





### WHAT TO HAVE ONBOARD

When preparing to go out on a vessel, there are a few things you need to check that are legally required to be on board. The Missouri State Highway Patrol, Water Patrol Division advises operators to make sure these items are handy.

### PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICES

Under federal law, a wearable PFD is required for each person on board regardless of vessel length. Children under the age of 7 must wear a U.S. Coast Guard-approved PFD



at all times unless the child is confined to a totally enclosed area such as a houseboat or a day-cruiser.

#### **NAVIGATION LIGHTS**

The required navigation lights differ depending on the size and type of your vessel. You must display the required navigation lights between sunset and sunrise and during periods of restricted visibility.



#### **FIRE EXTINGUISHER**

All vessels (there are few restrictions) are required to have a Type B, U.S. Coast Guard-approved fire extinguisher on board in an accessible area. Check the charge level of your fire extinguishers regularly. Replace them immediately if they are not fully charged.

#### SOUND PRODUCING DEVICES

Vessels more than 16 feet but less than 40 feet in length are required to carry a whistle or horn to signal intentions or positions. Vessels that are 40 feet or more in length are required to carry a whistle or horn and a bell on board.





# The Fishing Report

### Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

he lake level was 659.6, generation of 1,000 cubic feet per second (CFS) throughout the week for a level of 659.5 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 86 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 704.6 level.

To Note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

#### Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Ned rigs and shaky head worms along rock transition banks.

#### **Lower Lake**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on shaky head worms and drop shot worms along bluffs, points and in main channel pockets 20 to 25 feet deep or on topwater lures in coves when fish are surfacing. Crappie: Fair on jigs and minnows in brush piles 25 feet deep.

#### Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms at night in brush piles 15 to 20 feet deep. Crappie: Good trolling crankbaits on the main channel and in coves. Catfish: Good drifting cut shad and skipjack herring.

#### Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on Texas-rigged plastic worms less than 8 feet deep around brush piles in creeks and main lake pockets. Crappie: Good shooting jigs 8 to 10 feet deep under docks. Catfish: Good on jigs and plastic worms or drifting cut shad and nightcrawlers along bluffs.

#### **Grand Glaize**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on shaky head worms, jigs and wacky-rigged stickworms along main lake docks. Crappie: Fair on jigs and minnows 10 to 30 feet deep in brush piles and around condo docks and marinas.

#### Niangua

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Slow on topwater lures in the early morning or Texas-rigged plastic craws and 10-inch plastic worms in brush 15 to 30 feet deep. Crappie: Slow on minnows 15 to 20 feet deep around docks. White bass: Good on jigs, small crankbaits and inline spinners along the main channel.



#### **Upper Osage**

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Good on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms around shallow brush in coves. Crappie: Fair on minnows 12 to 15 feet deep around docks. White bass: Good on jigs, Roostertails and topwater lures along points in the evenings. Catfish: Good on cut shad.

#### **Truman Dam spillway**

Water clarity: Clear. Fishing is slow for all species.

### Ask the golf pro

When is it appropriate to allow players to play through another group? I typically play with one other person and get behind a foursome on many occasions.

John D., Iberia

This question has many layers to peel. According to the rules of golf, a foursome has precedent on the course. However, common courtesy would tell you that faster players or smaller groups should expect to go through a foursome. Even though a foursome may be playing quickly, a group of less than four can play faster than four if everything is equal.

Factors to consider are is the group directly in front of you keeping up with the group in front of them or are they waiting as well. Here at the Lake you may only see the group in front of you and you don't realize that the group in front of you is waiting as well. Use the course marshals to ascertain what is happening with the group and or groups ahead of you.

If the course is full for many holes in front of you, it probably is not adventitious to let another group play through as this will continue to slow everyone down. If you are the group behind a foursome, be patient and allow course attendants to address your concerns. If you are the foursome, be aware of other players behind you and if possible let the faster or lesser player groups go through.

I love to play but I don't feel I play enough or have the amount of time it takes to get my money's worth out of a club membership. How can I play golf and not break the bank?

There are a limited amount of Mid-Missouri passes available each year that offer a reduced rate for two rounds of golf at each participating facility. These typically go on sale in January and sell-out very quickly. Another option is to look into league play at some local courses. You can typically pay a small league fee and play in their once a week league for a nominal charge.

Most courses have afternoon or weekday rates that are reduced and many course have daily specials online on their websites. These change daily as business demand dictates.

Last minute deals are out there if you're flexible when you can play, similar to the airline business.





### **BOATING**

# Safety tips while using water toys on the Lake

t is summer and it is hot. The water is refreshing and it's time to break out the water toys, or maybe even get new ones. Floating mats, water trampolines, inflatables and arm floaties are all fun to use but even though they can help keep a baby, child or adult afloat, water toys are not a substitute for a safety device. They should never be seen as a replacement for adult supervision or used without a life jacket.

The Good Housekeeping Research Institute (GHRI) found aquatic toys to be especially dangerous. The toys were found to flip easily, putting children at risk of injury or drowning (especially if the children were ejected into deep water).

Some of the toys were so slippery, children fell into the water while attempting to climb them. Other toys were so flimsy as to easily collapse under the weight of one child. Many inflatable toys water and mats can easily flip, sending a child into the water or trapping the child below the surface.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicates for every child under age 18 who dies from drowning, another seven receive emergency department care for nonfatal drownings. Nearly 40 percent of drownings treated in emergency departments require hospitalization or transfer for further care (compared with 10 percent for all unintentional injuries).

A drowning can happen quickly and quietly anywhere there is water, especially to unsupervised children. It happens in lakes and oceans, pools, bathtubs, and even buckets of water. Life jackets can prevent drowning during water activities, especially boating and swimming. The U.S. Coast Guard reported 658 boating-related deaths in 2021. Of those, 81 percent died by drowning, and 83 percent of these people were not wearing life jackets.

It is unfortunate, in 2022 and this year, we have had adults and children severely injured or died due to drowning, using water toys, and aqua mats.

So, what does a drowning look like? The Red Cross offers this: Do you imagine drowning to be splashy and loud, with arms flailing and screams for help, as perhaps seen in a movie? If you thought you could hear if a loved one was drowning, you would be sorely mistaken. The reality is that someone could be drowning a few feet away from you and you wouldn't know it - because drowning is often silent.

When people are drowning, all of their energy is going into trying to breathe and staying above water," says Shelley Dalke, Director, Swimming and Water Safety Programs for the Red Cross.

### BOATING



Keep a life jacket on hand when paddling on the Lake. Better yet, wear a life jacket anytime you are boating or swimming.

#### 7 warning signs that someone is drowning:

- 1. Struggling to keep their face above the water in an effort to breathe head is low in the water, tilted back, and mouth is at water level.
  - 2. Has arms extended to the side pressing down for support.
- 3. Has a vertical or approaching vertical body position with no supportive kick, appear as if they are bobbing.
- 4. Might continue to struggle underwater, but isn't making any headway, often facing the nearest point of safety, for example land, a person, shallow water, a buoyant support toy or a boat.
  - 5. Eyes appear big, glassy and empty, unable to focus.
  - 6. Inability to respond to the question: "Are you okay?"
  - 7. Silence.

### What precautions can be taken while enjoying our waterways, to make it safe for all?

- 1. Everyone wears a life jacket, adult, teen or child.
- 2. Restrict the use of alcohol.
- 3. Read and follow the manufacture recommendation user instruction.
- 4. Follow manufacture recommended maintenance and care instructions.
- 5. Periodically, examine the water toy for defects. Repair or discard, if necessary. Do not use if it is in bad condition.
- 6. Don't use floatables in high boat traffic areas or use it in water where there may be underwater structures, trees and rocks.
- 7. Be aware of others. Do any of them exhibit the seven signs of drowning?
  - 8. Do a head count. Is anyone missing? Keep track of all.

The Lake of the Water Safety Council wants everyone to enjoy the waterways of Missouri. Please be safe so you and your family can come back again
