The Fishing Report

Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

he lake level was 656.6, generation of 1,000 CFS (cubic feet per second) through the middle of the week increasing to 12,000 CFS at the end of the week for a level of 657.5 by the weekend. Surface

temperature at Bagnell Dam was 42 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 708.0 level.

To Note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Tournament Results

Brad Jelinek and Brock Reinkemeyer won the Fitz Fishing & Tackle Winter Bass Challenge tournament last Saturday with five bass weighing 22.59 pounds.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on small swimbaits and suspending stickbaits along steep rocky banks. Crappie: Good on small swimbaits around current breaks.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on jigs, suspending stickbaits and Alabama rigs around shad schools 20 to 25 feet deep in the middle of coves or on steep banks and secondary points. Crappie: Fair on jigs and suspending jerkbaits in brush 15 to 20 feet deep.

Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Upper Gravois around Gravois Mills access area and Indian Creek are frozen but thawing. Black bass: Good on suspending jerkbaits 6 to 10 feet deep along steep rock banks. Crappie good on suspending stickbaits over brush piles 12 feet deep and shooting jigs under main channel docks.

Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Stained. Linn Creek and some other creeks and coves are frozen. Black bass: Good on Alabama rigs suspending jerkbaits and football jigs along channel banks and secondary points.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Stained. Some coves are frozen but thawing. Black bass: Fair on suspending stickbaits and Alabama rigs in the middle of coves and secondary points 20 to 25 feet deep. Crappie: Fair on jigs for fish suspended 8 feet deep over brush at depths of 15 to 20

Niangua

feet.

Water clarity: Clear on the lower end and stained on the upper end. Coves are frozen above the Larry Gale access. Little Niangua is frozen but starting to thaw. Crappie: Good on jigs along points and bluffs with brush 10 to 20 feet deep.

Upper Osage

Water clarity: Stained. Main channel and coves are frozen but thawing. Large ice chunks on the main channel could be navigation hazards.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Clear. Dead water channel and spillway are frozen.

BOATING

Become a safe boater

ou bought a boat, wave runner and you are going to sail the open waters, party with your homies, show off your new toy, suns out guns out.

But driving a boat is just lake a car, right? Do I really need to have boater education? What difference does it make?

WHAT IS BOATER EDUCATION?

Most states require that boaters complete an official and certified boater education course. The Boater Education Card (sometimes called a "boater's license") is proof that you have successfully completed your state's official and approved boating safety course.

WHY IS BOATER EDUCATION IMPORTANT?

Boating safety education is important because it helps reduce personal injury and property damage associated with the use of recreational boats. Boaters can keep themselves and their crew safe by learning about responsible boat operation, etiquette and the rules of the waterways.

Where boating instruction was known, 77 percent of deaths occurred on vessels where the operator had not received boating safety instruction. The Coast Guard recommends that all boaters take a boating safety course that meets the National Boating Education Standards prior to getting out on the water.

Thousands of boat crashes occur each year, and although a number of factors contribute, most collisions share similar characteristics and many may have been avoidable if the driver had taken additional precautions.

Without a doubt, the most common causes of boating accidents include not wearing a personal flotation device (PFD)/lifejacket, falling overboard, capsizing/collisions and operating a vessel while impaired by alcohol and/or drugs.

Boating Education requirements varies from state-tostate. Missouri's Boater Education Law went into effect

Jan. 1, 2005. The law states that any person born after Jan. 1, 1984, must successfully pass a Missouri Boater Education class/test before operating any motorized vessel on the waters of the state.

several insurance companies may offer a discount on your premium. There is actually received two advantages. The first with your insurance company and the second, but not least, you and your family became better and safer boaters.

The most-asked question is: is my boating education card good in every state? Good news! If you've successfully completed an official boating safety course such as boat-ed or ilearntoboat, your boater education card is welcome in every state that requires mandatory boater education.

The slogan, "Safe Boating is no Accident," encourages every boat skipper to become involved with the safe boating process by enrolling in one of these classes, but the process does not stop there. Safe boating is a family affair and together the learning process can not only provide the entire crew with valuable information, but become a fun learning experience for all.

Now, most boating education courses are in a classroom and/or behind a computer. This is good for the basis and learning the regulations/rules of the road. But, unless you put your book learning to real world use, actual on-water experience is the best enforcement of what you learned.

Suggestion is to locate a United States Coast Guard credentialed Captain, have them go out on your boat and explain what you need to have on board including, but not limited to, learning how to leave a dock, slip and how to dock your boat. Learn the difference in handling an outboard versus an inboard, how to perform close guarter turns and how to station a boat.

With classroom education and on-water time, your boating confidence and skill will pay off in a positive and fun boating experience.

Remember boating accidents happen because of bad choices and lack of knowledge.

Infamous public courses

CHAMPIONSHIP COURSES EVERY GOLFER SHOULD PLAY


ave you ever wanted to play a golf course that has hosted a major golf championship but didn't think you could? Many of these facilities are strictly private, however, there are more than 30 around the world open to the public and waiting your arrival.

In the United States there are 18 of these championship courses, some within a day's drive of Lake of the Ozarks. Many have been around for a long time while others have been built recently and have hosted majors in the last decade. I have had the privilege to play three of these treasures: the Straits Course at Whistling Straits in Kohler, Wis., the Champions Course at PGA National in Palm Beach Gardens, Fla. and the Donald Ross Course in French Lick, Ind.

Let's take a deep dive into some of these gems.

First on my bucket list is the Old Course in St. Andrews, Scotland. The home of golf is most definitely a must-play for any avid player and historian of the game. Since 1873 the Old Course has hosted the Open Championship 30 times, with the most recent being in 2022. To play the ancient links would be a thrill and the memories would certainly last a lifetime. If you do plan the trip I would look at the other links venues on the R&A's Open Championship list of courses as they are all open to the public. You could play gems such as Muirfield Golf Club in Gullane, Scotland; Royal Troon Golf Club in Troon, Scotland (which is hosting the 2024 Open Championship); or the Royal Birkdale in South Port. I would play as many as I could. It would be a trip of a lifetime.

Closer to home, a great midwestern trip is the Keller Golf course in Maplewood, Minn. Keller hosted the 1932 and 1954 PGA Championships and the PGA tours St. Paul Open from 1930 to 1968. Another stop, this one within five hours of the Lake, is Kohler, Wis. and the Straits Course. This venue has spectacular views of Lake Michigan as you and your caddy walk the majestic links. Host site of the 2004, 2010 and 2015 PGA Championships, this course is infamous for the 2010 incident where Dustin Johnson was penalized on the 18th hole for grounding his club in a bunker to miss out on a playoff. If you ask nicely, the caddy will show you which bunker it was, as there are roughly 1,000 of them on the course. If three PGA Championships were not enough, the 2021 Ryder Cup was also contested here.

An hour from the Straits is Erin Hills Golf Course in Erin, Wis. Brooks Koepka won the 2017 U.S. Open on this Irish-inspired treeless site.


The last stop in the midwest is French Lick, Ind. to the Donald Ross Course. This grand old course was built in 1917 and hosted the 1924 PGA Championship where Ben Hogan took the title. A \$5 million renovation project in 2005 brought the course back to its original layout and is definitely a must-play when you're in the area. I certainly enjoyed myself a few years back as I walked and played where some of the greats of the past had played.

If traveling to the East Coast, you could spend two weeks along the eastern seaboard playing some classic courses that have all hosted championships. From New Jersey to South Carolina, there are nine courses making this another great golf adventure if you're up to it. Some of the highlights are the Ocean Course at Kiawah Island, S.C. (site of the 1991 Ryder Cup and 2012 and 2021 PGA Championships) and Pinehurst No. 2 in Pinehurst, N.C. It hosted the 1936 PGA Championship and the 1999, 2005 and 2014 U.S. Opens. The last of Missouri's own Payne Stewart's Major Championships was won here at the 1999 U.S. Open. New York and Pennsylvania each have two venues on the list with Bethpage Black in Farmington, N.Y. at the top of the list. It hosted the 2019 PGA Championship, and the 2002 and 2009 U.S. Opens where Tiger Woods took home the crown in 2002.

No list of courses you can play would be complete without mentioning the Pebble Beach Golf Links in California, host site of six U.S. opens and one PGA Championship. Some of the greats of the game including Jack Nicklaus, Tom Watson and Tiger Woods have all won U.S. Opens at Pebble. I had the opportunity to attend the 2019 U.S. Open and the views were unbelievable. It is definably in the top three of courses I have yet to play. The only other California Championship venue you can play is the South Course at Torey Pines in La Jolla which hosted the 2008 U.S. Open won by Tiger Woods.

There are 13 different states with facilities that have hosted men's major championship golf where you can book a tee time. No state has more than two such facilities where eight states only have one course. They are scattered throughout the country so wherever you find yourself there will probably be a course nearby. Some other U.S. courses are Chambers Bay in Tacoma, Wash.; The Bay and Pines courses at the Seaview Resort in Atlantic City, N.J.; Championship Course in Tanglewood Park, N.C.; The Red Course at Eisenhower Park in Long Island, N.Y.; and Cedar Crest in Dallas, Texas.

Going to every major league park or NFL stadium is impressive, but playing each of these 32 courses would be epic!





The brainchild of seasoned local chef Thomas Robinett, this unique spot dishes up comfort food and tasty creations.

he Lake area has gained a new place to gather and enjoy excellent fare. Table 33 is a dream come true for Thomas Robinett, who has been honing his skills as a chef at some of the most storied restaurants around the Lake, including JB Hook's, Ruthie D's, Old Kinderhook and Camden on the Lake. "As a teenager, I worked in the fast-food industry until I was 18 and got my first real kitchen job," he explained. "I started at JB Hook's as a dishwasher and moved up very quickly to cook, sous chef and eventually chef. While I was at JB Hook's, I reached a ceiling of things I could learn and was feeling complacent. I actually thought of switching careers, then one July night we were extremely busy, more than normal and it was very challenging. "Becoming a CEC was a big accomplishment for me and helped pave the way for my career."

Robinett took a sous chef position at Old Kinderhook just as the hotel was being built. It was not long before he was promoted to Executive Chef.

"I worked there for five years and had some of my most proud chef moments and proposed to my wife, Shelley, there," he said.

He left Old Kinderhook to take a position at Camden on the Lake Re-






