





The Fishing Report

Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

Bagnell Dam Report

The lake level was 659.4, generation of 1,000 CFS (cubic feet per second) throughout the week for a lake level of 659.4 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 77 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 704.7 level. To note: the Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Tournament Results

No tournaments were reported last weekend.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. White bass and hybrids: Good on Roostertails in the current. Catfish: Good on cut shad and skipjack herring.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on Texas-rigged plastic worms and jigs around brush 2 to 15 feet deep. Crappie: Slow on jigs and minnows in brush 15 to 25 feet deep.

Gravois

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair at night on Texas-rigged magnum-sized plastic worms in brush 12 to 20 feet deep. Crappie: Fair on jigs in brush and around main lake docks 12 to 20 feet deep.

Mid-Lake


Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on topwater lures around shad balls in the mornings or on Texas-rigged plastic worms and jigs around brush 5 to 8 feet deep. Crappie: Slow on jigs for fish suspended 20 to 25 feet deep around condo docks.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on shaky head worms and jigs in brush 15 feet deep or Texas-rigged plastic worms, creature baits, square bill crankbaits and topwater lures in the backs of creeks. Crappie: Good on jigs around brush 15 feet deep.

Niangua

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Slow on Texas-rigged 10-inch plastic worms and jigs around docks 5 to 10 feet deep. Crappie: Slow shooting jigs under



main lake docks. Catfish: Fair drifting shad or on jug lines baited with cut shad.

Upper Osage

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good flipping jigs and Texas-rigged magnum-sized plastic worms to shallow docks on main lake points and in coves. Crappie: Good on minnows around docks 10 feet deep. Catfish: Good on jug lines and trot lines with cut shad and sunfish.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Clear. Crappie: Good on jigs and minnows in the dead-water channel. White bass and hybrids: Good on topwater lures and small swimbaits in the evenings.



Distraction and Boating Recipe for Disaster

hile motorists are constantly warned against the dangers of distracted driving, it turns out that boaters are also in need of a reminder. According to statistics from the U.S. Coast Guard, operator inattention was the number one reason for boating accidents. Distracted boat drivers were the cause of over 500 incidents, making it an important topic for discussion.

The National Association of State Boating Law Administrators reported that 22-24 percent of boating accidents were due to improper lookout and operator inattention combined. Between 9 and 14 percent of fatalities related to boating were also caused by distraction.

Common causes of boating accidents include many different types of distractions. Electronic distraction can include a phone or spotlight but can also mean the driver was attempting to use a radio, radar or navigation device. Objects on the boat, such as electronics, can also cause a lighting glare that prevents drivers from being able to see well. Lighting on shorelines, docks and other boats can cause background lighting that distracts or lowers visibility. Drivers who are eating, smoking or drinking fall into the category of performing distracting activities. Other things, such as sightseeing or talking with other passengers onboard can also be included.

Recently in 2022, the Lake of the Ozarks has several boating incidents and fatalities that were caused by operator inattention, excessive speed and failure to post a proper lookout – two of which were fatal. Compared to 2021 we had three fatalities where the probable cause was due to inattention, excessive speed or having a proper lookout.

Statewide statistics for Missouri in 2023:

Boating inattention: three fatalities; 25 injuries; 15 property damages

Excessive speed: one fatality; 20 injuries; eight property damages

Failure to post a proper lookout: four fatalities; 31 injuries; 23 property damages

The biggest distraction is the cell phone. Smart watches were designed as a second screen for your phone to aid in productivity and staying connected. While this is all well and good, many people are obsessed and check their e-mails, texts and phone calls, rather then focusing on the proper operation of the boat. When coupled with alcohol and/or other impairments it is a recipe for disaster.

How to avoid becoming a statistic?

1. Let the phone ring, you have voicemail, you can return a call or text when you are docked.

2. Leave the phone or smart watch at home or in the car, again it can wait.

3. If you really need to answer, have a passenger answer it for you but wait to return a call/text when you are docked.

4. Have a proper look out. You have a lot going on navigating and driving the boat safely. That person can assist you when visibility may not be the best – heavy boat traffic, watching out for other vessels and objects in the water, etc.

5. Reduce the speed and drive appropriately for the water, weather and boating conditions. That beer will still be at your favorite water side bar. If necessary, slow down.

6. Wear a life jacket or at least have one accessible in the event of an emergency.

Don't text and boat, put down the phone, have a lookout and drive responsibly so you can drive another day.

otorcycle enthusiasts from all over the U.S. will be coming to Lake of the Ozarks for the annual Bikefest event. Bikefest will be held Sept. 11-15. Five vendor villages, a Passport Run for the chance to win a new Harley, entertainment and live music will be held at locations across the Lake area.



KC Flight Formation Team

Brian Correll Pitts S2S

Unlike most airshow pilots, Brian Correll didn't grow up around airplanes as a child. However, he's more than made up for lost time in the air, accumulating over 5500hours in over 100 different models of aircraft from Piper Cubs to the Boeing KC-135 throughout his career. Brian's first exposure to aviation was an invitation from friends to join them on their first skydives. He was hooked and Brian had over 60 takeoffs in an airplane before experiencing his first landing, and the rest is, well as they say history.

The airshow airplane Brian flies is a modified Pitts S2S, much different than the original aircraft that left the factory



in 1979. The red and blue Pitts Bi-Plane has been strengthened and modified making it capable of the extreme aerobatic routine that Brian puts his aircraft through. Some of these changes are visible like the squared-off wingtips and enlarged control surfaces, while others are "under the hood" giving the aircraft more power with less weight. Add it all up and the Pitts combines awesome performance with the nostalgic Bi-Plane style making it the perfect airshow platform.

The North American Aviation T-6 Texan is an American single-engine advanced trainer aircraft used to train pilots of the United States Army Air Forces, United States Navy, Royal Air Force, Royal Canadian Air Force and other air forces of the British Commonwealth during World War II and into the 1970s.

"Show Me" B-25J Mitchell World War II Bomber Wartime Mission: The B-25J Mitchell was named after General Billy Mitchell, a famous Army Air Corps general of the 1920s and 1930s. It proved to be one of the best weapons and was possibly the most versatile aircraft of WWII. Heavily armed, it was utilized for high- and low-level bombing, strafing, photo-reconnaissance, submarine patrol, and a fighter. Its most distinguishing role was in the historic raid over Tokyo in 1942 by the Doolittle Raiders. The B-25J saw duty in every combat area flown by the Dutch, British, Chinese, Russian, Australian, and US forces. By 1947 there were only a few hundred B-25s remaining that performed a variety of training, reconnaissance, and support roles. Civilian use also included utility, transport, and agriculture duties.

He is the only jet fighter demo pilot to be granted an unlimited (day and night) aerobatic rating in jet fighters for the FAA.

Eclectic, versatile & laid back MARCUS WORDS – SMALL TOWN BOY TO LAKE AREA CELEBRITY

ust a small town boy from St. Joseph, Marcus Words burst on the Lake music scene 10 years ago and hasn't looked back. He has more than 100 shows booked this year as a solo act. Marcus Words Music, as a solo artist, performs at a variety of locations around the Lake, giving crowds the chance to kick

back in a relaxed atmosphere and experience his eclectic style. He usually plays acoustic guitar and sings a mix of 90s, alternative, folk, funk, blues, outlaw country and the greatest rendition of Folsom Prison Blues by Johnny Cash around.

Making his Lake debut back in 2011 with a band called Borderline Country, which evolved into the band Money for Nothin' (circa 2012-2019), Marcus was playing all summer seasons at the Lake until the band parted ways.

When Marcus performs as a solo artist, he plays and sings cover songs, but not what one would expect; he makes them his own. He has a certain staccato to his singing, and his voice range lights up a version of "Unanswered Prayers" by Garth Brooks with that high-low lilt making it sound as if he wrote it, instead of Brooks. Marcus describes how he feels about cover songs on his YouTube Music channel, "I don't think the original artists would want to hear me play their songs exactly how they played it. I assume they would want to experience their artwork through a different medium."

Marcus began performing in public at 10 years old with the school band. In the fifth grade he began playing bassoon and played around on his grandmother's piano. With early musical influences of Dave Matthews Band, Counting Crows, Garth Brooks, Incubus, Ani Di-Franco, Prince, Tim McGraw and Metallica, the variety of style shows when he takes the stage.



"My early influences will always be my cornerstones of creation but it's only natural for your influences to change over time," Marcus said. "I was probably about 23 years old by the time I was playing and singing. There was a time where I didn't think I could actually sing at all."

Where did all of Marcus' talent come from? Early on he was devoted to the band program in high school and even into his college years on a full-ride scholarship at Missouri Western University in St. Joseph. He played multiple instruments including bassoon, trombone, marching quad drums, baritone, euphonium, tuba,sousaphone, vibraphone, trumpet, marching snare, bass clarinet and then bass and acoustic guitar. He played a different instrument every year throughout middle and high school but Marcus did not become a band director or music teacher. He did some student classroom elementary education teaching in college. Instead, Marcus went into the finance world as a training director before one day packing a duffel bag and heading to Florida with a one-way plane ticket realizing his dream of becoming a performance musician.

He is still drawn to Florida when Marcus needs some time off from the Lake area.



THE TAVERN AT TRAILS END REOPENS AT HISTORIC CABIN



n his grandmother's humble home, John Buchanan learned the hearty flavors of food made from scratch using fresh, homegrown ingredients. One of his favorite desserts from those days is on the menu at The Tavern at Trails End. It is Grandma Wilma's Fried Pie, fruit-filled and served à la mode.

Another dessert, Gooey Butter Cake, hails from St. Louis where both John and Sherri Buchanan learned and worked every job in the restaurant industry before becoming owners here at the Lake. John began at age 14 with a catering company. At 19, he labored in a kitchen under a "European certified executive chef." Through these years and beyond, John acquired knowledge and experience to become part of the American Culinary Federation St. Louis de Cuisine in kitchens small and large.

One of those restaurants brought John and Sherri together. She had worked as a bartender, cashier, bookkeeper and manager. Together, the Buchanans decided to take full "creative control" here on the westside at Lake of the Ozarks. They searched for the right property and became owners of an old log cabin - one that may be inhabited by ghosts from years past. A previous owner closed and locked up, but after closing the door, she heard music. When she re-entered, she saw couples dancing on floors that were empty just moments before. The Buchanans have not been startled by the sudden appearance of dancers, but motion-activated hand towel dispensers have spit out paper when no one was near and staff has reported doors opening and closing without human hand.

These phenomena do not trouble John Buchanan. He feels a kinship with the old building. It is a good location for classy comfort foods. One of those is the Tavern Loaf, created by Chef John and executed by the Lake's Bread Bowl. Guaranteed to satisfy all tastes, the loaf consists of four separate

doughs – wheat, white, sourdough and rye – side by side. It represents Chef John's goal: comfort foods made special, more memorable and tastier with his own twist.

Anyone who has worked in and around restaurants knows the hours and weeks are long, but the work doesn't trouble John either. He says food is his "passion and God-given talent....The hours are not long when you enjoy what you are doing."

Sherri agrees. The two also enjoy the westside's welcoming restaurant-resort community.

As the Tavern is a thriving business, the Buchanans recommend reservations to insure a table, especially if more than two will be dining together. However, the oldest section of the building, now dubbed the Tavern Parlor, is fine for pre- and even post-dining camaraderie. There, guests can order a Bourbon Berry Smash at the front bar, admire the original Ozark stone fireplace and sit at high-tops for Tavern Fare such as cheeseburger sliders with bourbon bacon jam, Street Tacos or desserts.

In the dining room, the menu is more extensive and the entrées more elaborate. The Cowboy Ribeye is one of the most popular menu items. It is 16 ounces of bone-in steak, grilled and dressed with a homemade barbecue sauce under hand-cut, homemade fried onions. Another fine dining entrée is the Grilled Salmon glazed with bourbon honey and served with wild rice pilaf plus a seasonal vegetable.

Two hand-held choices are a Brisket Grilled Cheese on sourdough filled with house-made white cheddar pimento cheese. The second sandwich with the Tavern's unique twist is Not Your Everyday Grilled Cheese, made with the same housemade white cheddar pimento cheese plus American cheese, gruyère, roasted tomatoes and bourbon bacon jam. Both hand-helds come with pub fries.

All menu items represent the special twists and extra care the Buchanans put into every aspect of the restaurant. Their love for food and for building community is paying off. People have found the Tavern at Trails End, they're telling their friends and they're returning for special occasions as well as workday lunches and dinners.

John's goal is to prepare such delicious foods that diners will want to try every item on the menu–from soup to salad, hand-helds, entrées and desserts. His grandmother would surely be proud.
