# Lakers Looking To Go Out With A Bang

Led by seven seniors, the Camdenton boys tennis team aims to improve under the guidance of head coach Kirk Richey.

The Lakers enter the 2024 season ready to improve on its 2-11 record from last year.

Returning to lead the Lakers' 16-man roster in 2024 are: seniors Jonah Debert, Carter Smith, Levi Dunahee, Ryder Pitts, Robert Lewis and Mason Eichler; juniors Chris Lopez and Johnny Semau; sophomores Jackson Berg and Noah Highwood.

Freshmen newcomers to the squad are: Colton Ingold, Levi Breuer, Carson Stoufer, Fischer Richey and Alex Hendon.

Debert is ready to embrace the role of team captain and help lead the Lakers to improvement in 2024.

"We're looking solid so far and I think this incoming freshmen class will help us win more matches this year," he said. "We have a doubles tournament that I'm looking forward to and we have been really focusing on doubles a lot everyday at practice and we feel like we will be able to go out and win some tournaments this year."

Both Debert and Hendon said that they will most likely be doubles partners this season and noted what they are working to improve on.

"I am working on my serve," Hendon said.

"I am honestly just working on being at the right place at the right time," Debert said. "After I hit the ball, I tend to watch it and not tackle my shots a whole lot and I'm working on that."

Hendon added that he wants to see the Lakers finish strong in the last year in the Ozark Conference.

"This is our last year in the conference, so we got to go out with a bang," he said.

# Lakers Focused On Rebuilding

The Camdenton boys golf team replenishes its roster with eight first-time golfers after losing senior Gunnar Schuster, who was a three-time State qualifier.

Last season, Schuster led Camdenton with postseason All-State honors and medaled with a seventh-place finish at the State Tournament.

"We're still in the midst of a rebuilding, but we got plenty of boys that are interested in the game and there is a lot of them that are looking really great," said Lakers coach Joe Presson. "There is a core of juniors and seniors that I've coached to some capacity of three years that have grown a whole lot together and I think can do something special if they keep trying to improve their game."

According to Presson, the expectations are not set as high entering this season with eight newcomers, who are also first-time varsity golfers.

"We will either try and get the team to qualify for State altogether or maybe we can get one of these guys," he said. "And these boys have been really working hard over the off-season to improve their game and I can't wait to see how they gradually elevate as the season goes on."

Returning to lead the Lakers are seniors Ethan Kessler and Fischer Lapine, and junior Tyler Foster.

Presson noted that it was still too early to tell who would fill out the five-man core for Camdenton.

"We haven't had any team compiled scores yet, so it's too early to see how the team is going to score," he said.

Kessler said that he has his eyes set on making the State Tournament after joining the squad as a sophomore.

"We're all looking good and we're all trying," he said. "Over the summer, some of us kept working with each other and holding each other accountable because we want to win and we have been putting in a lot of effort. We oball want to go to State, but it's going to take a lot of work."

Kessler reflects on what it was like learning as a sophomore and how it feels to now be considered a team leader.

"Some have kind of played before and I just remember that being me," he said. "High school is really the first time where you are on a team and I told a lot of them it's going to be fun and a tough adventure at the beginning, but they will eventually get the hang of it."

Golf is something that Kessler said he looks forward to learning more about and that he intends to play golf for the rest of his life like his grandfather who has taught him lessons.

"He just teaches me everything and I've just fallen in love with the game," he said. "And golf is a mind game

that teaches patience and focus that I can take anywhere into

the workplace. I can play the sport for another 60 years of my life like my grandpa, who still plays at 70 years old and he still beats me."

He added that some of the first-time golfers have been quick learners in the first few weeks of practice.

"They started out not knowing how to hold the club, to now hitting the ball in the air and onto the range which is a huge improvement for some of them," Presson said. "It feels great to have kids interested in the sport and I'm grateful for that, but they still have a long ways to go. At the end of the day, competition golf is not




what I focus my coaching on. This is a life-long sport and I really want these kids to learn valuable skills and learn to be reflective and honest with themselves."

He added that he feels gratification from helping this squad learn the game and preaches putting in the time to improve.

"Right now we are just trying to fine-tune swings," Presson said. "Some of these kids have never played golf before and don't really understand the game. Some don't understand their swing and right now the best way for them to learn is by doing. But I try and pop in and we do individual lessons and swing tweaks and give them feedback on what they need to spend hours working on."

#### Lakers Ready To Seize Opportunities Despite Injuries

The Camdenton baseball team suffered a big loss before the season as ace pitcher Kade Durnin will miss his senior season due to a right elbow injury, but the Lake boys are ready to silence the doubters.

Durnin suffered an ulnar collateral ligament (UCL) elbow injury at the beginning of March after signing with Texas Christian University in the fall. As a junior, Durnin was an All-State honoree at designated hitter/utility, the reigning Class 5 Player of the Year with Class 5 first team honors and Ozark Conference MVP.

"It's not a big secret that we have a few injuries to some players that expected to play this season, but I think we have a team with a lot of urgency," said Lakers coach Bryce Durnin. "A lot of guys want the opportunity and it's there due to injuries. We're going to be young and a little bit inexperienced on the infield, but I'm excit-

ed about the opportunity that these kids are going to have to prove themselves."

Camdenton ended last season with a 29-5 record and lost 7-5 to Glendale in the second round of the Class 5, District 6 Tournament. The Lakers replace three seniors from last season, All-State honoree Kam Durnin (Wichita State), Tobyn Dudley (Mission University) and Cole Hilton (Olive Harvey community College).

The Lakers return 14 upperclassmen (7 seniors, 6 juniors) and 10 sophomores, while bringing in 12 freshmen.

Leading Camdenton as senior captains in 2024 are: pitcher Spencer Mellencamp, centerfielder and leadoff hitter Jackson Basham and right fielder/pitcher Zane Fry.

Mellencamp returns with All-State honors and is expected to take over as ace of the pitching staff. Last season, Mellencamp pitched 50.2 innings and boasted a 0.414 ERA to lead the team with a 7-1 record. Mellencamp also had a .306 batting average and serves as a utility in both the infield and outfield.

"He is now expected to be the ace and will play wherever he is needed," Durnin said. "I think going into the season we were going to stick him in the outfield, but he's needed in the infield just as much."

Basham returns as the leadoff hitter and batted .411 last year with the second most hits on the team with 46. He also pitched 28.2 innings with a 4.884 ERA

"Jackson sets the table for us," Durnin said. "I think he is one of the more athletic kids in the area and he will play centerfield. He's a clipper out there and can pitch and do about everything."

Fry is returning from injury and will serve a bigger role this season on the mound and in the outfield. Last season Fry pitched 7.2 innings with a 1-0 record, one save and a 2.739 ERA.

"He played in about 25 games for us and is rehabbing from an injury," Durnin said. "He will play the corner outfield positions and pitch a little bit. Once he becomes healthy he will be hitting in the middle of our lineup."

Fry said that he's feeling more and more healthy and looks forward to leading the Lakers.

"I think we're looking pretty solid coming off a great season last year," he said. "Obviously we have some injuries, but we can get past them and it's going to be a good season ahead of us."

He added that he's looking forward to pitching and that his most comfortable pitch is his changeup.

"I'm really looking forward to pitching this season," Fry said. "We're kind of short-handed pitching wise due to injuries, so I'll be looking to get some innings in.

Other returners are: seniors Payten Hinton, Nicklas McNerney and Gavin Marlowe; juniors Willard Demott, Levi Layman, Jack Wildman, Karson Durnin, Kole Lane, Carter Coon and Brody Downey; sophomores Brayden Burns, Quinten Knipp, Brady Linch, Asher Stanley, Kyle Kirby, Teigan Elwyn, Carter Butts, Hunter Raye, Paxton Yowell and Tanner Scott.

All-State honoree and utility Karson Durnin will miss a majority of his junior season after suffering an anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) injury in a football game against Lebanon. He said that he has been recently released to start a throwing program with the hope of playing soon.

"I'm just trying to get my arm back in condition for the Summer," he said. "I'm not really sure if I'll see the field, but on May 1 I go back to the doctor and he will tell me if I'll be ready to help the boys for a postseason run and I'm hoping it happens."

Kade Durnin also gave an update on his recovery and is keeping a positive mindset helping his dad coach.

"I'm doing good and recovery is going great and I'm excited to see the game from a new perspective," he said.

He added that he's looking forward to watching his Laker teammates put together a special season.

"I'm really excited for the guys and this season is all about new opportunities," Durnin said. "It's not about what you lost, it's about the opportunities you gain."

Yowell will also miss the season due to suffering knee injuries during basketball season.

Durnin said that there have been a few freshmen that have made an impression in the first few weeks of practice.

"You're going to see five freshmen on the field this season," Durnin said. "I always feel like the freshmen and sophomores are really hungry and sometimes those juniors and seniors can get complacent and just expect it's their turn. So, I like the urgency and energy that this freshmen class brings to the team."

After being plagued by injuries last season, the Camdenton girls soccer team aims to bounce back, returning five seniors, one junior and one sophomore to the pitch in 2024.

"We expect to be very competitive this year," said Lady Lakers coach Tyler Sevon, who is entering his fourth season and is eight wins away from 200 for his career. "We bring back most of our roster from last season and we look to continue to be a force offensively and grow defensively all year."

Camdenton aims to improve on its 12-13 record from last season, where they fell 4-0 to Rolla in the first round of the Class 3, District 5 Tournament.

"Last season saw a huge jump in our offensive production," Seven said. "We ended the year playing really well but had some big time injuries that limited our success."

Leading the Lady Lakers as senior captains are: striker Zoe Lockhert, center-midfielder Addy Clay and center-midfielder Makenna Brauer.

Other returners are: senior defender Abby Rapier, senior midfielder Lilli Sutterer; junior midfielder Kyla Kirby, junior goalkeeper Ariana Delgado and sophomore defender Jakata Haynes.

Newcomers to the squad are: junior center-back Kiley Bentley; freshman rightwing Sophie Radlund, freshman goal-keeper Bella Faes, freshman striker Lily Roberts, freshman left-back Brooklyn Meents and freshman center-midfielder Kylie Labelle.

Captains, Lockhert and Clay are eager to cap off their Camdenton soccer careers with a winning season before they take their talents to William Woods University, where they will continue being teammates since they were in Middle School.

Lockhert led Camdenton last season with 24 goals, while adding five assists. Clay was third on the team with 11 goals and 12 assists.

"I think the team is looking good," Lockhert said. "We probably need to make some more connections just because we're not all used to our positions yet.

Sevon added that he's been impressed throughout the first two weeks of practice. "I have been really pleased," he said. "The girls have done a good job of staying motivated and focused."



# Lakers Eye State Championship

The expectations remain high for the Camdenton track and field program as it returns 17 letter winners hungry to win a State Championship.

"The coaching staff is excited to coach another season," said coach Nick Bruck, who enters his 19th season. "We look forward to great spring weather and the returning talent to take on the Class 5 competition."

The Camdenton boys and girls track and field teams are eyeing a State title as a team in 2024. The Lady Lakers won a State title in 2017, while the Lakers haven't won a State title since 1973.

Five school records were set last season by departed seniors: Angel Dickerson (100m 10.44, long jump 24-6.25), Georgi Carolus (800m 2:19.18, 1600m 5:20.83) and Ellie Webb (3200m 11:53.68).

Last season, Camdenton qualified seven athletes for eight events at the Class 5 State Track and Field Championships in Jefferson City. The boys squad finished in third place in Class 5 to win Camdenton's third State Championship trophy in the last six seasons.

McGuire, Olivia Welch, Cassidy Hannigan and Madison Daniels; sophomore Coral Brown.

"As always the returning athletes will step up to fill the shoes of such a talented group of graduated seniors," Bruck said.

The Lakers will be anchored by a few returning senior State medalists from the 4x100m relay team in Sexe, Ketchum and Eidson. Seniors, Hilton, Karson George and Jeshua Balderas return as throwers, along with Mason at pole vault.

Returning to lead the Lady Lakers are previous State qualifiers — Dickerson (discus), juniors Bella Breuer (high jump), McGuire and Welch (4x400 relay). The Lady Lakers also return Sectional Qualifier Cassidy Hannigan (4x400 relay).

Eidson noted that he's looking forward to bettering his numbers from last season. "It's a little weird that it's my last year, but we're just going to come out here and get the job done," he said. "Most of our 4x100m relay guys are returning and I'm hopefully going to make a good run in the javelin. I also have unfinished business in the high jump."

Dickerson said that she will focus on daily improvement as she works to return to State.

"My personal goal is to do my best everyday, but I want to make it back to State," she said. "I made it my sophomore year and I'm trying to get back and maybe place this time.

#### **OSAGE BASEBALL Indians Enter The 2024 Season** School of the Osage Home of the Indians With A Positive Mindset



After winning three of its final five games last season, the School of the Osage baseball team is eager to hit the field, returning 18 players to its 28-man roster with 10 upperclassmen.

"We're looking very positive," said Indians coach David Flaspohler, who enters his 15th season at Osage. "This has been a group that comes in everyday and has shown the proper attitude and work ethic to just want to get better and it doesn't get any better than that as a coach."

The Indians will look to improve their 7-17 record from last season, where they lost 9-0 to the rival Mustangs from Eldon in the Class 4, District 9 Tournament.

Returning to lead Osage as senior captains are shortstop/pitcher Tyler Shull, third baseman Dalan Johnston, first baseman John Kimrey and left fielder Gavin Black.

"Those four saw quite a bit of time last year," Flaspohler said. "With Tyler Shull at shortstop, look for him to also be a presence on the mound. We have quite a few returning players with those four seniors, six juniors, seven sophomores and 11 freshmen. So, returning starters out of those are a few here and there, but we're looking for fresh faces. We're looking for a new look and a new vibe."

Flaspohler noted that the Indians are looking to improve everywhere on the field in 2024, especially replacing two spots in the starting rotation left by senior pitchers, Trey Johnson and Dalton Wall.

"Depending on how we start the season, it could be a pitch by committee everyday," he said. "We may utilize 11 to 12 pitchers this year and throw three to four arms at you leaving us fresh for the next game, or the next two games I hope."

Rounding out the Osage pitching staff along with Shull will be junior Tucker Willoughby, sophomore Christopher Nicolson, along with freshmen Chance Ottens and Landon Klee.


"I think junior Tucker Willoughby is going to step for us on the mound and eat some innings up," Flaspohler said. "The rest are really going to be some fresh faces. Sophomore Christopher Nicolson I think is going to find his spot on the mound and settle into it really well. He may end up being the number one guy that we go to and knowing him and his work ethic, it could very easily be the case. Freshmen Chance Ottens and Landon Klee will probably play an integral role this year and hopefully they both respond well. Right now they are accepting the challenge and hopefully that carries on into the course of the season."

Black and Willoughby return to the team with postseason honors by making the Academic All-State baseball team in 2023.

Shull enters his senior season after earning All-District First Team honors and All-Conference Honorable Mention as a junior and just recently signed his letter of intent to play college baseball at Central methodist University. Through the first few weeks of practice, the captain can already see improvements.

"We'll open some eyes this year," he said. "We have really improved on our communication. That was something last year that we didn't excel at and we could have won some of those games if we had communicated and so far, we've communicated a lot better."





Other senior captains, Kimrey, Johnston and Black shared how a different mindset entering this season can carry them to a winning season.

"This team has a lot of promise," Kimrey said. "There are a lot of young guys, but the younger guys are showing a lot of potential with a strong work ethic that they're bringing to practice and I think we're going over .500 this season."

Johnston added that an optimistic mindset makes for a better atmosphere at practice.

"We're starting this season with less negativity and a lot more positivity," he said. "It feels like we have a better family now."

Black is eager to hit the field after playing his final basketball season and he's been impressed with the chemistry being built.

"It's my first day back coming from basketball season and seeing everybody already in a flow and everything seems to be running as smooth as it was at the end of last year," he said. "The team is looking promising, with a lot of underclassmen leadership too. So, it's nice to see sophomores and even freshmen step up and take leadership roles and that allows everything to flow more smoothly."

Kimrey added that he has a personal goal set out before it's all said and done. "I want to end my senior year sweeping Eldon," he said. "We beat them in football, basketball and now I want to beat them in baseball."

All the captains added they are looking to get revenge on Iberia in the home opener on March 18, after losing 7-0 last season.



Last season, Osage had a record of 11-9 and fell 2-0 to Logan-Rogersville in the second round of the Class 2, District 5 Tournament.


Returning to lead the varsity squad as senior captains are attacking midfielder Grace Larson, left-back Aubrie Gonnella and wing Lexie Porter.


The Macks Creek track and field program kicks off its first season under the guidance of head coach Josh Phillips as the Pirates return two seniors to its four man squad.



Phillips is the lone returner this season and will serve as team captain for the Pirates. Senior Jessica Weyhersmueller is the lone newcomer to the girls squad.



Because of the individual nature of sports like track and field, where low numbers don't inhibit the ability of athletes to compete, he said that Macks Creek will continue to offer

such opportunities to its students. "We hope more students will embrace the opportunity, because it is such a fun sport and the more athletes who sign up allows us to score as a team and put together relays which are also a lot of fun," coach Phillips said.

He added that he will be focusing on improving his hitting before the season starts at Weaubleau on Friday, March 15.


Phillips wants to see the team improve everywhere as he looks to help deliver a winning season for the Cougars before he graduates in the spring.
