

Perfection attained

Rangers win state title

Noah Riemensnider tossed a complete game as the Iberia baseball Rangers capped a perfect season with a 7-3 win over the Maysville Wolverines in the MSHSAA Class 2 Championships Tuesday, May 28, at the Ozark Mountain Sports Complex in Ozark.

Iberia (28-0) took command in the second inning, scoring four runs. Singles from Isaac Duncan, Brady Blankenship and Konnor Drace loaded the bases. Eighth-place hitter Cris Shreve then laced a single to center, scoring two runs.

"I just needed to put the ball in play," Shreve said. "I got a pitch and put a nice, easy swing on it and hit it to center," he

Ashtyn Duncan bunted into a fielder's choice and a wild pitch eventually put runners at second and third. Riemensnider hit a sacrifice fly to center and Tanner Patterson followed with an RBI triple, but Patterson was thrown out trying for an inside-the-park home run.

The game stayed 4-0 until the fifth. With two outs, the Rangers put together a rally on a Logan Seel single, a single by Hunter Piggott, and Isaac Duncan's tworun double followed by a Brady Blankenship hit to score Duncan.

Those three insurance runs proved extremely helpful as the Wolverines showed some fight, scoring three in the top of the sixth.

But Riemensnider made sure that would be all as he picked up two strikeouts in the final frame, the last of which caused a massive pile up on the pitching

"We had great pitching and we were able to string some bunt hits together,' Iberia coach Tim Vinson said.

The Rangers finished with the seventh undefeated season in MSHSAA history, but the Rangers posted 28 wins, the most of any of those seasons.

Isaac Duncan finished 3-for-3 with two doubles, two runs scored and two RBIs. Blankenship also had two hits with a run scored and an RBI. Drace was 1-for-3.

Ashtyn Duncan and Derick Shadow each scored a run.

For the Rangers, it is their first state championship since the 2005 season. It proved to be a perfect ending for the team's four seniors: Brady Blankenship, Konnor Drace, Hunter Piggott and Logan

"It was a fun season," Iberia assistant coach Kyle Blankenship said.

Tripping Tipton again

The Rangers reached the championship game with a 5-1 win over the Tipton Cardinals Monday, May 27, in semifinal No. 2.

Tanner Patterson tossed a complete game four-hitter and went 3-for-4 at the plate with two RBIs. Patterson improved to 12-0 on the season as he struck out 13 and walked only one.

Iberia used plenty of small ball and the Rangers recorded four bunt singles and took advantage of three Tipton errors.

Hunter Piggott was hit by a pitch and eventually scored on a wild pitch in the second inning to give the Rangers the

Noah Riemensnider drove home one run with a sacrifice fly in the fifth inning and Patterson followed with an RBI single to increase the Rangers' lead to 3-o.

Tipton tallied a solo run in the bottom of the fifth, cutting the lead to 3-1.

The Rangers' scored twice in the bottom of the sixth, thanks to a pair of critical Tipton errors after two were out.

Patterson singled home Riemensnider and Logan Seel followed with an RBI double to score Patterson.

Brady Blankenship went 2-for-3 for the Rangers. Riemensnider and Cris Shreve each had a hit. Shreve, Piggott and Konnor Shreve each scored a run.

Rangers head to Final Four

The Iberia baseball Rangers earned their first trip to the MSHSAA Class 2 Championships with an 8-2 win over the Galena Bulldogs Wednesday, May 22,

The Rangers (26-0) took advantage of walks by Galena pitching. Iberia scored all eight runs in the first three innings.

Noah Riemensnider dominated the Bulldogs from the get-go. The junior right-hander allowed just four hits and walked no batters while striking out 13. An Iberia error in the fourth inning made both runs unearned.

Tanner Patterson had three of Iberia's seven hits. He had a double, scored three runs, stole three bases and drove in a run.

Isaac Duncan was 2-for-2 with two walks, a run scored and two RBIs. Riemensnider had a hit and a run scored. Brady Blankenship had a hit with an RBI.

Sectional at Bakersfield

Iberia plated two runs in the bottom of the first inning and Tanner Patterson made them stand up as the Rangers defeated Bakersfield 2-0 Monday, May 20, in Bakersfield.

With two outs in the bottom of the first, Logan Seel walked and stole second. Hunter Piggott singled him home and Isaac Duncan doubled to score Piggott.

That was plenty for Patterson as the junior southpaw allowed two hits and two walks with 12 strikeouts in winning his 10th game of the season.

Brady Blankenship had a double and Patterson had a single for the Rangers' other two hits in the contest.

Rangers claim district title

Tanner Patterson tossed a one-hitter as the Iberia baseball Rangers claim their second straight district title with an 8-o win over Vienna Wednesday, May 15, at

Patterson retired the first nine hitters before an Iberia error stopped the perfect game. Patterson promptly picked off the runner and kept the no-hit bid going until one out in the fifth. Patterson then retired the final eight hitters he faced, finishing just one over the minimum.

Patterson and Logan Seel each had consecutive run-scoring singles in the second to give the Rangers a 2-0 lead.

A pair of Vienna errors enabled the Rangers to expand their lead to 6-o in the third inning.

Hunter Piggott drove home a run with a sacrifice fly in the fifth and Isaac Duncan cracked a solo homer to finish the scoring.

Patterson finished 3-for-5 with a run scored and two RBIs. Seel was 3-for-3 with a run scored and an RBI.

Duncan finished with two RBIs. Noah Riemensnider and Cris Shreve each had a hit and two runs scored.

Walk-off winner

Hunter Piggott singled home Tanner Patterson with the winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning as the Rangers kept their season going with a thrilling 3-2 win over Hartville in the district tournament semi-final round.

Piggott drove in Iberia's first run with a single in the home half of the first to give the Rangers a 1-0 lead.

Hartville tied the game in the top of the fourth but the Rangers re-took the lead in the bottom of the frame, Brady Blankenship singled to score Logan Seel who had doubled.

Hartville tied the game again in the top of the sixth, setting up the heroics.

With one out, Patterson walked. Seel singled him to second and Piggott then delivered his winning hit.

Noah Riemensnider started and worked the first 5-1/3 innings. He allowed four hits and two runs, one earned. He struck out six and walked one.


Patterson went 1-2/3 innings with four strikeouts to get the win on the mound.





Seniors led the way for Rangers

A large part of the Iberia baseball Rangers' success in 2024 came from it's four seniors.

All four seniors: Brady Blankenship, Konnor Drace, Hunter Piggott and Logan Seel, have been key members of the varsity team since their freshman year. Drace was a part time player his first season while Seel missed much of his sophomore season due to an injury.

But while all four took the field, they

become one of, if not the winningest group of players in school history, maybe even state history.

The Rangers went an astonishing 153-23 in their four years when you count the fall and spring seasons together.

During the spring season, the Rangers went 86-11, winning two straight district championships and ending their respective career with a state championship.

Blankenship played mostly third base


and first base for the Rangers, but he did occasionally come in to pitch. Drace played a lot of second base and a lot of right field during his tenure.

Piggott and Seel were primarily the team's defensive captains. Piggott was a mainstay on the infield, playing second base before switching to shortstop. Piggott was also counted upon to toss a few innings from the mound. Seel did the bulk of the catching, despite the injury.


All four played pivotal roles for the Rangers, when it was a close game, generally, one of the four seniors would make a crucial play or get a clutch hit in pressure situations.



Four Rangers named all-state Patterson earns Player of the Year

A total of four Iberia baseball Rangers were named to the Class 2 All-State Baseball team as voted upon by the members of the Missouri High School Baseball coaches Association, it was announced June 10.

Junior left-handed pitcher Tanner Patterson was the top vote-getter, earning class 2 Player of the year honors, as well as first-team recognition.

Patterson had perhaps the greatest season by a Ranger player. He went 13-0 with two saves on the mound for the Rangers with a 0.56 earned run average. Patterson made 15 appearances, 11 starts. He tossed 75-2/3 innings, allowing just eight runs, six earned on 28 hits. He struck out 150 and walked 17. he also excelled offensively, collecting 38 hits in 89 at bats for a .427 batting average, He had three doubles and one triple. He scored 30 runs and knocked in 14, while stealing 19 bases.

Junior right-hander Noah Riemensider was also a first-team selection. Riemensnider finished 8-0 with one save and an earned-run average of 0.48. He appeared 13 times, starting nine games. In 58 innings, Riemensnider allowed just four earned runs while striking out 86 against 20 walks.


Riemensnider was equally effective at the dish, hitting .304 with 31 hits, five doubles and a triple. He scored 30 runs and drove in 15.

Senior catcher Logan Seel was Iberia's other first-team choice. Seel batted .368, collecting 24 hits in 74 at bats. Seel finished with eight doubles and two hime runs. He scored 20 runs and drove in 25.

Senior Hunter Piggott earned a second-team nod as an infielder.


Piggott finished with a .359 batting average with 28 hits in 78 at bats. He had six doubles and one triple, scoring 31 runs and driving in 25.

Piggott also managed to fashion a 2-0 on the mound, recording one save. In 19-2/3 innings pitched, Piggott struck out 20 and walked two batters. He gave up 20 hits and finished with an ERA of 1.42.

Both were named to the Missouri High School Baseball Coaches Association all-state team as pitchers. Patterson was also selected as the Player of the Year.



Rangers run table, despite tough slate

The 2024 baseball season was not only a historic one for Iberia, it was historic for the entire state.

Since MSHSAA record-keeping began in 1950, there have been eight undefeated state champions.

Since 1950, this is the first time that there have been undefeated teams in successive years. In 2023, Ash Grove ran the table in winning the Class 2 title, going 25-0. The last team to beat the Rangers? Why the very same Ash Grove team in the 2023 quarter-finals.

Iberia did not play a cupcake schedule. The Frisco League, Iberia's conference produced a second Final four team as Licking finished fourth in Class 3. Of the five Class 1 squads the Rangers played, two (St. Elizabeth and Sacred Heart) won district tiles and played each other in sectional.

Iberia also played seven games against opponents in Class and above (including Licking). Iberia played four Class 4 teams and one Class 6 squad (Springfield Central). Iberia played some solid competi-

Many of the Rangers' games were close. A total of 12 of the team's wins were decided by four runs or fewer.

The Rangers were ready for the postseason and proved they were the best team in Class 2.

But, when compared to the other undefeated teams in history, the Rangers may be the best of all time. The 28 wins is the most for an undefeated state championship team. St. Elizabeth's 1997 squad

went 27-0.

When it all began

Since Iberia does not field a football squad, the Rangers can prepare for the spring baseball season with a slate of games in the fall.

Iberia laid the groundwork for its state championship season by going an impressive 19-1 during the fall season, dropping a 1-0 decision to Dixon for their lone loss (Iberia defeated Dixon 8-0 in the spring).

Even though those fall games do not count toward records and statew accolades, having success in those game can be a catapult to some great memories in the spring. As it did for the 2023-24 Iberia Rangers.




