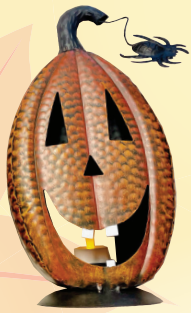

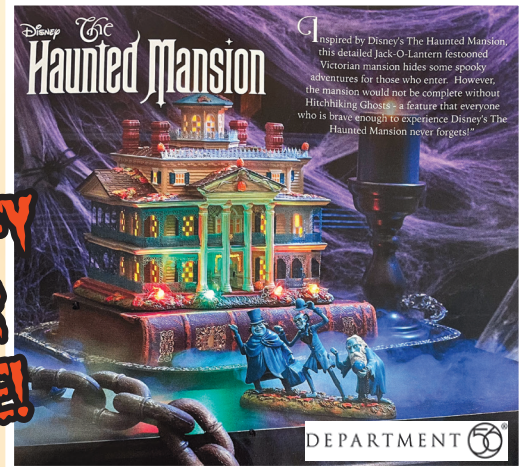

DAY TRIP

A stop on the way to the Lake

Small town of Clinton offers food, wine and shops.

Many folks on the west side of Lake of the Ozarks consider the city of Clinton to be a halfway mark on a backroads journey to and from Kansas City.

Indeed, Clinton, with a population of 8792, classifies this destination as the midpoint at 75 miles from Lake of the Ozarks and 77 miles to Kansas City. The newest draw that makes Clinton worth a day trip is the Primitive Olde Crow Winery and Mercantile. After recently visiting a Fall Junk Fest at Primitive Olde Crow and sampling the pizza, I discovered the pizza alone demands a visit. Primitive Olde Crow and Winery is located at 32 SE Hwy AA, just a short distance from Truman Lake in Warsaw.

A newly-built mercantile store has lined the highway with old-fashioned merchandise signs that let travelers know what wonders that the store sells and what they are missing once they have passed it. Those boats hauling to Truman Dam make a quick stop for some spectacular sundries, or behind the winery for some great food and drink. Open daily at 11 a.m., the mercantile throws back to a vintage era, with rusty old trucks used as displays for the old fashioned, family style snacks, homemade fudge, candles, soaps, and other favorite country themed collectibles.

Located behind the mercantile are the beautiful grounds of the Primitive Olde Crow and Winery. As one enters the winery, the aroma of the brick oven pizza hits way before you enter the restaurant. The crust is chewy and crisp on any pizza that comes out of that beautiful oven, and toppings are some out of the ordinary. Spinach, sausage, bacon, with cubed mozzarella was our choice. Next time it will be artichoke hearts, asiago, and roasted red peppers, for sure. Before leaving, check out the retail section that offers hand-dipped ice cream and fudge.

Clinton is the county seat of Henry County. The town is named after New York Governor Dewitt Clinton as a proponent of the Erie Canal. The first train arrived in Clinton in 1870 making the town's population increase more than four times over the course of a decade. There are 85 buildings in the courthouse square on the National Register of Historic Places, including the well-maintained courthouse dating from 1893. The Clinton Square Historic District is made up of buildings primarily built between 1885 and 1950 and properties are mixed commercial and residential use.

The historic courthouse square is home to many

festivals and car shows. One festival that sends colors flying is Olde Glory Days over the Independence Day weekend.

A full carnival of rides fills the square, and more midway and food stands than the area can accommodate. Old Settler's Days is another popular event. Held in September there is traditional Ozarks music, handicrafts, and foods.

Clinton is the Western terminus of the Katy Trail, with many horse stables in the area offering trail fans a unique way to experience the abandoned rail line now administered by the Missouri State Parks system. There is an active railway still functioning between Clinton and Nevada.

The Fishing Report

Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

The lake level was 659.1, generation of 2,400 cubic feet per second (CFS) throughout the week for a level of 659.3 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 83 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 704.7 level.

To Note

The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 38-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 38-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on topwater lures, Ned rigs and plastic craws along rock banks. Catfish: Good on shad and skipjack herring.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on wacky rigged plastic worms around shad schools in the backs of coves or topwater lures and wacky rigged stick worms around wave breaks. Crappie: Slow on jigs and minnows around dock lights at night.

Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms in brush piles 15 feet deep. Crappie: Fair trolling crankbaits and shooting jigs under docks on the main lake. Catfish: Excellent on cut shad or skipjack herring.

Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on plastic worms and jigs in brush on the main lake and on topwater lures, squarebill crankbaits and jigs around docks from midway to the backs of coves. Crappie: Good shooting jigs under main channel docks.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on jigs and plastic worms 12 to 15 feet deep in brush piles. Crappie: Fair on jigs around shad schools and in brush piles 15 feet deep.



Niangua

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on jigs, bladed jigs, shaky head worms and crankbaits along main and secondary points. Crappie: Slow on minnows around condo docks or trolling crankbaits on the main channel. Catfish: Slow on stink baits and prepared baits.

Upper Osage

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow flipping jigs to shallow docks in the creeks. Crappie: Slow on minnows 8 to 10 feet deep around docks. White bass: Fair on Roostertails and crankbaits around shad schools. Catfish: Good on cut shad.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Clear. Fishing is slow for all species.

Changes for deer season

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds deer hunters of regulation changes for the upcoming 2023-2024 deer-hunting season. The changes include a new firearms early antlerless portion, a new firearms CWD portion, changes to firearms antlerless permit numbers, and the addition of 14 new counties to the MDC CWD Management Zone.

"The changes to deer hunting regulations for the 2023-2024 deer season were motivated by increasing deer numbers throughout much of Missouri and in response to changes in the distribution of chronic wasting disease (CWD) in the state," said MDC Cervid Program Supervisor Jason Isabelle. "With a growing deer population in most Missouri counties, we're increasing opportunities for hunters to harvest deer both within and outside of the CWD Management Zone this year."

Archery Deer and Turkey Hunting

New Firearms Early Antlerless Portion Oct. 6-8

MDC will offer a new firearms early antlerless portion Oct. 6-8 in the 100 counties open for the firearms late antlerless portion Dec. 2-10. Reynolds County will now be open during the antlerless portions.

"With deer numbers being at desired levels in most counties but continuing to increase, additional antlerless harvest is needed to stabilize the deer population," said Isabelle. "This new season portion will help increase antlerless deer harvest prior to the November portion, when many hunters focus on harvesting bucks."

Isabelle noted that timing of the early antlerless portion was chosen to provide hunting opportunity when weather conditions are usually favorable and to minimize conflicts with archery hunters, who usually hunt most in late October and early November.

New Firearms CWD Portion Nov. 22-26

MDC will offer a CWD portion of firearms deer season Nov. 22-26 in CWD Management Zone counties during the 2023-2024 deer season.

According to MDC, hunters will be able to use any unfilled firearms deer hunting permits during the CWD portion and must abide by the statewide limit of one antlered deer during the firearms deer season, all portions combined. Hunters must also abide by county-specific firearms antlerless permit numbers.

"Because higher deer densities can increase the rate of CWD spread, additional deer harvest in the CWD Management Zone is needed to prevent further increases in deer numbers and help minimize the spread of the disease," said Isabelle.

Isabelle noted that the CWD portion is timed to occur during the tail end of the primary rut, when deer movement is typically good and hunter interest remains high. CWD testing is not required during the CWD portion.

Changes to Firearms Antlerless Permit Numbers

MDC has also increased the number of firearms antlerless permits hunters can fill in most counties, including allowing hunters to fill a firearms antlerless permit in Butler, Carter, Scott, and Wayne counties. Hunters in Bollinger County will be able to fill two firearms antlerless permits beginning this year. Qualifying landowners in Reynolds County may now receive two Resident Landowner Firearms Antlerless Deer Hunting Permits. MDC has also increased the number of firearms antlerless permits from two to four in 85 counties.

"The liberalization of antlerless harvest opportunities will help slow population growth and keep the deer population at desired levels," said Isabelle.

He also noted that the additional firearms antlerless permits will help hunters and landowners to meet their deer management goals in areas where more antlerless harvest is needed.

Expansion of the CWD Management Zone

MDC has included 14 new counties as part of the CWD Management Zone this year: Bollinger, Caldwell, Carroll, Clay, Clinton, Dallas, Grundy, Jasper, Livingston, Madison, Montgomery, Pemiscot, Ray, and Schuyler.

As with all counties in the CWD Management Zone, grain, salt products, minerals, and other consumable products used to attract deer are prohibited year-round. Hunters must also follow carcass transportation regulations. The antler-point restriction has also been removed from Caldwell, Carroll, Clinton, Grundy, Livingston, Montgomery, Ray, and Schuyler counties.

Hunters who harvest deer in select CWD Management Zone counties during Nov. 11-12 must take the deer (or its head) on the day of harvest to a mandatory CWD sampling station.

Q&A with the golf pro



Should I be tracking my golf statistics to improve, and which ones should I track?

Jeremy R., Osage Beach

The easy answer is yes! If you want to improve your scores, you need to know where you are deficient. Three categories to look at are simple to track.

The average golfer (not tour players) have 35 putts per round, hit 48 percent of fairways off the tee and hit 29 percent of greens in regulation. Tour players rank significantly higher in putting and greens in regulation.

Scrambling percentage

is also something to look at and calculate. Take how many greens you miss in regulation and count how many times you can get the ball onto the green and one putt. Between 35 to 50 percent of all shots played are with the putter, so that should give you a great starting point. The average player has 35 putts while the best tour players average between 26 and 27. Tour players are also putting on greens that most of us could not putt on a regular basis from any distance. If you could get close to 30 putts on average you can see how quickly you could improve

your score by working around the green.

There are many apps out there that can help track your statistics and begin to pinpoint where to focus your attention. Good luck and I think you will be surprised at your own statistics. I know I was.

Do you feel the Lake area can support some non-traditional golf activities such as a TopGolf facility?

Andrea G., Stover

Looking at the statistics of how many people participated in non-traditional golf activities since 2020 I

think the Lake is ready to embrace this part of the game. I believe in the next three to five years there will be something at the Lake. It may not be a full scale TopGolf venue but I could see a facility installing a Top Tracer Range or a PopStroke miniature golf being installed.

PopStroke is very similar to TopGolf, with food and beverage offerings around a full scale miniature golf course geared toward adults. As the Lake continues to add entertainment activities, I think it is only a matter of time that these types of golf entertainment venues will be here.

Best ways to view fall colors

Take a drive around the Lake by boat or car for a beautiful display of fall foliage.

When to view fall colors

After a hot and humid summer, most are welcoming the fall season with open arms. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) encourages people to enjoy fall foliage through camping, hiking, driving tours, or even floating. To help, MDC offers weekly online fall color updates from agency foresters all over the state at mdc.mo.gov/fallcolor.

"Our weekly fall color updates are a great resource for the public," said MDC Forestry Field Programs Supervisor Russell Hinnah. "Foresters begin posting reports in

mid-September that show users where trees are beginning to turn and even suggest great places to see changing leaves."

Hinnah noted the drought experienced over the summer could affect this year's color.

"The dry conditions we saw this summer could cause trees to lose their leaves early or begin changing colors earlier than normal," he said. "This may affect the amount of fall color we see later in the season."

The chilly evenings we see in the fall season are critical for leaves to change color.

"Sugars produced by photosynthesis are trapped inside leaves by the cool autumn nights," Hinnah explained. "Those sugars are the building blocks for the rich red, yellow, orange, and purple pigments. Chilly nights cause the breakdown of green pigments, allowing the fall colors to show through."

Missouri trees first begin changing color in the northern part of the state, then move southward. Sassafras, sumac, and Virginia creeper are some of the earliest to change in mid-September. In late September, black gum, bittersweet, and dogwood are turning. The peak of fall color usually hits around mid-October.

"Trees like maple, ash, oak, and hickory are at the peak of their fall display by the middle of October," Hinnah noted. "Normally by the end of the month, colors are fading and leaves are falling."

Missouri's fall color can be enjoyed from almost anywhere. For spectacular vistas, choose routes along rivers with views of forested bluffs, and along ridges with sweeping scenes of forested landscapes.

"MDC conservation areas or Missouri state parks are wonderful places to take in the fall color," suggested Hinnah.

And fall color isn't just limited to trees. Prairies and roadsides display beautiful shades of gold, purple, olive, and auburn with autumn wildflowers, shrubs, and grasses. In cities and towns, enjoy places with mature trees such as older neighborhoods, parks, and even cemeteries.

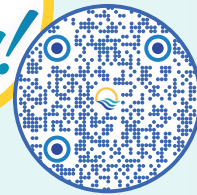

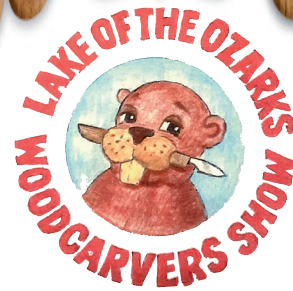

Autumn boating tips

7 ways to stay safe on the water while leaf-peeping

Autumn's arrival doesn't mean the boating and fishing season has to come to an end. Quite the contrary! Fall is a great time to go boating.

Most anglers will tell you that some of the year's best fishing occurs in the fall, and boaters agree that leaf-peeping while slowly cruising through calm, mirror-like waters takes on an almost ethereal quality.

However, the arrival of fall's shorter days and colder temperatures does require boaters to take some extra precautions in order to ensure a safe and enjoyable outing for all. With this in mind, safety should always be a top priority when boating.

Here are some safety precautions to take when boating this fall:

1. Update your charts. Local aids to navigation like channel markers and buoys placed by local authorities may be pulled as early as October in some areas. With autumn's shorter days, you may wind up cruising home after

dark, making even familiar landmarks hard to spot. Make sure your charts - electronic and paper - are up to date so you can use them to navigate instead of visual aids.

2. Check navigational lights and emergency lights. Ensure that your boat's navigation lights are in working order and your emergency lights are in working order. Carry a couple of waterproof flashlights on board to help you unload passengers and gear after dark. Be sure to stock spare batteries!

3. Make sure your phone is charged. During the fall, the waterways are less crowded. While this is peaceful, it also means that if you run into a problem, you might not see another boater for awhile.

4. Make a float plan. This is a plan that lets others know when you are going out, where you are going, who is going with you, and when you plan to return. A float plan will enable others to have the knowledge of where to start looking for you in case of an emergency.

5. Gas up before you go. With fewer boats on the water some fuel docks may close early during the fall season. Don't assume you can fill up at your destination for the return trip home.

6. Wear a life jacket. In the autumn as water temperatures start to fall, boaters who accidentally fall overboard run an increased risk of hypothermia. While children in Missouri under the age of 7 must wear a life jacket when the boat is underway by law, it's a good idea for adults to wear them too — especially at night.

7. Keep an eye on the weather. Autumn storms can approach swiftly and often seem more menacing than summer rain showers.

Remember, safety should always be a top priority when boating. Enjoy your time on the water!

How to handle a lengthy renovation

The global pandemic reignited people's passions for home renovations, as they directed dollars that would normally have been spent elsewhere into the places where they were now spending the most time — their homes. According to the 10th annual Houzz & Home survey of more than 70,000 respondents in the United States, higher-budget projects cost around \$85,000 or more in 2020, compared with \$80,000 in the two years prior. Kitchen projects were the most popular among renovating homeowners.

Even though many COVID-19-related restrictions have lifted and life has largely returned to regular programming, renovations remain a popular investment. Homeowners embarking on home renovation projects understand that a certain measure of upheaval is to be expected, but some may not fully anticipate the impact that renovations have on daily life. The following are some tips for making it through a lengthy renovation.

- Discuss the timeline with contractors. It may be easier to make a plan for how much life will be disrupted if you have an idea of how long the renovation will be (if everything goes according to plan). Sit down with contractors and have them spell out the minutiae of the project so you'll be able to anticipate what's going on day-to-day.
- Start at the right time. Some contractors may say they can fit your project into their schedules in between other jobs. While this may seem convenient and timely, your work may be put on hold if there are delays with the other job or jobs. Instead, it may be better to hold off until the contractors can devote the bulk of their attention to your renovation.
- Recreate commonly used spaces elsewhere. A kitchen or a bathroom remodel often requires giving up spaces that are used throughout a typical day. Unless you have a spare full bathroom or kitchen, you'll need to make due. Set a microwave, tabletop electric burner and a coffee pot on a folding table in the garage or utility room. Rent or purchase a small refrigerator where you can store a few necessities. Ask your contractor to set up a makeshift outdoor shower so you have a place to get clean when the bathroom is under construction.
- Pack up and cover. Remodeling one room may cause a trickle down effect on other areas. Dust from drywall sanding can infiltrate many rooms in the home. Pack and label boxes with items not immediately needed and store them in another area. Cover most things so a film of dust won't form on them.
- Adjust your schedule. Sleeping in will be a thing of the past for the duration of the renovation, as may be working from a home office. Try to get out of the work zone as much as possible for new scenery and respites from the noises and smells.
- Ease up on cleaning standards. It's challenging to keep a home clean during a renovation. Relax standards and expect a mess for some time. Explain to guests what they'll find if they drop by.

Renovations can disrupt life, but often are well worth the sacrifices homeowners must make to see them through to completion.

Insulation and home efficiency

Insulation can go a long way toward making a home more comfortable. Insulation reduces the transfer of heat from indoors and outdoors so homes stay more comfortable in both the winter and summer. Insulation also can block exterior noise. A properly insulated home is a must, particularly in the wake of rising energy costs. Insulation will help a home be more energy efficient.

Insulation is easily taken for granted. The following are some facts about insulation and home efficiency that illustrate how much homeowners can benefit from upgrading their insulation.

- Insulation is made from a variety of materials, including fiberglass, wool, cellulose, and spray foam.

- Unless damaged, insulation lasts for the life of the building. Some settling of insulation may occur, particularly with loose-fill type insulation, and gaps can be filled in.

- During the Middle Ages, walls of homes were stuffed with straw and mud to help keep out the cold. It is one of the first documented types of insulation.

- According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, insulation saves more than 600 times more energy each year than compact fluorescent lights, Energy Star Appliances, and Energy Star windows combined.

- For every Btu consumed in the production of insulation each year, 12 Btus are saved by the use of insulation, says A+ Insulation of Kansas City.

- An insulating material's resistance to heat flow is measured in terms of its thermal resistance, or R-value. The higher the R-value, the greater the insulating effectiveness. An insulation contractor can let a homeowner know how much insulation and what R-value is recommended for his or her climate.

- Manufacturers continue to experiment with insulation materials. Environmentally friendly options include recycled cotton denim, paper or plant cellulose, and sheep's wool.

- Large pieces of insulation are called batts. Traditionally they are made from pink fiberglass, which is extremely fine woven glass. It's important to realize fiberglass insulation can release small particles or fibers in the air when disturbed, so respiratory protection and gloves should be used when handling to reduce risk of irritation.

Insulation is a key investment in home comfort and efficiency.

Krull's vision became a reality when he opened The Great American Campground and Dive Bar on the Lake's west side. Don't be deceived by the name. It's a friendly, clean and welcoming environment, and the food is just as impressive.

The campground has 38 full hookup sites with 10 of those being available long-term, year-round. There are also primitive tent camping sites. By the spring of 2024, six cabins and two tree houses will be available for daily rentals.

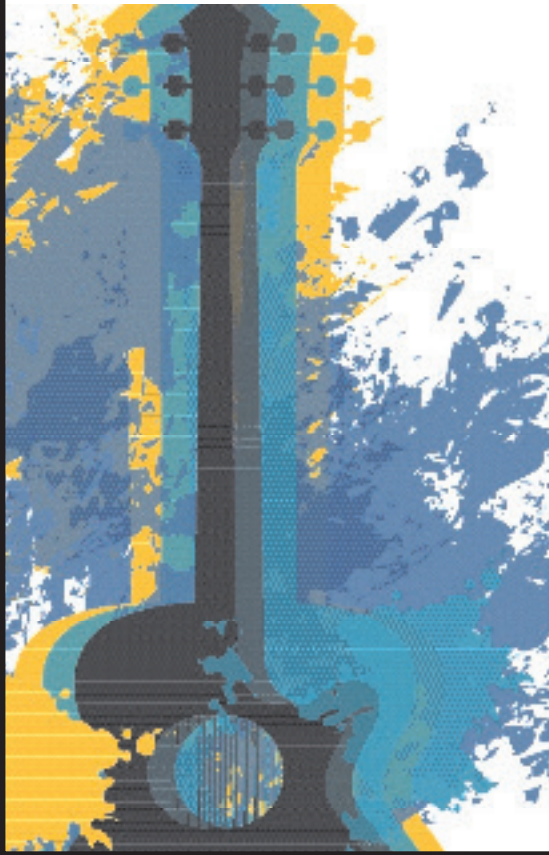

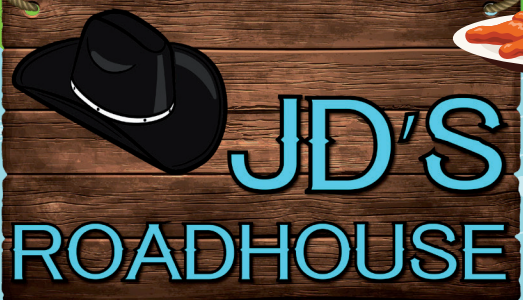
