



A community full of art, trolley rides, museums and shopping.

here is something for everyone in St. Charles, Missouri, making it the perfect destination for a summer day trip. Whether it is for families, singles, or retirees, St. Charles has activities, shopping, and history that will suit any age.

The Foundry Art Centre

A top-rated destination on TripAdvisor.com, The Foundry Art Centre is a non-profit business in St. Charles in the Riverfront Main Street district. Hosted at this venue are 14 studio artists. Public events are fun and connect people to the arts and culture. The Foundry hosts frequent block parties and First Fridays. The Foundry Art Centre is located at: 520 North Main Street, St. Charles

The St. Charles Trolley

The trolley is a free shuttle operated by the city that makes a 40-minute loop through the Main Street district, all the way to Bass Pro, making stops at Ameristar Casino and The Foundry Art Center. It is completely ADA accessible, with only service dogs allowed. The Trolley was rolling down I-70 this weekend loaded with passengers from the Missouri River "Main Street" district to the shopping center south at Bass Pro Outdoors. It travels quite a distance for a free trolley! The trolley hours are Fridays-Sundays, 11 a.m.-7 p.m. from May 5 to December 24.

The Play Street Museum

Interactive learning and play areas for all ages of children. It urges imaginative play and fosters independence in little, active family members. The Play Street Museum is a wonderful way to get out of the sweltering summer heat, being a completely indoor activity. Make your way through the interactive children's museum and indoor play area for children 8 and under for a world created just for them! The museum takes reservations for parties, so it is a perfect place to celebrate birthdays and other life events with their little friends.

Play Street has a store equipped with imaginative toys when one first enters. If you have forgotten or do not have time to purchase a birthday gift, never fear. The store offers many choices. Parties are held after hours and are private events. Recently attending a birthday party at Play Street, the first thing one notices is the intricate village designed for children. A pizzeria, a doctor's office, ice cream parlor, fire station, and cottage house are completely accessible for children to explore and design. The fire station is equipped with play slides. (The Play Street Museum is located at 1650 Beale St. Ste 138).

DAY TRIP

Also located in the same shopping district, The Streets of St. Charles offer a plethora of choices. A large AMC Movie Theater, Hot Box Cookies, a Brazilian grille, and an eating place on every corner, The Streets of St. Charles is the new destination for families in St. Charles. An onsite hotel, The Drury Inn, is built into this living and shopping community. An underground garage makes parking easy. The popular Mission Taco Joint is a big draw. Free valet parking is available on the street.

Mission Taco Joint is a must-visit. The local chain is springing up all over town. It was reviewed on a Day Trippin of the Historic Soulard Market district, but the new location at The Streets of St. Charles begs a dinner, too. The first location was in the Delmar Loop of St. Louis. The street classic was twisted into a modern concoction of meats like crispy pork belly, and Mission Taco Joint was a hit. It has expanded to Kansas City as well. There are nine of them in both cities. The menu is the same at all locations. Last time, pork belly was the choice at Soulard. This time,

the meal started with their house made chips and two salsas, mild and hot. Anytime empanadas are on the menu, they are going to be ordered. Three beef empanadas with flaky crust started the entrees. Next, keeping with the beef feast, the dinner was rounded out by the beef birria torta, a spicy beef sandwich with garlic aioli, au jus, and cilantro.



Rock Island Trail Park

Versailles and Eldon plan to develop the section of the trail that runs closest to their business districts.

ity officials and State Representatives traveled to the tiny town of Windsor last Friday, June 30 to celebrate the Missouri State Parks addition of their 93rd state park. The Rock Island Trail State Park was officially named, and the new sign unveiled on the trailhead at the Katy Trail/Rock Island Trail Spur at Windsor. Windsor was the first town to launch a privately funded economic development related to the Rock Island Trail. Kim's Cabins, with owner Kim Henderson, has become the face of the vision for towns that are still developing along the trail. Henderson spoke as the Vice President of Friends of the Rock Island Trail. She has been instrumental in the grass roots effort that had emerged into the Missouri State Parks development since 2015. Her trail cabin business began as a few picnic tables and tent spots. It now features four cabins and equestrian needs, which is popular among trail riders of the area.

Statewide, representatives from two districts attended the unveiling, and one rode his bike in and out. District 62 Representative Bruce Sassman was one of those riders who enjoyed the new trail. Eldon's City Administrator Don Smith joined Friends of the Rock Island Trail, Missouri State Parks representatives, and Missouri Department of Natural Resources administrators on the inaugural ride of the newly developed segment at the end of the ceremony. District 162 Representative Jim Kalberloh spoke at the trail opening.

Plans for the development of the trail, as addressed by each Mayor or Administrator of towns that have State Parks master plans in place, were shared with the attendees. In the lake area, Versailles and Eldon have funds to implement those plans, with Versailles being funded by a TIF grant, and Eldon having private city funding. Both towns plan to develop the section of the trail that runs closest to their business districts. Eldon already has reconstructed their depot. Versailles does not have a depot yet.

Your guide to catching fish at Lake of the Ozarks.

he lake level was 659.5, generation of 1,000 cubic feet per second (CFS) throughout the week for a level of 659.5 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 83 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 704.4 level.

To Note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Catfish: Good on skipjack herring.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on Texas-rigged plastic worms, wacky-rigged stickworms and topwater lures around docks in coves. Crappie: Fair on jigs and minnows around condo docks.

Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Texas-rigged plastic worms, shaky head finesse worms and jigs behind docks or in brush piles 10 to 15 feet deep in the creeks. Crappie: Good trolling crankbaits on the main channel.

Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms 15 to 25 feet deep in brush piles. Crappie: Good trolling crankbaits along the main channel. Catfish: Good drifting skipjack herring.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on shaky head worms in brush along points and in coves. Crappie: Fair on jigs and minnows 10 to 30 feet deep around shad schools in open water or around docks.

Niangua

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Slow on Texas-rigged plastic craws and lizards or topwater lures early in the morning along bluffs and mouths of coves. Crappie: Slow on minnows 15 to 20 feet deep around docks.

Upper Osage

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Slow on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms and jigs around docks 8 to 10 feet deep. Crappie: Fair trolling crankbaits along the main channel. Walleye: Fair trolling crankbaits along the main channel. Catfish: Good on live sunfish, goldfish, cut shad and nightcrawlers.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Clear. Fishing is very slow for all species.



The Average Lifespan of HVAC

Generally, with proper maintenance most residential HVAC systems have a typical lifespan between 10 to 20 years. For instance, an increase in dust on surfaces in your home could be a signal to replace the furnace filter, which should be done monthly for optimal performance. Loud noises from the HVAC or inconsistent room temperature can also indicate the need for maintenance or an upgrade.

The Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio (SEER) rating of your air conditioner is a measurement of the product's cooling output in comparison to the total electric energy input. The SEER rating, which can range from 13 to over 30, represents the heat pump cooling and air conditioning efficiency.

You'll want to know the rating to help you understand the efficiency of your unit when it works at its maximum potential. In general, the higher the rating, the better. For example, your air conditioner should have a SEER rating of at least 14.5 to qualify as an ENERGY STAR product.

The gold standard for energy efficiency is ENERGY STAR, a U.S. government-backed program that helps consumers and businesses easily identify products designed and built to meet above-average efficiency standards. In fact, heating and cooling costs could be cut by up to 20 percent versus traditional HVAC products by using EN-ERGY STAR certified models.

Keeping your heating, ventilation, and HVAC equipment well-maintained can have a significant effect on your utility bills and will help you catch small issues before they snowball into financial burdens. Replace the air filter regularly, have a maintenance expert evaluate your system twice a year in the spring and fall, and report any concerns to your HVAC provider between planned visits. 

Explore the Caves


Missouri is the cave state and a few show caves are located in the Lake area. Tour guides will explain the history and beautiful formations as you take a stroll in an underground wonderland.







Hanging around the Lake

Blues Traveler performs at Ozarks Amphitheater

our high school buddies gathered in their drummer's parent's basement in Princeton, New Jersey to jam 36 years ago. From those high school sessions emerged a group that has been continuously performing music that has resonated with fans and stood the test of time. Blues Traveler kicked off their "Blue Monsters Tour 2023" in July and will take the Ozarks Amphitheater stage on August 19.

"We were one of the few bands that never split up and never took a break," said Blues Traveler guitarist Chandler (Chan) Kinchla. "Some people thought we were a southern band, probably because of the harmonica. We consider ourselves a rock and blues band. We grew up with the 70's and 80's classic rock." In fact, if you ask Kinchla who influenced them he will tell you among the members the answers are The Grateful Dead, Jimmy Hendrix and Led Zeppelin. The four original members of Blues Traveler were John Popper (vocals, harmonica and guitar), Chan Kinchla (guitar), Brendan Hill (drums) and the late Bobby Sheehan (bass). Their start was performing along the New York area club circuit, often every night.

"I love sports and I still do," Kinchla said. "I had the opportunity to either continue to play football or go to New York with this awesome band. I chose the band."

Upon graduation from high school the members moved to New York City. Popper, Hill and Sheehan were students in the music program at The New School and Kinchla attended New York University. Eventually they all quit college to pursue music.

In 1990 they released their first album with the song "But Anyway" getting airplay on college radio stations. Their second album, "Travelers and Thieves" followed a year later. Around the same time they got national expo-

sure with an appearance on The David Letterman Show. Kinchla refers to Letterman as the guy who gave them their first national television break. They have performed on "The Late Show with David Letterman" more than any other artist.

In August of 1999, band member Bobby Sheehan passed away. Agreeing that Sheehan would have wanted them to continue as a band, Kinchla's younger brother Tad joined as the new bassist. "My brother always hung around the band, so it was like he was a member already," Kinchla explained.

They're best known for their improvisational live shows where concert goers recognize hits such as "Run Around", "Hook" and "But Anyway." The song "Run Around" became the groups first chart hit followed by "Hook." In 1992, they founded the H.O.R.D.E. (Horizons of Rock Developing Everywhere) festival which featured traveling headliners in addition to local bands, charities, and organizations.

They went on to appear at Woodstock '94 and became an opening act for The Rolling Stones. A last-minute replacement for the artist Prince, they played on the 1995 season premiere of Saturday Night Live. They went on to record a number of songs for television shows and movies.

The band writes all their own music. Collaboratively, Blues Traveler went on to release several albums, four of which have gone gold, three platinum and one six times platinum. They've sold more than 10 million combined units worldwide. They've played over 3,500 performances and their single "Run Around" had the longest charting radio single in Billboard history. This earned them a Grammy for "Best Rock Performance by a Duo or Group with Vocals." Their first official blues album was nominated for "Best Traditional Blues Album" in 2022.

"We've always loved playing live and that's kept us engaged and into it," Kinchla said. "We had a slow build. We felt we really made it when we got our first tour bus. We had been touring in vans for years. I still love the tour bus to this day." Kinchla added playing to large crowds and earning their first top 10 hit were also milestones for the band. "It's several steps along the way," he explained. "You work hard but you also need a lot of luck."

Other highlights over the years include opening for The Allman Brothers Band for a complete summer when the Blues Traveler members were just in their 20s. The next summer, opening for Carlos Santana was exciting.

"We were just coming out of playing New York bars," Kinchla said. "And then we are opening for these big acts."

The secret to staying together for so long, Kinchla said, is that they are a family.

"I don't know why bands break up, they usually end up getting back together. We love playing together live, and we always fall back on that. There's always room for someone to go off and do a solo project. We're never afraid to learn or do something new."

Having started together at a young age appears to be an asset for the group. "We grew up together," Kinchla added. "We are a family. Like families, there's room to have some tantrums and that's ok."

The band continually tours and has a new rhythm and blues album coming out later this year. This summer's tour consists of 27 shows with stops in 17 different states. Since 1994, with the exception of 1999 and 2020, the band has headlined a fourth of July show at Colorado's Red Rocks Amphitheatre. This tradition attracts fans from all over the country.

"The goal of all our shows is to capture the environment and the vibe," Kinchla said. "We improvise all the time so it's a different show every night."


