Goose Creek Fire and Stage 2 Fire MINERAL COUNTY—

The Goose Creek Fire was reported at approximately

1:15 Sunday, June 28. It is burning several miles west of the Town of South Fork. The cause of the fire is currently listed as lighting. The fire is burning in

steep and rugged terrain near the top of the slope in the Goose Creek drainage, south of Lake Humphreys. Helicopters conducted numerous water drops on the fire June 28. The size of the fire as of June 29 was approximately 129 acres.

Monday, June 29 a Type 3 Incident Management Team (IMT) is managing the fire. Plans include a continued air attack with helicopters. Ground crews are developing alternative access options since the best access is near the top of the drainage and poses too high of a risk to firefighter safety.

The Rio Grande National Forest is currently under Stage 2 fire restrictions due to 0 percent of normal snowpack and severe drought

The following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands within the Rio Grande National Forest located within Alamosa, Archuleta, Conejos, Hinsdale, Mineral Rio Grande, Saguache and San Juan Counties, State of Colorado, ("the Restricted Area") and on all roads and trails located with the Restricted Area.

The purpose of this Order is to protect public health, safety, and natural resources by preventing wildfires.

PROHIBITIONS: This Order prohibits the following acts in the Restricted Area:

Igniting, building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, including fires in developed recreation sites (campgrounds and picnicareas), charcoal grills and barbecues, coal and wood burning stoves, and sheepherder's stoves.

Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle, trailer or building.

Blasting, welding, or operating acetylene or other torch with open

Operatingorusing any internal combustion engine without an effective and properly installed USDA- or Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE)approved spark arrestor.

Operating a chain saw without an effective and properly installed USDA- or SAE- approved spark arrestor, a chemical pressurized fire extinguisher (with a minimum of 8 oz. capacity and rating of 2A) kept with the operator and a round point shovel with an overall length of at least 35 inches readily available for use.

Using an explosive. This includes but is not limited to fuses, blasting caps, fireworks, rockets, exploding targets, tracers and incendiary ammunition.

Possessing or using a motor vehicle off established roads, motorized trails or established parking areas, except when parking in an area devoid of vegetation within 10 feet of the vehicle.

Valley suffers eighth COVID related death

SAN LUIS VALLEY -Monday Alamosa County confirmed another COVID-related fatality, a resident of a long-term care facility. There have been 8 fatalities of individuals with COVID-19 in the SLV. Twenty-one new cases for the SLV have been reported since Friday, 6/26: 12 from Alamosa County, 2 each for Conejos and Mineral, 4 for Rio Grande, and 1 for Saguache County. The total number of cumulative cases was 420 at end of day Monday. There are currently 98 known active cases. Thirty-one total

ized, and 314 have completed isolation. Numbers are updated weekdays at slvemergency.org/slvcovid-19/.

Times of crisis often fuel innovation, and this pandemic is no exception. Cloth face coverings are necessary to slow the spread of COVID-19 but can create issues with communication. Not only do face coverings sometimes muffle sound, being able to see facial expressions is a critical component to understanding others, particularly for individuals who rely on lip-reading. Early on in the pandemic, some mask makers addressed this issue by creating face coverings where the mouth and lower face was visible through a plastic window. The effectiveness of these face coverings as compared to other types of face coverings made for public use is still unknown, but it is encouraging that people are coming up with solutions to help accommodate identified needs. The CDC elaborates, "If a clear face covering isn't available, consider whether you can use written communication, use closed captioning, or decrease background noise to make communication possible

while wearing a cloth face covering that blocks your

lips." No matter what kind of face-covering you wear, it is important to wear one when you are around others or out in public during the pandemic, particularly when social distancing is a challenge. In combination with social distancing and handwashing, wearing a cloth face covering has been proven to be an effective deterrent to transmitting COVID-19. html Current fire weather conditions are critical across the SLV region. Please be familiar with burning restrictions in your area. Also, be aware of the health hazards associated with wildfire smoke. If the smoke is thick enough that you can't see clearly 5 miles in any direction, it is unhealthy to be outside. People with chronic lung conditions, asthma, and other issues should be

William Gallagher

ALAMOSA — William Gallagher died the afternoon of June 22, 2020, at San Luis Valley Health in Alamosa, Colorado. The son of James Aloysius and Sophia (Birk) Gallagher, he was born in Louisville, Kentucky, on May 7, 1920. The family moved to San Diego, California, six months later, and Bill spent his formative years in the state, mostly in greater Los Angeles. He graduated from Alhambra High School in 1938 and then attended Cal Poly San Luis Obispo (now California State Polytechnic University), where he earned a degree in animal husbandry and was a member of the school's first 4-year graduating class in

Bill enlisted in the United States Navy in July 1942. Commissioned an ensign, he subsequently was promoted to lieutenant junior grade and then to lieutenant. Because he had sailing experience on his grandfather's 40-foot schooner before the war, he was given command of the USS Romain (IX-89, an 84-foot schooner) and later the USS Saluda (IX 87, an 89-foot Yawl), both of which carried out subma-



ties between Florida and New England in 1942-45. Although Bill never saw combat during the war, he did have memorable experiences. Near Cape May, New Jersey, on the night of May 8, 1945 (the date of Nazi Germany's capitulation), a U-Boat surfaced 100 yards from the Saluda, and the two vessels exchanged messages with flashers. The next morning, the submarine was gone. Bill soon learned that a German submarine had surrendered at Cape May later May 9 and always believed it was the same one. Transferred to the Pacific Theater in the late summer of 1945, he turned down a promotion



to lieutenant commander and completed active duty in February 1946. Mustered out in San Francisco, he returned to Pasadena, where his parents then

On June 16, 1946, Bill married Shirley Rose Gray at the Episcopal Church of Our Savior in San Gabriel, California. The couple, who would have a 73-year marriage, soon had two sons, Timothy Newton (b. 1948) and Gary William (b. 1950). Bill farmed in Antelope Valley and the San Gabriel Valley between 1946 and 1954. He and Shirley Rose first lived in Lancaster, then in Alhambra, and in 1950 purchased a new home in San Gabriel. Increasing land prices in California led Bill to consider acquiring a farm in Nevada, but instead, he and the family relocated in the summer of 1954 to the San Luis

Valley, where he and Dan Childs, an old friend from Cal Poly, managed a large landholding owned by the Chicago insurance magnate John D. MacArthur. The family lived east of Alamosa until Bill, eager to work for himself on his own farm, moved in 1957 to the Carmel District. Bill and Shirley resided in Carmel for more than 40 years, then took up residence in Alamosa in 1999.

Bill always described himself as a farmer, but he spent a great deal of his working life building things. A self-taught engineer, he oversaw the construction of lettuceprocessing plants in Alamosa (1956), Las Cruces, New Mexico (1959), and Center, Colorado (1962-63), and during the 1970s and 1980s built structures of various kinds in the San Luis Valley (including two homes for himself and Shirley). He developed a wide network of friends and always took an interest in real estate. A generous and knowledgeable mentor, Bill helped a number of young people begin businesses, followed their progress, and took pleasure in their successes. His children

and grandchildren often spoke about the range of people who considered him a friend, including those of his own generation as well as many who were much younger. Energetic and actively engaged with life into his 90s, he announced, to the astonishment of the family, that at age 97 he intended to buy and "flip' a house. In typical fashion, he accomplished his goal.

Bill always loved horses and enjoyed flying small aircraft. An accomplished rider, he bought and sold horses as a teenager in Alhambra and participated in rodeos in California and Arizona, most often in the bull riding and bareback bronc events. At Cal Poly, he was part of the team that won the Intercollegiate Rodeo championship at Victorville, California, on April 13, 1940. The silver spurs he won on that occasion remain a treasured family heirloom. He earned his pilot's license in the mid-1950s and over the next thirty years owned and flew, in succession, a Piper Tri-Pacer, a Mooney, and a Piper Comanche.

Bill made an indelible mark on his children and grandchildren. A great

storyteller with an astonishing memory for details, he conveyed to them a huge number of sayings and anecdotes. The grandchildren compiled a list of what they called "Pappyisms," their favorite examples of his often comical and down-toearth sayings. On a more fundamental level, Bill taught them, by his own example, the value of hard work and of keeping your word. He had little patience with excuses and did not worry about things over

which he had no control. Bill leaves behind a legacy of friendship and accomplishment. He is survived by his son Tim and his wife Marsha, his son Gary and his partner Joan Waugh, his grandchildren William Paul (Yasuko) Gallagher, Angie (Jason) Rossback, Tami (Matt) Sliwkowski, and Marlena (Steven) Halko, and eight great-grandchildren. Bill's ashes will be scattered at an appropriate place by members of the family in a private ceremony.






example. Her light shined and will continue to.

Alamosa BOE wrestles with mask issue

STAFF REPORT

The Alamosa School Board's June meeting commenced the evening of June 29. The Board continues to work through the COVID-complications inherent to opening this fall. Of course, students' safety is their number one concern.

As of now, the Board is considering the idea of presenting students with an option: either attending school physically or virtually. The Board ensures both curriculums are of equal quality. This decision is contingent on both the State's approval and the local public health department guidelines.

This issue opened up the conversation around what school offers children that they cannot get online.

The pros compete with the cons here, as students need stability and socialization. However, the cons of COVID are also present. These facts are why the Board wants to provide students with the option. There was some ten-

sion surrounding the students' use of masks while physically present at school. The Alamosa School District would only be requesting students to wear masks, not requiring them. Some Board members expressed concern here, but Superintendent Rob Alejo admitted: "There is a big question mark regarding whether or not it is legal to require people to wear masks."

The Board discussed, at length, procedures for reopening for the 2020-2021 school year. Alejo reminded members the document is "alive," meaning it will change according to need. Some questions brought up concerned when and how the district would determine whether or not to shut schools down. Much of the school year will be touch-and-go, but be sure the Alamosa School Board is anticipating these complications and developing procedures to ensure students' safety.

The meeting ended with the assistant superintendent, Marsha Cody, giving her report. She highlighted members of the Accelerated Design Network team, who set out to work with families and ensure quality educational experience, if they choose distance-learning.





ing up care packages. New rules and what they mean for all Coloradans

DENVER – The Colorado Parks and Wildlife Commission recently adopted a rule change, requiring all visitors 18 or older to possess a valid hunting or fishing license to access any State Wildlife Area or State Trust Land leased by Colorado Parks and Wildlife. This new rule will be in effect beginning July 1, 2020.

"Colorado Parks and Wildlife manages over 350 State Wildlife Areas and holds leases on nearly 240 State Trust Lands in Colorado, which are funded through the purchase of hunting and fishing licenses," said Southeast Regional Manager Brett Ackerman. "The purpose of these properties is to conserve and improve wildlife habitat, and provide access to wildlife-related recreation like hunting and fishing that are a deep part of Colorado's

conservation legacy." Because these properties have always been open to the public, not just to the hunters and anglers that purchased them and pay for their maintenance, many people visit these properties and use them as they would any other public land. As Colorado's population - and desire for outdoor recreation has continued to grow, a significant increase in traffic to these SWAs and STLs has disrupted wildlife, the habitat the areas were acquired to protect, and the hunters and anglers whose contributions were critical to acquiring these

properties. Because funding for these properties is specifically generated by hunting and fishing license sales and the resulting federal match, requested options such as "hiking licenses" or "conservation permits" would not allow for the maintenance and management needed. Any funding from one of these conceptual licenses

or permits would reduce

the federal grant dollar for dollar and thus fail to increase CPW's ability to protect and manage the properties.

This new rule change will help our agency begin to address some of the unintended uses we're seeing at many of our State Wildlife Areas and State Trust Lands," said CPW Director Dan Prenzlow. "We have seen so much more non-wildlife related use of these properties that we need to bring it back to the intended use - conservation and protection of wildlife and their habitat."

'We do anticipate some confusion based on how the properties are funded, and the high amount of unintended use over time in these areas. We plan to spend a good amount of time educating the public on this change,' said Ackerman. "But in its simplest form, it is just as any other user-funded access works. You cannot use a fishing license to enter a state park, because the park is not purchased and developed specifically for fishing. Similarly, you cannot use a park pass to enter lands that are intended for the sole purpose of wildlife conservation, because a park pass is designed to pay for parks." State law requires that the agency keep these fund-

ing sources separated. CPW is a user-funded agency and, unlike most government agencies, receives very little money from the general fund. The new rule requires all users to contribute to the source of funding that makes the acquisition and maintenance of these properties possible. But the activities that interfere with wildlife-related uses or that negatively impact wildlife habitat don't become acceptable just because an individual possesses a hunting or fishing license. Each SWA and STL is unique

and only certain activi-

ties are compatible with

each property.
