



The Fishing Report

Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

he lake level was 656.6, generation of 700 CFS (cubic feet per second) throughout the week for a level of 656.6 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 54 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 705.5 level.

To Note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Tournament Results

Roger Cook and Corey Cook won the Bass World Sports tournament last Sunday with five bass weighing 17.42 pounds.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Ned rigs, tube baits and crankbaits along rock banks.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Poor on jigs, crankbaits and jerkbaits on secondary points and in main lake pockets. Crappie: Good on jigs and jerkbaits around main lake docks.

Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on jerkbaits, jigs, crankbaits and Alabama rigs along points or steep channel banks in creeks. Crappie: Good on jigs and jerkbaits around condo docks. White bass and hybrid white bass: Good on small swimbaits, Roostertails, jerkbaits, jigs and Alabama rigs along windy points and backs of coves.

Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Slow on jerkbaits, crankbaits and jigs along steep banks and rock transition banks in coves. Crappie: Good shooting jigs under main lake docks.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on jerkbaits, jigs, crankbaits and Alabama rigs along points or steep channel banks in creeks. Crappie: Slow shooting jigs under main lake docks or on jig-and-bobber setups over brush 10 feet deep. White bass: Good on jigs in the backs of wind-blown pockets.



Niangua

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on jerkbaits and Ned rigs along channel swings and bluff points. Crappie: Fair on jigs around condo docks and brush 8 to 20 feet deep. White bass: Fair on crankbaits along windy banks.

Upper Osage

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Good on jigs, jerk-baits and crankbaits along channel banks in creeks. Crappie: Good on jigs and jerkbaits 5 to 7 feet deep around docks and brush. White bass: Good on jerkbaits along windy banks in creeks. Catfish: Fair on jug lines baited with cut shad in the middle of the creek channels.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Clear. Crappie: Fair on jigs and minnows in the dead water channel. White bass: Fair on jigs. Walleye: Good on jigs along the rock riprap. Catfish: Fair on cut shad.

BOATING

Become a safe boater

it the boating season and fun on the water time is here.

In the fall, you most likely winterized your boat and covered it up, made some mental notes to purchase that new fish finder or get the bottom paint

pring is around the corner and before you know

Unfortunately, there are several items on your boat that will be needed that most people ignore or take for granted. As the lake levels are down and the weather is changing, this is a good time to check the four most overlooked items that all boaters have.

done and other boating maintenance must-do's.

NAVIGATION LIGHTS

Check to make sure your port, starboard and stern/ anchor lights are operating, as well as the swim platform courtesy lights if so equipped. This is also a good time to switch from incandescent lights to LED.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

Check your fire extinguishers. Make sure the dial is in the green showing that the extinguisher is full, check the hose and nozzle for damage and make sure they are easily accessible. Also check to make sure they are in compliance with the new United States Coast Guard regulations.

April 20, 2022, new U.S. Coast Guard regulations change extinguisher expiration dates and the minimum classification of fire extinguishers carried aboard newer boats went into effect.

The new regulation puts a 12-year expiration on all disposable (non-rechargeable) fire extinguishers. A boater should look for the manufacture date on the bottom of the bottle or near the URL label. It may appear as two or four digits (e.g., 08 or 2008). The 12-year expiration date puts the U.S. Coast Guard regulations in line with the National Fire Protection Association's recommendations.

For 2018 model boats or newer:

- Must carry "5-B", "10-B", and "20-B" classified extinguishers. The number on the new labels refers to the size (in square feet) of a potential fire the device is suitable to extinguish.
- Please note, for boats 26-65 feet the requirements vary.

For 2017 model boats or older:

- May carry older "B-I" or "B-II" disposable extinguishers until their 12-year expiration date, and then they must be replaced with newer class extinguishers.
- Boats built prior to 1952 have special rules.

Boats must also carry a minimum number of fire extinguishers based on the length of the vessel.

Length of boat Number of extinguishers needed

Under 16 ft and 16 ft to 26 ft 26 ft but less than 40ft 40 ft but less than 65 ft

Make sure your boat meets the new fire extinguisher requirements by getting a vessel safety check with your local U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and United States Power Squadrons.

ANCHORS AND ANCHOR CHAINS AND LINES

These get a lot of use and abuse, getting caught in underwater structures and rocks. The anchor is often under severe loads and needs to be checked for any deformities or damage as it's raised and secured. Any deformity or damage should soon be addressed, as it affects the anchor's performance and your boat's security.

Inspect your anchor line and chain. During an anchor chain inspection, the chain cables should be ranged out on the dock floor and visually inspected for wear. Anchor chains can become deformed. To check for deformation, measure the length of the chain link and shackle. The length of the chain link with gear exceeds 7 percent of the original length, and the chain link without gear or shackle exceeding 8 percent of the original length can no longer be used.

Make sure you have the proper length of anchor and chain for proper anchoring. How much anchor chain and rope do I need? Determining how long your anchor rode should be is as simple as multiplying the deepest water you expect to anchor in by eight. As for rope size, the rule of thumb is 1/8-inch of rope diameter for every 9 feet of boat length. So, if you expect to anchor your 26-foot boat in 30 feet of water, you need 240 feet of 3/8-inch nylon rope.

LIFE JACKETS

This is a good time to examine your life jackets. If you do not wear them on a consistent basis and keep them stored, honestly, you are not alone. Every boater knows that you must have a life jacket for each passenger, but in the state of Missouri the life jackets must be readily accessible. In other words, not under a seat, where someone is sitting or stored in a container. The life jacket must be within reach and easy to put on in the event of an emergency.

The best bet is to wear one at all times when you are under way. Children 7 years or younger must wear a jacket at all times.

LIFE JACKET MAINTENANCE

- Check your life jackets at the beginning of each boating season.
- Check that all hardware and straps are in good shape, are firmly attached and are in working order.
- Check for leaks, mildew, lumpy or hardened buoyancy material and oil saturation in the fabric.
- Make sure that there are no rips or tears in the fabric.
- Make sure that the label stating USCG approval is attached, and that it is readable.
- Discard and replace life jackets that show signs of deterioration tears, mildew stains, punctures, etc.

AUTO INFLATABLE LIFE JACKET

- As a general rule of thumb, you should always check that your inflatable life jacket is in good and serviceable condition before every season or outing. Perform "beginning of season maintenance" every two-to-three months for light to moderate users or more often if used frequently or in a humid climate.
- Check that it's free of rips, tears or holes and that all seams are securely sewn. Likewise, ensure that the fabric, straps and hardware still hold strong.

INSPECT AN INFLATABLE LIFE JACKET

- Remove the CO2 cylinder and bobbin.
- Visually inspect the device for abrasions, rips, tears and punctures. Inspect the outer shell by "pinching" the fabric. It should not fray or tear. Life jackets with fabric that has faded, torn or deteriorated should be removed from service and replaced.
- Perform a leakage test by orally inflating the chamber until firm. Let the device stand overnight to ensure enough time has passed to make a judgment. If a loss of air occurs, repeat the process to validate the result. If the leak persists, remove the life jacket from service and replace the device.
- Confirm the oral inflation valve is properly functioning by inflating the device and holding the valve underwater. If bubbles appear, repeat the process to validate the result. If a leak occurs, remove the life jacket from service and replace the device.
- Inspect the bobbin by looking for the white, water-soluble substance located within the bobbin. Check to make sure the white substance is still intact with no signs of cracks or breaks. Replace the bobbin if the manufacture date is over three years from the date of inspection.
- Inspect the CO2 cylinder for any holes or piercings near the face of the cylinder. Be sure to look for signs of rust or corrosion as well and replace them if needed.
- For 1F & 3F models (bayonet style CO2), inspect the sensor ring. If broken, replace the cylinder.
- Follow repacking and re-arming instructions.

Taking care of your boating equipment with proper maintenance will let you boat worry-free and enjoy your time on the water.

Swing into Success:

YOUR GOLF QUESTIONS ANSWERED BY OUR PGA GOLF PRO

What should I do to keep my game sharp in the off-season? - Clay B., Lake Ozark

This is something all golfers should think about when the weather gets chilly. If the weather is conducive for play, practice outside as much as you can just like you would in-season. If it turns cold for a substantial length of time, make sure you do some stretching daily to keep your muscles engaged and golf ready.

You can also utilize some of the indoor facilities that have popped up at the Lake in recent years at the LOZ Golf Lounge, Osage National Resort and Eldon Country Club. If you have room in your house, you can also purchase an inexpensive hitting net, chipping net or putting mat for those cold days that you are stuck inside.

The more you keep your muscles and body golf-ready, the more prepared you will be to hit the links in mid-season form this spring.

How do I hit a shot off a severe downhill lie? I have a lot of trouble on hole No. 9 at the Oaks Course getting it over the water.



You are not alone trying to hit a golf ball off a downhill lie. This is one of the toughest shots to hit, and particularly if you have to get the ball elevated over water or other obstacles. It starts with selecting the correct club.

With a severe downhill lie the golf club will be de-lofted increasing the odds that the ball will not get elevated. Choose a club that has more loft then you would normally play from the distance you have to go. Play the ball in the middle to the back of your stance and position your shoulders in line with the downhill slope. For a right-handed player that will mean your right shoulder is higher than the left as you address the ball.

Club head speed is the next thing you need. More club head speed at impact will help elevate the ball. Swing harder than you would normally to generate as much speed as you can. The faster you can swing the club the greater chance you have of elevating the ball over that obstacle. Speed is your friend on this shot.

I hope this helps and good luck! It is a very hard shot to master.



I have been thinking of getting a range finder but don't know if I need one. I typically shoot 95 to 100.

- Joe W., Eldon

This is a great question that does not have a simple yes or no answer. A lot depends on if you know how far you hit given clubs.

If you know within 5 or 10 yards how far you hit each club, it makes sense to invest in a rangefinder to get the exact distances to the pin. If you hit (for instance) your 7-iron anywhere from 120 to 160 yards, depending how solid of contact you make on a given shot, you would probably be better served with a device that will give you a yardage to the front, middle and back of the green. That way you know how far you need to hit each shot to reach the green, not just the exact yardage to the pin.

Most players under-club so knowing front, middle and back distances can assist in club selection especially when there may be trouble short or long of a green. I hope this helps and if you need additional assistance, stop by any of your local golf courses and ask you PGA Professional for guidance.

f you regularly seek out live music at the Lake of the Ozarks you may have been fortunate to catch a show with Blake Gardner & The Farmers. This multi-talented band can't be defined by a single music genre. They mix blues, reggae, hip-hop, funk and everything else into an improvised performance that makes each show unique.

"We are a groovy, funky, bluesy, jammy, twangy, jazzy, hippy party band from the Midwest," explained lead vox/acoustic member Blake Gardner. "We just try to make the songs groovy and fun to listen to."

Although the band has members that rotate from time to time, the main group consists of Blake Gardner, Brandon Phillips (drums/percussion/backup vox), Jordan Tucker (bass), Forrest Wilson (lead guitar), Leighton Dennis (percussion/drums), Jeremy Jones (percussion/drums) and Trevor Phillippe (sax). All members live within the state of Missouri with Gardner living in Missouri and Illinois.

The group formed while in college and has been actively performing together since 2010.

"It was a way to ignore college," Gardner said. "I thought Blake Gardner & The Farmers was a clever name, but there was one point where all the other members were farmers or had farms in their family. I do enjoy gardening."

The band puts their own twists on covers they perform but have originals also. They perform as everything from a solo act to a nine-piece band.

"It just kind of depends on what we're booked as or what the venue or occasion can handle," Gardner explained. "We mostly travel as a four or five-piece band."

They typically play at the Lake, Hermann, St. Louis, Kansas City, SEMO and western and central Illinois. The band has dipped into the states of Kentucky, Kansas, Arkansas, Iowa and Texas.

"We play at everything from pizza parlors to dive bars to wineries to concert halls to national music festivals," Gardner explained. "We'll go wherever we can set up."



What the band loves most about playing at the Lake, Gardner said, is the beauty, the people, the food and the other music performers. Moving to the Lake area is something Gardner hopes to do someday soon.

The band is a full-time job for Gardner, and they're working on making it full-time for the other bandmates as well. Currently, other members work in everything from the service industry to being handymen to being a student.

They performed 114 shows last year between solo and band appearances. Their music can be found on all music platforms, including Spotify, YouTube, Facebook, Instagram and more. An album has been in the works for the past six years and is close to completion.

Plans for the future, Gardner said, is to just keep hustling.




