## Common errors on the water

Follow these tips to be a courteous and safe boater



emorial Day has come and gone, and I'm happy to report for the weekend holiday, the Missouri State Highway Patrol Water Division reported no boating fatalities or drownings across the state. However, there were many first-time boaters, boaters who were not educated in the basic navigation rules, and some boaters who didn't seem to care or take responsibility for their actions. With that in mind, let's review some simple boating navigation rules and boating courtesy.

#### 1. There are two types of vessels on the water ways: Stand-on and Give-way.

Simply put, the Stand-on vessel is the boat that continues at the same speed and direction. The Give-way vessel is the vessel the yields.

When you are driving on the highway, you drive on the right side of the road. On a lake, imagine a white line down the center. When you are going upstream, drive to the right of the center of the lake. When going downstream, drive to the right of center. Just like you would on a highway.

Avoid wandering from shore to shore. This only confuses other boaters. They cannot read your mind, and you cannot read theirs. One way to help communicate your intentions is to drive with convection. Pick a fixed point on land, go directly to the fixed point. Understand that may not be your finial destination but continue this process until you get where you are going. In other words, A to B, B to C and so on. By driving in straight lines, you are telegraphing your intention to other boaters.

#### 2. When do you Stand-on or Give-way?

Just like driving a car. You will encounter three basic scenarios:

- a. Head on. If another boat is approaching head on, both boats are Give-way. Both boats will turn to their right. Each vessel will pass each other port to port.
- b. Crossing. Just like when you are driving a car and come to a four-way intersection that is uncontrolled, the boat to your right is the Stand-on vessel. Your boat is the Give-way or yield to the boat to the right. Be sure to pass the stand-on boat to its stern, never attempt to cross in front of the stand-on vessel.

c. Over-Taking. In the instance you are approaching a boat that may be slower than you, the boat you are overtaking is the Stand-on vessel, your boat is the Give-way. If traffic allows, pass the vessel you are overtaking and pass to the left, in some cases you will pass to the right. Note, when passing pass with enough distance where your wake will not cause damage or swamping, rocking the other vessel. A distance of 100 feet is recommended between both vessels.

When in doubt if you are a Stand-on or Give-way, be the Giveway. Remember, your job as the captain is to avoid boating incidences and accidents.

## 3. Towing a skier and tubing or wakeboarding. What is needed, and when to use the skier down flag.

a. When towing a skier or pulling a tube you must have an observer. In Missouri, rearview mirrors are not permitted. The reason for the observer is their job is to be a lookout to notify the captain when the skier falls off the skis or when people on the tube get tossed off.

When a person is in the water, that is when you raise the orange / red flag. The sole purpose of the skier down flag is to let other boaters know there is a person in the water and you are attempting to pick them up, or allow them to swim back to their skis or tube. When that person(s) is back up and skiing or tubing, the flag comes back down. DO NOT ride around with the flag up all the time. The Missouri Water Patrol will most likely stop you and issue a warning.

b. When skiing or tubing, do not do this activity in the main channel. It is difficult to see when someone is in the water and they could get injured by a prop. Find a large enough cove to perform this activity.

When skiing, tubing or wakeboarding stay at least 100 feet away from docks, and be considerate of other vessels that may be anchored or fishing by staying at least 100 feet away and reducing your speed if necessary.

Remember to share the waterway and be sure all involved wear a life-jacket.

#### 4. Understand all posted buoys.

Over the holiday, one unfortunate boater ran aground on an underwater reef at Lake of the Ozarks. The area was plainly marked off with exclusion and danger buoys. Lucky, no one was hurt and all on board escaped. The boat was a total loss.

What is a buoy: A buoy is a floating object that is used to show ships and boats where they can go and to warn them of danger, provide information, or regulate traffic.

There are four main types of buoys used in inland waters. They are:

Information Buoy: These are marked with a square and give information other than the edges of safe water areas. They are found on lakes and rivers and give directions and information, mark controlled or closed areas, indicate where there's food and gas, and possible hazards.

Here at Lake of the Ozarks, information buoys are mounted on dock floats and a large billboard with written instruction.

Danger Buoy: Diamonds warn of hazards such as rocks, shoals or turbulent waters. Always proceed with caution and keep a safe distance. Never assume that every hazard will be marked by a buoy.

Control Buoys: Circles indicate a restricted boating area such as no wake, idle speed, speed limit, or wash restrictions. You must obey the restriction inside the circle.

Keep-Out Buoys, also called Exclusion Area buoys. These are marked with crossed diamonds indicate areas where pleasure craft are prohibited such as dams and spillways, swim areas or endangered aquatic habitat.

When boating is a good idea to keep a distance of 50 feet away from a buoy. All buoys are anchored to a weight by means of a cable or chain. At low water tables, the cable or chain could become entangled in the lower unit of the motor and cause damage.


5. Gas dock courtesy. With the number of boaters out on the water, there were lines of boats waiting for fuel. At any given time at Lake of the Ozarks on a weekend or holiday there can be over 160,000 boats on the water. Before going out, it is important to fuel up, the day before if possible. Most gas docks are limited to the number of gas pumps as well as personnel to service you.

A few helpful hints:

- Know your fuel tank capacity. When fueling only fill to 90 percent do not keep filling so that the fuel exits through the over-flow vent. This contaminates the water and causes a fire hazard.
- If you are approaching the fuel dock and there is a line, wait your turn and be courteous. Don't barge in front of a boater waiting to dock or may have problems is docking.
- After fueling is complete, if you have a inboard or a inboard/ outboard motor, run the blower for at least four to five minutes. Use this time to go into the store and pay for fuel or other items needed before leaving. Then start your engines and leave the dock allowing another boat to gas up. Don't not linger. Inform your passenger to purchase or use the restroom quickly. Remember, there other boaters.
- Tip the dock people. They are doing their best and working hard in the hot summer sun.

Everyone is on the water to enjoy and make great memories. Do your part in sharing the waterways being courteous, and staying safe!



# The Fishing Report

#### Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

he lake level was 659.03, generation of 1,000 cubic feet per second (CFS) throughout the week for a level of 659.5 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 76 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 707.0 level.

To Note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Tournament Results: Lawson Hibdon and Dirk Sluyter won the Angler's Choice tournament last Sunday with five bass weighing 21.08 pounds

#### Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on shaky head worms and finesse worms on drop shot rigs along rock banks.

#### Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on shaky head worms and Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms around docks in coves and on the main lake. Crappie: Good trolling crankbaits on the main lake and in the middle of coves.

#### Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms, jigs and deep-diving crankbaits along main and secondary points. Crappie: Good trolling crankbaits in coves and on the main lake. Catfish: Excellent drifting cut shad and skipjack herring.

#### Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on wackyrigged worms and topwater lures around docks or on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms and deep-diving crankbaits along points. Crappie: Good on jigs and minnows 15 feet deep along main lake docks.

#### **Grand Glaize**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on topwater lures early in the morning and deep-diving crankbaits, swimbaits, jigs and plastic worms on points later in the day. Crappie: Good on jigs 15 feet deep in brush and along docks.



Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Texas-rigged plastic craws and plastic worms, jigs, Ned rigs and swimbaits along main channel cuts. Crappie: Fair trolling crankbaits along channel ledges and main lake points or on jigs and minnows 20 feet deep around docks.

#### **Upper Osage**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms, jigs and swimbaits along main and secondary points. Crappie: Good on minnows 10 feet deep around docks. Catfish: Good on cut shad and stink baits off docks around secondary points.

#### **Truman Dam spillway**

Water clarity: Clear. Fishing is slow for all species.

After the flight, kids receive a certificate attesting to their flight, and a FAA legal flight logbook. They are also given a code for a free on-line Private Pilot course.

Other activities scheduled for the Flight Rally include Airplane pedal cars for those younger than 8 and free hot dogs and refreshments.

Those attending the flight rally on June 17 are asked to pre-register at YEDAY.ORG/7133. Flights will take place from 11 a.m.-2 p.m.

# Route 66, murals and tribes

ostalgia along Route 66 is disappearing fast, especially with the devastation to businesses experienced from the COVID 19 pandemic. That is why it is important to visit the last remaining vestiges on the historic mother road.

One favorite feature of America's most beloved highway is the murals. This segment to visit begins in Miami (pronounced Myam-ah), Oklahoma, just south of the Missouri border outside of Joplin. Most know the area as a collective of Indian casinos, but the town has more if you step around the casinos and follow Route 66. Starting downtown, Miami greets visitors with a metal gateway announcing your arrival to the shopping district. The murals of Route 66 start here in Miami. Check them out downtown.

Also downtown is the 1929 Coleman Theater. The historic vaudeville era theater has fine examples of long forgotten architecture like gargoyles, cherubs, and dolphins.





### DAY TRIP

The original pipe organ still works the times when silent movies are played. Will Rogers appeared on that stage at one time, along with silent film star Tom Mix. The Coleman Theater has never gone dark, continuously operating since 1929, now with movies. The Coleman Theater is located downtown at 103 N. Main Street, Miami, Oklahoma (David, 2023).

A good time to visit the area is during the upcoming Heritage Fest in Miami. Held on the last weekend of July, visitors can enjoy two days of live music, along with food trucks, a beer garden, a 5K run, car and bike show, poker run, and vendors. On July 28 and 29, Downtown Miami welcomes visitors from 4 p.m. to midnight on Saturday and 9 a.m. to midnight on Sunday to the destination festival along historic Route 66. A KC Barbeque Society sanctioned com-

The Route 66 Gift Shop at the Miami Convention and Visitors Bureau has all the swag that fans of the "mother road" could ever want, as the gateway city to Route 66 in the Midwest.

June and July are the months to experience a Native American Pow-Wow. Part religious service, part cultural event, the pow-wow, according to Osage Nation family member Cody Hammer, is a celebration that encompasses all of those elements twice a year.

"We worship the same higher power you do, just in a different way. We also worship on Sundays at Christian churches. This is just the traditional way of our heritage," he shared. In Miami, pow-wows in June and July are presented by the Peoria and Miami Nation tribes. July is the Quapaw Tribe's Pow-Wow.

Before leaving Miami, grab lunch at a favorite long time burger joint, Waylon's Ku-Ku Burger.

Waylon's Ku-Ku Burger is a must stop every trip to Miami, whether exploring Route 66, or visiting the casinos. Waylon's Ku-Ku Burger, back in the heyday of Route 66 was a well known restaurant chain (Waylan's Ku-Ku Burger | TravelOK. com - Oklahoma's Official Travel & Tourism Site, n.d.). Today, the Miami location is the only one still operating. There is a giant yellow ku-ku bird on top of the quaint diner. Inside, eaters will find the hamburger or their grandfather's day. Greasy off a hot grill, smashed thin and big, with crispy thin fries or onion straws. Make sure to grab a milkshake the old fashioned way. Ku-Ku Burger serves up some unusual offerings as well. The Buffalo Burger is a nod to locally-raised fresh bison meat, not easily found elsewhere.



# How to create more privacy on your property

n inviting backyard can serve as a welcome retreat from the hustle and bustle of daily life. After a long day at the office or an exhausting day spent transporting kids to and fro, it's hard to resist the allure of a peaceful outdoor space in which to unwind.

Privacy is a key component of any backyard oasis. Some homes may be so remote that privacy isn't an issue. But many suburban homeowners recognize they might need to tweak their landscapes if they hope to create a private oasis outside.

#### Fencing or planting?

Most homeowners looking to create more privacy on their property will have to choose between fencing and planting. Fencing provides immediate privacy because, once it's installed, no one can see into the yard. Fencing also doesn't require watering or other immediate upkeep, which will be necessary when planting to ensure tree roots can establish themselves.

But planting has its benefits as well. Planting for privacy is essentially creating a living fence that can grow over time and provide even more privacy as trees reach maturity. Plants also tend to be less costly than fencing. The home renovation experts at BobVila.com estimate that fencing projects typically cost between \$1,667 and \$4,075. However, fencing projects can cost considerably more than \$4,000, especially for homeowners with large properties they want to enclose. Large, mature trees can be expensive, though it's unlikely they will cost as much as fencing. In addition, fencing requires more maintenance and will potentially need to be replaced, while native trees won't require much upkeep and can last for generations.

#### **Planting**

Homeowners who choose to plant for privacy will next have to decide which type of plants to add to their properties. Evergreens provide year-round privacy because they don't shed their leaves, so these are the ones most often chosen when creating a living fence. A number of varieties of evergreen trees can do the job, but it's important that homeowners consult with a landscape architect prior to choosing trees so they can ensure the trees will thrive when faced with the growing conditions on their properties. During such a consultation, homeowners may discuss the following popular privacy trees.

- Leyland cypress: The Arbor Day Foundation® notes that the Leyland cypress is popular for hedges and boundaries, likely because a typical tree reaches a mature height of 60′-70′ and can spread as wide as 25′. The Leyland cypress grows fast, which may appeal to homeowners who don't want to wait to establish privacy.
- Green Giant Arborvitae: There are different varieties of the arborvitae, but the Green Giant tends to be the go-to option for privacy. The ADF notes that Green Giants will grow up to three feet per year until they reach maturity, providing a fast-growing option for privacy planters. The Green Giant can spread as wide as 20 feet at maturity, which is another attribute that makes it so popular among homeowners desiring privacy.
- Eastern White Pine: The ADF notes that the eastern white pine, which can reach heights as high as 80 feet, is favored in spacious yards. That's likely due to its height and its potential spread, which can reach 40 feet. Homeowners who choose the eastern white pine might like it for its resemblance to a Christmas tree, and in fact it is widely used for that purpose. The privacy provided by the eastern white pine is significant, but it might be best suited to especially large properties.

Whether it's fencing or planting, homeowners have many options to consider as they seek to create more privacy on their properties.







The process of making the Hawaiian shave ice starts with a block of ice, shaved into thin flakes and packed into a serving cup with your choice of syrup and toppings. The selection of about 20 flavors change often including multiple sugar-free options and several fun toppings like whipped cream, Nerds, sprinkles, and Fruity Pebbles. One of the most popular combos has been Tigers Blood, made with a traditional shave ice fruit punch flavor and Nerds. Piña Colada with cream is another great combo.





# Key components of a fun picnic

Approval was granted at the Thursday, June 1, Osage Beach Board of Aldermen meeting. Construction is slated to begin immediately with plans to open in summer 2024. The vote was unanimous, and the board also gave firstround approval of a development agreement which outlines the specifics of the project. The development plan is the visionary portion of the project, while the agreement provides the "huts and bolts" aspects of the overall Oasis at Lakeport.

"With the development plan approved by the City of Osage Beach, we are extremely pleased to begin construction of Oasis at Lakeport, which will offer year-round attractions and entertainment for everyone at the lake

to enjoy," said Todd Schneider, co-managing partner of SkyView Partners. "SkyView Partners and Tegethoff Development are committed to keeping the Osage Beach community informed of our progress over the next year as Oasis grows to be the premiere tourist destination of the Midwest."

Oasis at Lakeport is a new \$350 million family resort and entertainment district to be developed along the Lakeport property acquired by Big Thunder Marine in 2021, at Highway 54 and Jeffries Road adjacent to the Grand Glaize Bridge. Construction plans include the creation of a year-round entertainment destination offering 25 acres of amusement rides and attractions, a Marriott Hotels property and 26,000-square-foot conference center, indoor waterpark, restaurants, 200 public boat slips and a 1,000-space parking garage. Amusement offerings will include roller coasters, thrill and family rides and a 200-foot-tall observation wheel.
