# KAYAK FISHING: a new trend for anglers

 ngine-powered boats dominate the fishing scene at Lake of the Ozarks but some anglers are discovering they can catch bass from a kayak at the Lake.

Kayak bass fishing has grown rapidly in the past 10 years as a result of tournament circuits now holding events for kayak owners. The Lake of the Ozarks hosted a Mo Yak Fishing Tournament Series event in April with a field of 43 anglers fishing in kayaks.

Kayaks were once considered a small waters craft for fishing in remote areas, but kayak manufacturers are now building larger and wider boats with better stability and pedal-driven systems that allow anglers to fish larger waters such as Lake of the Ozarks. Kayaks have become so stable now that anglers can actually stand and fish without tipping over.

The Lake's massive size gives kayak anglers plenty of options to fish from Truman Dam to Bagnell Dam.

"You have a bunch of different types of areas that you can fish and kind of get away from the normally busy

areas," says Jeff Mellencamp, a Mo Yak Fishing Tournament Series competitor. "You can get back in a creek channel or go up the river. That is what I like doing."

Mellencamp's favorite areas to fish from his kayak are the Little Niangua Arm and the Ha Ha Tonka area on the upper Niangua. The Camdenton angler recommends using a kayak 12 feet or longer for fishing the Lake. He fishes in a Hobie Pro Angler 14, a 14-foot kayak with the stability he needs for navigating on the Lake and plenty of storage room.

"I can handle waves and carry all my stuff in it," Mellencamp says. With a longer and wider kayak, anglers can fish the same open waters of the Lake where bass boats roam, yet the smaller crafts can also put anglers in remote areas that are inaccessible for bass boats.

Hobie kayaks are also equipped with the revolutionary MirageDrive, a pedal system that replaces the paddle for propelling the kayak. His pedal-driven kayak allows Mellencamp to cover water quicker and steering handles on the Hobie lets him navigate virtually hands-free.

Today's kayaks are designed as smaller scale bass boats with storage compartments and rod racks or holders. Accessories such as depth finders and Power-Pole Micro Anchors also can be mounted on the boats. Other accessories kayak anglers can add to their rigs include storage crates such as the Jackson Kayak JKrate, Hobie H-Crate or the YakGear Kayak Angler Crate Kit. The YakGear basic crate kit features a crate, a double rod holder, accessory pouch, 3.3-pound grapnel anchor kit, anchor cleat and mounting hardware.

Television fishing celebrity and two-time Bassmaster Classic Champ Hank Parker has become a kayak bass fishing aficionado. When he first started using a Hobie kayak, Parker wasn't used to sitting and fishing from a lower position and closer to the water, so he had to make some adjustments to work lures properly. He suggests newcomers to kayak fishing just need to spend some time getting used to fishing at a different angle.

"The boat itself probably only stands up off the water about 18 to 20 inches so when you are in the kayak you are up another 2 1/2 feet," he says. "So you are 4 feet off the water instead of 6 or 6 1/2 feet (in a bass boat)."

Parker says there are some advantages to fishing closer to the water.

"The wind doesn't catch your line and move it because you are low to the water so I point my rod down and keep it low," he says. Since he has his rod lower without any slack in his line, Parker can also generate a smoother and quicker hook set when fishing from a kayak than he can in a bass boat.

Sitting closer to the water in a kayak also works to Parker's advantage when he is throwing topwater lures in clear water. He believes his lower profile prevents spooking fish in the clear water.

A stealthy approach is another advantage kayaks have over bass boats. Parker notes the MirageDrive on his Hobie kayak is much quieter than a trolling motor.

"If you pedal really fast then the fish will hear you, but you can make the pedal noise non-existent if you just take short strokes," Parker says.

While bass boats remain the standard vessel for bass fishing at the Lake of the Ozarks, kayaks are developing a following from anglers wanting to catch bass from remote parts of the Lake.

# The Fishing Report

#### Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

#### **Bagnell Dam Report**

The lake level was 659.2, generation of 4,500 CFS (cubic feet per second) throughout the week for a lake level of 659.4 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 83 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 706.7 level. To note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

#### **Tournament Results**

No tournaments were reported last weekend.

#### **Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good flipping jigs to shallow wood. Crappie: Fair on small swimbaits and jigs around brush and current breaks. Catfish: Good on cut shad and skipjack herring.

#### **Lower Lake**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on topwater lures and finesse worms on drop shot rigs along bluff ends. Crappie: Fair trolling crankbaits in the middle of coves. Catfish: Good drifting cut shad and skipjack herring.

#### **Gravois**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on topwater lures and square bill crankbaits in the backs of creeks or jigs, Texas-rigged plastic worms and wacky-rigged worms around docks and brush piles. Crappie: Fair trolling crankbaits on the main channel and in the middle of coves. Catfish: Good drifting cut shad and skipjack herring.

#### **Mid-Lake**

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged plastic worms in brush piles 8 to 12 feet deep. Crappie: Slow shooting jigs under docks or on spoons and minnows in dock wells.

#### **Grand Glaize**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on Texas-rigged plastic worms and jigs around shallow wood or on Ned rigs and wacky-rigged worms around docks. Crappie: Slow on jigs and minnows 6 to 25 feet deep around brush.



#### Niangua

Water clarity: Clear on the upper end and stained on the lower end. Black bass: Fair on jigs and Texas-rigged plastic worms around points. Crappie: Slow on minnows in brush 15 to 20 feet deep. White bass: Good trolling crankbaits along the main channel on the upper end. Catfish: Good on cut sunfish and nightcrawlers tight-lining off docks.

#### **Upper Osage**

Water clarity: Murky. Black bass: Fair on jigs and shaky head worms around shallow cover in the backs of coves. Crappie: Slow on minnows in brush and around docks 10 to 15 feet deep. Catfish: Excellent on jug lines baited with cut sunfish.

#### **Truman Dam spillway**

Water clarity: Stained. Crappie: Fair on jigs. White bass and hybrids: Fair on jigs. Catfish: Fair on cut shad.

# Ask the Expert



#### What is the difference between gross and net scores and how does that effect match and stroke play? **George T., Lake Ozark**

A player's gross score is the number of shots including penalty strokes to complete their round. The net score is calculated by subtracting the player's handicap strokes from the gross score. The purpose of the net score is to provide a more equitable way of comparing scores between players with different skill levels.

In stroke play, the total score is calculated for all players to determine a winner. Depending on the tournament the event can be scored by the gross scores or the net scores of the players. In most instances a tournament will either have all gross scores or all net scores.

In match play, the most common way to score is to use the net scores of the players on each hole. This equalizes skill levels so you can theoretically compete with anyone. Each hole is its own separate competition. If one player is a 10 handicap and the other is a 5 handicap, the 10 handicap player will be allotted one stoke on the five toughest holes on the course according to the handicap rank listed on the course scorecard. Each hole will either be halved (tied) or won by a player. The player who wins the most individual holes will be the winner.

#### I am just getting into golf...What is the best way to hold a golf club? Nancy B., Roach

Start with your non-dominate hand. Your left hand for a right hand dominant player and vice versa. Make sure the clubface is square and place your non-dominant hand on the club wrapping your fingers around the club. A "V" will be formed by your thumb and index finger that should point toward your dominant shoulder. Now place your dominant hand on the club just below the non-dominant one.

Wrapping your fingers around the club you can either interlock the little finger of your dominant hand with the index and middle finger of the non-dominate hand, or overlap the index finger with your little finger.

#### What is the difference between a hook and a slice? Is one more common than the other? Blake B., Eldon

A "slice" for a right handed player will move the golf ball from left to right. This is the most prevalent shot for the average player. A shot shape that starts right and continues to spin to the right is typically referred to as "push" and not a slice or "fade". A fade would be a slight curve of the ball from left to right where a slice is a severe left to right ball flight. A "hook" will move the ball from right to

Better players typically use a right-to-left ball flight to increase distance and it is the natural shape of a proper golf swing as the golf swing is a rotational move. A shot that starts left and continues left is not a hook or draw that would be a pull. A slight right-to-left ball flight is preferred for control and optimum distance.

This event will bring the top racers and offshore racing power boats from all over the world topping 200 MPH.

On Aug. 26, 2023, the American Ethanol boat 51 Mystic reached a speed of 214 miles per hour (mph) during the 35th annual Lake of the Ozarks Shootout in Central Missouri, setting a new record for the 3/4-mile course. The boat was piloted by Tony Battiato and John

Cosker, who also won the Shootout's Top Gun title for the ninth year in a row.

Many of the racers hope to beat the all-time speed of 244 Miles per hour by world-renowned powerboat racer Sheikh Hassan bin Jabor Al-Thani in August in the 96 Spirit of Qatar catamaran.

The Shoot out is much more than a race. 2023 Lake of the Ozarks Shootout raised approximately \$675,000 for charities. The Shootout's beneficiaries include local charities, fire protection districts and law enforcement agencies. In total, the Shootout has donated more than \$4.75 million to charity since it began as a lake rescue event for a local fire department 35 years ago.

#### Some tips to have a safe race day

You can see the race by land at Captains Rons located at 82 Aloha Ln, Sunrise Beach or at the 35.5 Mile Marker.

- 1. When you arrive at Captain Ron's there will be safety boats to assist you in anchoring and positioning your boat. Please follow directions and do not block other boaters' navigation abilities.
- 2. Drink plenty of water along with alcohol, if you feel that you have too much have a designated driver. You don't want to get arrested for boating while intoxicated.
- 3. Watch out for swimmers in the water when moving your boat. Be sure if you or your passengers are in the water, wear a life jacket.
- 4. If you are anchoring overnight or if you have air conditioning on board, be sure your on-board genitor is properly vented and your CO2 detector is working properly.
- 5. Please take your trash with you; let's keep the lake clean.
- 6. When leaving the race area, again no wake, stay out of the race lanes they will be marked do not cross into them.
- 7. You have watched the performance boats all day and may think your boat could be a racer. This is not the time to try to emulate the professionals. Be courteous, obey the no wake zones.
- 8. If you have an emergency, contact \*55 for the dispatch of the Highway Water Patrol Division or channel 16 to contact the United Coast Guard and the Coast Guard Auxiliary.

Keep it safe and enjoy the race days.

Vendors will be setting up Wednesday and/or Thursday and will be at the event until Sunday afternoon at 4 p.m.

Parking is available at Captain Ron's for \$10.





#### LONGTIME "DIVE BAR" ELEVATES FOOD, DEFIES EXPECTATIONS

hen Ilene Vanabbema decided to open up a waterfront bar on the Gravois Arm, she wasn't quite prepared for the challenges that would soon follow. Like many Lakefront establishments, finding seasonal employees on the heels of a pandemic proved to be a difficult.

No stranger to the restaurant business, Ilene has owned Maggie's Bar & Grille in downtown Boonville for more than 15 years. Named after a formerly-beloved pet, the popular restaurant is a local hangout in the style of an old English pub. Once the pandemic hit and things began to slow down, Ilene found herself spending more time at her old log home in Gravois Mills. A patron of the old Frog's Bar & Grill, Ilene said when it was placed on the market in 2020 she decided to take it over. After 25 years of being known as "Frog's" the restaurant reopened with a new name, a new look and a new menu.

Due to the difficulty of finding employees, the restaurant was only open four days a week the first year in business. With fingers crossed, llene brought in more help this season and has not only been able to stay open six days a week but has expanded the menu. At first it consisted of mainly fried foods and pizza, but now many homemade

items and some locally-sourced ingredients are crafting dishes that leave patrons craving more. The 7-ounce Missouri Angus beef are hand-pattied into 7-ounce burgers which have become as well-known at the Lake as they are at the Boonville location. Another popular item is the hand-breaded Wisconsin cheese curds, homemade fried pickles and the Homemade Chicken Bites.

Pizza comes in thin, extra think or a gluten-free cauliflower crust. Salads, baskets and a variety of burgers and sandwiches make up the remainder of the menu.

#### **Warm Hospitality & Entertainment**

Ilene doesn't mind being busy. It's a place that thrives on camaraderie so she'll often stop to check on a table or help the bartender sling a few drinks. There's not an aspect of the business she doesn't handle daily – from running to the supply room or stepping into the kitchen to help during the dinner rush.

"I'm a social person," she says. "I like the stress when it's busy."

The bar's interior pays homage to its past with vintage photographs, signs and articles explaining the history of the area. Table games such as Brain Teaser and Connect Four, cornhole on the outdoor patio, songs on the jukebox and friendly staff keep the atmosphere fun and playful.

Those seeking refuge from the summer sun will find it without having to give up being outdoors. The additional dock space provides ample parking for boaters and the amount of outdoor seating allows everyone to have a view of the Lake while enjoying their meal. The indoor dining room is easily converted to outdoor space by opening up the garage doors leading to the patio.

Locals gather on weekdays, especially for the scheduled entertainment and Wednesday night bingo starts at 6 p.m. Ilene shops specifically for the prizes awarded to bingo winners and admits some of them might be a little unusual. Live music is regularly held on Saturdays.





# MAKING A CONNECTION THROUGH MUSIC

t's more than just performing to an audience for singer, songwriter and musician Adam Powell. Every time he plays for a crowd he walks away fulfilled having made a connection with the audience and providing them a nostalgic experience.

"The music is half of it. The other half is developing friendships," Powell said. "Connecting with people, knowing that they are enjoying it ... it's fulfilling and therapeutic for me. There's nothing better. Music makes me feel good."

Every show is different. "I follow my instincts, try to keep it fresh and the crowd interested," he said.

"I didn't get serious until I was 14 years old and began trying to play James Taylor songs. I was hooked and I think it was during that time that I developed an interest in singing."

He began playing the piano at 16 which opened up a different genre of music as he tried to learn Billy Joel and Elton John songs. His greatest musical influences were the singers/ songwriters James Taylor, the Beatles,

the Eagles, Jackson Brown, Bill Withers, America, Simon & Garfunkel, Gordon Lightfoot, and Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young.

ringing major artists to the Lake area does not come easy. Just ask Tom Abbett and Mary Kay von Brendel, just part of the team behind Ozarks Amphitheater – a 10,256 seat outdoor amphitheater located in Camdenton.

By the time musicians take to the 5,000 square foot stage, months of planning have taken place to make sure each show goes off without a hitch. All that hard work has paid off.

Ozarks Amphitheater had a rough start for many years after it was built in 1993. It sat vacant for at least five years. Twice owners tried to get the venue up and running but failed. It fell under a state of disrepair until an investor from Colorado decided to revamp it.

Bill Carle had experience as a concessionaire at Red Rocks Amphitheater in Denver, along with his business partner Robert Mein who understood the food and beverage side of the business. Carle purchased Ozarks Amphitheater in 2013, renovated it in 2014, opened in 2015 and has been hosting world-class entertainment ever since.

According to Abbett, Director of Business Development at Ozarks Amphitheater, the Alabama concert in 2018 put Lake of the Ozarks on the map both locally and in Nashville as a viable venue. Big-name artists took note and started booking performances at the Lake. Kane Brown, Five Finger Death Punch and Shinedown have been extremely popular for fans at the Lake. Charlie Dan-

iels has played several times as well as Miranda Lambert, Katy Perry and Blues Traveler.

The number of shows and events hosted each year varies. There are currently 24 shows scheduled for 2024.

#### **Behind the Scenes**

Both Abbett and von Brendel, who is the Director of Operations at Ozarks Amphitheater, work to bring bigger names to the venue each year. They collaborate on booking acts, along with co-promoter Mammoth Presents from Kansas City. That partnership started in 2018 with Alabama and has flourished ever since, von Brendel said.

"My goal is for Ozarks Amphitheater to rival Red Rocks as a 'destination' and a 'must-play' venue for the larger touring acts," von Brendel said. "We are now in Phase 2 of the business plan working toward expanding parking, capacity, infrastructure and being able to accommodate the larger acts that are on our bucket list."

von Brendel has a background in music, having worked with JazzTrax Music Festivals on Catalina Island and Big Bear, Calif., for several years and being an artist manager for national touring Jazz musicians prior to moving to the Lake area. She tracked down Carle to request the opportunity to bring the Amphitheater back to life after inviting herself on stage where she sang the National Anthem and was overwhelmed by the amazing acoustics of the venue.

"Mary Kay's drive, creativity and commitment to the community is one of the reasons the venue has gotten to where it is today," Abbett said. Abbett was in real estate at the Lake before

Abbett was in real estate at the Lake before being recruited to work backstage security. As he got more involved in the business, he became stage manager and started booking talent in 2017.

"I have a mind for business and a body for manual labor..and it takes both of those to make the venue work," Abbett jokes.

Abbett is involved in the Lake Race, Shootout on the Strip, the Guinness World Record attempt Boat Parade and many other community-centered events that help promote the area in general.

They strive to be ambassadors of the Lake of the Ozarks, making sure that not only do shows run smoothly but that Ozarks Amphitheater has an economic and social impact in the area.

The venue has hosted special events including the Dogwood Festival, the Can Am Games Opening Ceremonies, Kelly Miller Circus and its annual events Pumpkin Chunkin' Palooza and Crossover Music Festival.

"We really would like to thank the community for supporting us and having a real interest in its success and growth," von Brendel said. "Without the community's support we would not have been able to grow to where we have, and we look forward to many more years of live entertainment at Lake of the Ozarks."

#### **Curtain Call**

On the day of the show, production trucks come in from their previous night's show around 6 a.m. The tour buses arrive shortly thereafter for breakfast and setup. Lunch is followed by sound-check and getting ready for the gates to open to the public at 6 p.m. The first act takes the stage at 7 p.m., 8 p.m. is the support act and the head-liner performs at 9:30 p.m. (schedule subject to change). The show ends about 11 p.m. with buses rolling out about 1 a.m. after tearing down and loading up equipment for the next gig.

About 150 people are employed for each show from increased security to emergency services and other crew. The season runs from April to October.

Amphitheater capacity is 10,256 dedicated seats with 2,556 in the lower bowl and 7,700 in the upper seating area, plus 2,000-3,000 on the lawn. There are premium seating options on the Party Deck and a Quirk Premium Tent that has four-top tables, pit access, dedicated wait staff and bar and premium parking. Concessions offers a full line of beverages, wines, mixed drinks and a full menu.
