WHAT TO HAVE ONBOARD

When preparing to go out on a vessel, there are a few things you need to check that are legally required to be on board. The Missouri State Highway Patrol, Water Patrol Division advises operators to make sure these items are handy.

PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICES

Under federal law, a wearable PFD is required for each person on board regardless of vessel length. Children under the age of 7 must wear a U.S. Coast Guard-approved PFD



at all times unless the child is confined to a totally enclosed area such as a houseboat or a day-cruiser.

NAVIGATION LIGHTS

The required navigation lights differ depending on the size and type of your vessel. You must display the required navigation lights between sunset and sunrise and during periods of restricted visibility.



FIRE EXTINGUISHER

All vessels (there are few restrictions) are required to have a Type B, U.S. Coast Guard-approved fire extinguisher on board in an accessible area. Check the charge level of your fire extinguishers regularly. Replace them immediately if they are not fully charged.

SOUND PRODUCING DEVICES

Vessels more than 16 feet but less than 40 feet in length are required to carry a whistle or horn to signal intentions or positions. Vessels that are 40 feet or more in length are required to carry a whistle or horn and a bell on board.



The Fishing Report

Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

he lake level was 659.5, generation of 900 cubic feet per second (CFS) to 6,000 CFS throughout the week for a level of 659.5 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 86 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 704.7 level.

To Note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on jigs along gravel shoals.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on drop shot worms, shaky head worms and Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms along points 20 to 25 feet deep or on topwater lures around wave breaks in the mornings. Crappie: Good on jigs around main lake docks 20 to 25 feet deep.

Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms in brush piles 15 feet deep. Crappie: Good trolling crankbaits in the coves. Catfish: Good drifting cut shad and skipjack herring.

Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged plastic worms, jigs and shaky head worms in shallow brush or 20 to 25 feet deep along main lake points. Crappie: Good shooting jigs under main lake docks. Catfish: Good drifting cut shad or sunfish along bluffs.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged or shaky head plastic worms and jigs 20 to 25 feet deep around brush. Crappie: Good on small jigs 10 to 20 feet deep over brush.

Niangua

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on plastic worms and jigs along main and secondary points or stickbaits around docks. Crappie: Fair trolling crankbaits along main lake docks. Catfish: Fair drifting cut shad.



Upper Osage

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged plastic worms and jigs along main and secondary points. Crappie: Fair on minnows 15 feet deep around docks. White bass: Fair on jigs, Roostertails and topwater lures along points in the evenings. Catfish: Good tight-lining cut shad off docks or on noodle lines with cut shad.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Clear. Hybrid white bass: Slow on topwater lures and spoons in the early mornings.

New park opens in Jeff City

eborah Cooper Park on Adrian's Island sounds like an idyllic place out of a children's book. The new park in Jefferson City, Missouri is partly planned and developed.

The entire complex is 32-acres, with 5 acres of activities including the Missouri Bicentennial Chessboard.

A chessboard was installed on the grounds by a female Eagle Scout that depicts the greatest moments in Missouri history. The granite installation was put in place in 2020 as directed by the World Chess Hall of Fame in St. Louis. Westphalia's own Dr. Jeanne Cairns Sinquefield is co-founder of that organization, but she also has some interesting roots related to our lake area. Dr. Singuefield is a Scout Leader and inventor at the Greater Council Scouts Camp Hohn in Laurie. The public display at Deborah Cooper Park is a permanent addition and a must see upon your visit. She suggested the addition while serving on Governor Mike Parson's Bicentennial council, to educate the children of Missouri on its history. 32 images were chosen to be engraved on the permanent life-size game board of Missouri's most significant contribution in relation to music, literature, agriculture, and sports. Personalities included on the board are President

Harry S. Truman, Dred Scott, and George Washington Carver. From Scout Troop 6 in Jefferson City, Andrew Dowden engraved the squares as part of his Eagle Scout project. He used an engraving tool from the Singuefield Innovation Lab at Camp Hohn, which Dr. Singuefield donated the money to build a few years ago. Maya Thomas, the scout that crafted the rest of the board as her Eagle Scout project, is from Kirksville. The benches were made by her from 200-year-old Missouri Oak wood. Dr. Sinquefield's legacy in chess in St. Louis led to the United States Congress declaring St. Louis as the chess capital of the nation in 2014. She was the perfect person to direct this scout project, along with all the design tools supplied by her to the Scout Reservation.

The former Adrian's Island was named

Deborah Cooper Park with the work of Govenor Parson and Jefferson City Mayor Carrie Tergin to build the Bicentennial Bridge that is there. How did Deborah Cooper come into all of this? She was a longtime supporter of development working for the Jefferson City Central Bancorp. Money was raised through her foundation after her death in 1986. The family foundation had a vision for this project to emerge coinciding with Missouri's Bicentennial. Union Pacific and The Delong Family are also monetary sponsors.

Public art is still under development there and the park is in the final stages of improvements.

One project that has neared completion is the Bicentennial Bridge, a 12-footwide walking and bicycle bridge that connects to the Missouri State Capitol

grounds, making the entire area a wonderful place for a day trip for the family. A short walk to the Capitol Rotunda offers learning opportunities for kids with visual displays of Missouri history located in the rotunda. It also offers a cool respite on a summer day of park exploration.

Where to eat

Hop on over to the closest place to eat from the park. The choices are all solid around the Capitol grounds. In Jefferson City, there are restaurants to impress, which some would call "old school" perhaps because of the political atmosphere. But that makes for a unique dining experience not available elsewhere. Madison's Café is just a short walk from the Bicentennial Bridge on Madison Street and exudes old Jefferson City elegance. The most impressive part of the menu is tableside service, which can be had when ordering the Chateaubriand for two, which one should call ahead to order, as it takes more time to prepare. A gorgeous beef tenderloin is cooked to perfection, then elaborately carved by servers at the table. It is a meal to wow guests with. Another historically significant hotel in the district sits atop the DoubleTree Hotel, always known as The Top of the Round. It is now named Sapphire's but carries on the excellent quality of dining with the most amazing view in Jefferson City. The standard by which many Jefferson Citians measure restaurants is the German dining at Das Stein Haus over on Southridge Drive. Helmut, the owner, is a Jefferson City legendary restaurateur, owning other former enterprises such as Das Haus of Europe. He is the consummate host, walking around tables and regaling them with stories. Chateaubriand Flambe tableside is a showstopper at Das Stein Haus. It also requires a 24-hour notice to order, like Madison's Café. There is a Duckling Flambe, and Steak and Lobster. These are the chef's specials which are presented as a big deal, so if you don't like attention, don't order them. But if you want to impress some relatives or guests, this is the place to go. There are three dessert choices that are also served tableside flambe if you wish to carry on the theme. Bananas Foster, a flambeed dessert of sugar and has always been consistently outstanding.

on't be surprised to see the Lake of the Ozarks on the big screen in the near future. Gina Goff, founder of Goff Productions, will begin filming at the Lake this fall for her film titled "At Niangua's End." The film is a continuation of events from the suspense drama short film with the same name.

"What really drew me into this project is that the short film was filmed in Missouri," Goff explained. "It sucked me in and I was blown away. The acting was so impressive."

The writers and creators of the short film will also have major roles in Goff's project. Chase Elliott will be directing and Bo Shore will be co-starring in this expanded film. The duo also co-wrote the script for the feature film.

Elliott and Shore are no strangers to the Lake. Elliott basically grew up at the Lake and

Shore's family used to live at the Lake as well. A major goal of the film, Goff said, is to show the Lake as it really is.

"At Niangua's End," Goff explained, is a story about two brothers who are navigating a life stacked against them. With a mother who revolves in and out of their lives, they begin to uncover the mysterious circumstances surrounding their father's death. As faith would have it, one brother ends up being the prime suspect in the killing of their father's murder.

"My film will answer the questions the short film left unanswered, while showing all aspects of the entire lake." Goff said. "The feature film will tell more about the brothers' lives but also include more of the upscale aspects of the Lake, such as the beautiful homes and big boats. We will include aerial footage from businesses on the water as well."

The principle photography, Goff explained, should take about four to five weeks to complete.

A native of Jefferson City, Goff received her Bachelor of Science Degree from Central Missouri State University. Through the years, both sets of grandparents had homes at the Lake and she spent an equal amount of time here. She's also owned various residences at the Lake herself. She worked in the legal field for 12 years prior to taking the leap to the film industry.

"I eventually moved to Los Angeles but continued working as a paralegal," she said. "I started seeing all the film production going on and I've always loved good storytelling, but I didn't know if there was a place for me in the business."

Goff saw an ad for a two-week boot-camp through the American Film Institute. She attended, found a role in the business that suited her, and the rest is history. She has taken numerous producing courses at the American Film Institute and is a member of Film Independent. She is also currently on the Digital Media Advisory Board for Central Missouri State University.

Goff's films have earned her dozens of prestigious worldwide awards and

recognition over the years. Two years ago, she released the film "Senior Moment" starring William Shatner, Jean Smart and Christopher Lloyd. Because California was shut down due to the pandemic, the premiere took place in Jefferson City. The event exceeded Goff's expectations.

"I felt like a superstar," she explained. "I did not expect the large turnout and past teachers and such that attended. It was more gratifying than any red-carpet event in Los Angeles."

Goff just wrapped-up production on a film titled "The Movers" with Jena Malone, Terrence Howard, Christopher Lloyd and Tom Everett Scott. Currently in post-production editing, the film will be hitting theaters later this year.

One of the most rewarding aspects of her career, Goff said, is when she takes a chance on a script that turns out to be amazing.

"I can read 100-200 scripts and not be grabbed or fall in love with the story," she said. Another positive aspect is watching the actors and seeing the project all come together.

As an independent film producer, a challenge she said is finding investors for each project and putting the financing together. "From there it's easy for me," she said. She prides herself on being a "hands on" producer and is involved in every phase of each project. This includes finding a great script, selecting directing, acting and production crew, selecting a sales agency, negotiating distribution terms and more.

The full cast is not yet defined for the film and Goff is seeking Missouri-born talent for as many roles as possible. This includes actors, crew members and investors.

"I come back to the Lake and feel like I never left," Goff said. "I might just stay and make movies in Missouri."

Run for the Fallen remembers 9/11

Sept. 9 | Camdenton Memorial Lake Regional Airport



he Camdenton Area Chamber of Commerce will host the annual Lake of the Ozarks Walk/Run for the Fallen event Saturday, Sept. 9, at the Camdenton Memorial Lake Regional Airport, 20 Airport Drive.

The chamber will partner with the Truman VA Hospital once again for this year's event.

Opening ceremonies are at 9 a.m. in Hangar D with the walk/run at 10 a.m.

Both events will be free for spectators to attend; however, vehicle owners wanting to participate in the cruise-in will be asked to pay a \$10 participation fee to which will be donated to the Camdenton Area Chamber of Commerce to support the expenses incurred for the 2024 Lake of the Ozarks Air Show.



8 tips to make for a fun day at the water park

hen summertime temperatures are hot and climbing, people look for ways to cool off. Trips to the beach or a pool often top the list of ideas, but water parks also make for great places to spend a hot summer day.

Water parks may be stand-alone facilities in town or components of larger amusement parks. They often feature a combination of wading pools, slides, lazy rivers, and splash zones to cater to visitors of all ages. Water parks can be great family fun for those who do their homework and prepare for visits accordingly. Certain tips can make the experience that much more enjoyable.

- 1. Pack light. Belongings can be tricky when it comes to water parks because most items cannot get wet. Leaving them beside rides also leaves you vulnerable to theft. Bring only the essentials and plan to stash car keys, mobile phones and minimal cash in lockers. Lockers in many modern facilities are paid for with your credit card and work by entering a self-generated code. This way there are no keys or locks to worry about.
- 2. Bring three bags. Bring a backpack or a tote bag that is filled with a change of clothes. Unless you dry off for the last hour by walking around the park, you likely will not want to get in your vehicle in your swimsuit. Leave the clothes in the aforementioned locker. Stash a plastic shopping bag or garbage bag inside the backpack, as it can hold wet swimsuits and other damp items after you've changed. Bring a mesh or breathable shoulder bag that can hold a few essentials, like towels and water bottles. The mesh will enable air flow so that you don't end up with a sopping, mildew-riddled towel by the end of the day.
- 3. Wear comfortable swim gear. It's hard to get out of the sun at a water park, so covering up is key. A rash guard or swim shirt can be paired with swim trunks or one- or two-piece swimsuits. Avoid any swimsuits that have flimsy straps, as they're more likely to come undone while crashing through waves or during high speed water slide excursions.
- 4. Plan locker trips strategically. Aim to visit your locker at least two or three times if you're spending a full day at the water park. This gives you chances to reapply sunscreen (which you should always wear at the park) and grab a few dollars for snacks and beverages. Remember to stay hydrated while out in the sun, even if you are in the water most of the time.
- 5. Utilize water shoes. Water park pavement can get hot and slippery. Water shoes are ideal so that you do not injure your feet. Many rides prohibit flip flops, but secured water shoes are allowed.
- 6. Arrive early. Try to get to the water park shortly after it opens. Crowds will be sizable on hot days. You don't want to waste all of your time waiting in line for rides. Plus, the earlier in the day you arrive, the less steamy and the greater chance you will find parking near the entrance.
- 7. If budget allows, rent a cabana. Some parks rent cabanas. A cabana can be a family's home base and a place to cool off and relax. For an extra cost, some cabanas come with food service.
- 8. Have extra adults on hand. When the kids outnumber the adults, it can be tricky keeping eyes on everyone, especially in larger attractions like wave pools. Plus, there's bound to be some kids who are more adventurous than others. An extra adult or two can wait with children who do not want to go on particular slides or other rides.

Water parks are entertaining ways to cool off on hot days. Following certain tips can make visits even more fun.

Were to go at the Lake


