rain, others just get wet." Fran Lebowitz said "Do not, on a rainy day, ask your child what he feels like doing, because I assure you that what he feels like doing, you won't feel like watching."

Maya Angelou said "Every storm runs out of rain." Mark Twain said "It is best to read the weather forecast before praying for rain." John Steinbeck said "One can find so many pains when the rain is falling." Benjamin Franklin said "The person who deserves most pity is a lonesome one on a rainy day who doesn't know how to

Clint Eastwood said "If you think it's going to rain, it will." And Aesop said "After the rain cometh the fair weather." These last two make me think of a saying that I've heard about Tennessee weather over and over. "If you don't like the weather, just stay still. It's going to change."



Searchers find missing child in Wartrace

child in Wartrace ended well when he was found safely Monday night. The 8-year-boy, Coleman

Canada police hunt remaining suspect in stabbing attacks

police hunted for the remaining suspect in the stabbing deaths of 10 people in an Indigenous community and nearby town in the province of Saskatchewan after finding the body of his brother amid a massive manhunt for the pair.

Damien Sanderson, 31, was found dead Monday near the stabbing sites and authorities believe his brother and fellow suspect, Myles Sanderson, 30, is injured, on the run and likely in the provincial capital of Regina, said police chief Evan Bray. The series of stabbings also wounded 18 people.

RCMP Commanding Officer Assistant Commissioner Rhonda Blackmore said authorities are not sure of the cause of death yet but the injuries were not selfinflicted.

Damien Sanderson's "body was located outdoors in a heavily grassed area in proximity to a house that was being examined. We can confirm he has visible injuries," said Blackmore. Asked if Myles Sanderson was responsible for his brother's death, Blackmore said police are investigating that possibility, but "we can't say that definitively at this point in time."

Leaders of the James Smith Cree Nation, where most of the stabbing attacks took place, blamed the killings on the drug and alcohol abuse plaguing the community, which they said was a legacy of the colonization of Indigenous people.

James Smith Cree Nation resident Darryl Burns and his brother, Ivor Wayne Burns, said their sister, Gloria Lydia Burns, was a first responder who was killed while responding to a call. Burns said his 62-yearold sister was on a crisis response team.

"She went on a call to a house and she got caught up in the violence," he said. "She was there to help. She was a hero."

He blamed drugs and pointed to colonization for the rampant drug and alcohol use "We had a murder suicide here three

years ago. My granddaughter and her boy-

Memphis police ID body of abducted jogger

MEMPHIS — Police in Tennessee said Tuesday they had found the body of a Memphis woman abducted during a pre-dawn run, confirming fears that Eliza Fletcher was killed after she was forced into an SUV on Friday morning.

The news followed an exhaustive search throughout the long weekend with dogs, ATVs and a helicopter in a case that has drawn national media attention and is already becoming a source of partisan controversy over criminal sentencing and

parole. U.S. Marshals arrested Cleotha Abston, 38, on Saturday after police detected his DNA on a pair of sandals found near to where Fletcher was last seen, according to an arrest affidavit. Police did not find Fletcher's body until just after 5 p.m. on Monday and did not publicly confirm that the body was Fletcher's until Tuesday morning. The 34-year-old Fletcher was a school teacher and the granddaughter of a prominent Memphis businessman.

Abston was released from prison in 2020 after serving 20 years for a previous kidnapping. On morning, he made his first court appearance on charges of kidnapping, tampering with evidence, theft, identity theft, and fraudulent use of a credit card. Memphis police said in a Tweet on Tuesday that he will also be charged with first-degree murder and first-degree murder in perpetration of kidnapping. Several of Fletcher's

Titans already hit by

NASHVILLE — The Tennessee Titans are days away from kicking off their new season and already have placed two players on injured reserve.

Losing Pro linebacker Harold Landry III hurts the most.

One advantage Titans have as they prepare to host the New York Giants on Sunday is this isn't the first time they've leaned heavily on that next man up mentality. They earned the No. 1 seed in the AFC last season using an NFLrecord 91 different players, most in a non-strike season, with 26 on injured reserve.

"Just because Harold went out does not mean that we're going to be looking at ourselves like, 'Hey, we're not going to be able to be the type of team or type of defense that we were capable of," safety Kevin Byard said Monday. "We're going to expect, and we've always expected, for backups to play like starters."

The Titans had five starters go on and off injured reserve last season, not counting first-round draft pick Caleb Farley. The cornerback tore an ACL in his lone start.

Yet Tennessee still finished sixth in the NFL in scoring defense, second in run defense and was the only team in the league with three different players to have at least eight sacks apiece. Landry, who started every game the past three seasons, earned his first Pro Bowl nod with a career-

high 12 sacks last season. That earned him a fiveyear contract this offseason after Landry ranked 10th in the NFL with his 12 sacks. He has a team-high 31 sacks over the past four seasons. Landry's total is the second most for this franchise over his first four seasons since 1982 when individual sacks became an official NFL statistic.

Ewers debut includes TDs, towed car

AUSTIN, Texas Quinn Ewers had quite the debut as Texas quarterback, even if it was a little rough around the edges.

The freshman threw his first interception before his first completion. He recovered nicely to throw for 225 yards and two touchdowns in a 52-10 victory over Louisiana-Monroe. But there were a handful of missed deep balls and at some point, campus parking services towed away his car, which he discovered after leaving the stadium that night.

Next up: No. Alabama, and a Crimson Tide defense that will be even tougher than the parking enforcers. "They're fast.

Ewers said Monday in a nonchalant sizing up of all-everything linebacker Will Anderson and the Tide (1-0), which routed Utah State 55-0. "They do everything the right way." Overall, Ewers got good

postgame reviews from his coaches and teammates after his much-anticipated first start in burnt orange. Ewers was one of the

top recruits in the country out of high school in 2020. But amid the COVID-19 pandemic, he skipped his senior season and signed with Ohio State. Then came eight consecutive completions in three drives that finished with two touchdowns, a field goal and a 24-3 lead. By then, Texas was in

total control. Ewers called his first game a "a great learning experience." "I'm glad I faced some adversity," he said. "I

could get over that first little edge." Texas coach Steve Sarkisian said following the game that he didn't dial back the offense after the

turnover. "You can't expect him to ride this bike and do it with training wheels on. I've got to let him go," Sarkisian said.

The blemish in the bounce back was the inability to hit several deep throws to speedy wide receiver Xavier Worthy, who was open several times. Texas depends on the deep strike threat.

"I think I threw the ball where it needed to be, but I wish I had some throws back," Ewers said. "We'll fix it."

Alabama coach Nick Saban called Ewers "a tremendous talent" and expects him to make a big jump in his second game. But the Tide will be looking to exploit that limited game experience.

"This guy's a really, really good player and we're going to have to do a great job of sort of hopefully disguising what we do a little bit so he has to figure it out after he gets the ball in his hand," Saban said. "But he's got the talent to make the plays when he knows where to go with it, that's for sure."

LONDON (AP) — Liz Truss became U.K. prime minister on Tuesday and immediately faced up to the enormous tasks ahead of her: curbing soaring prices, boosting the economy, easing labor unrest and fixing a national health care system burdened by long waiting lists and staff short-

At the top of her inbox is the energy crisis triggered by Russia's invasion of Ukraine, which threatens to push energy bills to unaffordable levels, shuttering businesses and leaving the nation's poorest people shivering at home this winter.

In a break between downpours that drenched central London, Truss said she would cut taxes to spur economic growth, bolster the National Health Service and "deal hands on" with the energy crisis, though she offered few details about how she would implement those policies. She is expected to unveil her plans on Thursday.

British news media reported that Truss plans to cap energy bills. The cost to taxpayers of that step could reach 100 billion pounds (\$116 billion).

"We shouldn't be daunted by the challenges we face," Truss said in her first speech as prime minister, delivered outside her Downing Street office. "As strong as the storm may be, I know the British people are stronger.'
