The Fishing Report

Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

Bagnell Dam Report

The lake level was 657.5, generation of 1,000 CFS (cubic feet per second) throughout the week for a lake level of 657.5 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 64 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 704.6 level. To note: The Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Tournament Results

Adam Boehle won the two-day Alhonna Resort Fall Tournament last weekend with 10 bass weighing 29.08 pounds.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on spinnerbaits and buzz baits in pools below gravel shoals. White bass: Fair on crankbaits and shrimp in the tailrace area.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on swimbaits, jigs, buzz baits and topwater prop baits along main lake docks. Crappie: Slow on jigs 20 to 22 feet deep in brush piles. Catfish: Fair tight-lining off docks with worms.

Gravois


Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on spinnerbaits, topwater lures and jerkbaits around docks on the main lake and in backs of creeks. Crappie: Fair on jigs 8 to 20 feet deep around docks and brush piles. White bass: Good on topwater lures, small spoons, jerkbaits and crankbaits when the fish are surfacing and chasing shad schools in the backs of creeks.

Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on jerkbaits and in-line spinners along main lake docks and bluff ends. Crappie: Good on jigs or minnows 20 feet deep around brush piles. White bass: Good on in-line spinners along main lake points. Catfish: Good drifting cut shad 25 to 35 feet deep along main lake flats.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on spinnerbaits and jerkbaits around docks or jigs around shallow brush and laydowns. Crappie: Good on jigs 10 to 15 feet deep around brush piles.



Niangua

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on jerkbaits around main lake docks. Crappie: Fair on minnows around condo docks and brush piles 10 to 20 feet deep. White bass: Good trolling or casting Roostertails, Alabama rigs and Shad Rap crankbaits on the main channel.

Upper Osage

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on buzz baits, square bill crankbaits and jigs along shallow cover in coves. Crappie: Fair on jigs tipped with minnows 15 feet deep along bluff points. White bass: Good on Roostertails, square bill crankbaits and topwater lures along points. Catfish: Fair tight-lining off docks with cut shad and nightcrawlers or drifting cut shad 25 to 35 feet deep along main lake flats.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Clear. Crappie: Slow on jigs and minnows in the dead-water channel. White bass and hybrids: Slow on spoons in the evenings. Catfish: Slow on cut shad.

Fall is the perfect time to fish

MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION

he Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) says fall is an excellent time to go fishing. As many game fish prepare for winter by vigorously feeding, they can be easier to catch.

"Many species in lakes and streams are more mobile and are using different habitats this time of year," said Christopher Kennedy, MDC's former fisheries division supervisor for the southeast region. "Because of this, anglers can have an easier time locating their species of choice."

Fall is also typically a comfortable season for people, too, with pleasant temperatures and colorful views. Kennedy said in southeast Missouri, anglers have only one problem - too many places to fish and not enough time to try them all.

"Trout, catfish, bass, crappie and bluegill all are fair game right now," he said.

November first brings trout fishing to municipal lakes in Jackson, Farmington and Perryville. Fishing for catfish, whether blue, channel or flathead, can be very productive in larger southeast Missouri waters such as Wappapello and Clearwater lakes or the Mississippi River. Those seeking smallmouth or largemouth bass can find plenty of action wading, canoeing or kayaking small streams throughout the region.

"Some of the best fishing that exists is, in many cases, right out our back door," Kennedy said. "Often overlooked, private ponds are typically under-fished and offer fast and exciting action."

Kennedy cautions anglers to ask permission from landowners before fishing at a private pond.

"I would also advise leaving the gracious pond owner's property exactly the way you found it, and perhaps even sharing your harvest with them," he said.

Kennedy said the autumn colors and cooler weather add a memorable backdrop while making memories fishing with family and friends.

"We have so many things to do in our busy lives these days, I hope our society hasn't forgotten how to make time to slowdown and enjoy time fishing with their child, friend or family member before the cold winter sets in," he said. "Past fishing trips with family and friends are the memories that I cherish the most."



Wonderland Camp History

Charles J. Miller had a dream. It all started in the summer of 1969 during a conversation with the Executive Director of the Woodhaven Learning Center, a school for children with disabilities in Columbia.

His dream was of a residential summer camp on property he and his brother-in-law, Harry Brown, owned, located on the Lake of the Ozarks, a camp for everyone whatever their ability level. Their goal was to create a place for people and campers with disabilities to experience the exhilaration of outdoor play. A camp designed to match their special medical needs and provide them with the maximum safety with freedom to enjoy nature.

Meetings and discussions with concerned groups including the Missouri State Division of Mental Health, United Cerebral Palsy of Missouri and Woodhaven Learning Center, led to a meeting with the Missouri Jaycees Executive Committee.

Mr. Miller told the Jaycees of his dream, and on May 17, 1970, the Missouri Jaycees voted to adopt the camp project. Mr. Miller and Mr. Brown donated their land; 35 undeveloped acres adjoining the Lake of the Ozarks with an additional 200 acres for nature trails and out camping.

They named it Wonderland Camp and it was incorporated as a not-for-profit foundation by the State of Missouri.

Jaycee chapters throughout the state came forward to contribute. The Kansas City Jaycees provided the professional architectural and planning services. The Southern Platte Chapter took on half the cost and labor involved in the installation of a well and pump. And Missouri Jaycee Chapters throughout the state gave liberally of their labor to build the facilities.







Although only a few buildings were completed, the camp was functionally sound and usable enough to welcome its first campers in the spring of 1972. By the August closing date, 157 children and 83 counselors and staff had used and thoroughly enjoyed the new Wonderland Camp.

Since the first small start, construction has gone forward. Facilities have been expanded to provide an outdoor camping experience for over 1,000 campers each summer. The camp is still growing.

Fireridge Farmstand

love for animals combined with a concern for health and well-being is the foundation of Fireridge Farmstand located at 1396 S. Route 7 in Camdenton. Owned and operated by Dana and Collin Becker, this 55- acre venue provides visitors not only the opportunity to buy quality products but also an opportunity to enjoy the grounds.

Becker and her husband started the farm five years ago.

"We did it because we both love animals," she explained. "It was never meant to be anything more than a hobby. The last few years I had it on my heart that I needed to offer healthy food options for people."

Becker works full-time as a nurse and Collin is a firefighter in Osage Beach. They are both aware of some of the unhealthy ways foods today are processed, packaged and sold. Because of that, they wanted to offer an alternative.

"I wanted to provide and educate people on their health from a very basic nutritional standpoint," she said.





What sets them apart in their effort to offer a healthier quality of meat is they don't feed lot their animals. Instead of being kept in a small area and fed an unnatural diet, their animals spend their time in the pasture. Because of this, Becker explained, they have access to their natural diets. If they are confined, she added, it's because they chose to go into the barn. In addition, animals have unlimited access to water through an automated water system that continually replaces any water used with clean water.

Along with their full- time employment, they both work the farm alone without any hired help. They raise sheep, goats, pigs and chickens and have partnered with friends from a neighboring farm to purchase beef.

"We like the way they finish out their beef," Becker

said. "We buy the beef outright from them, then process and sell it."

Customers can purchase meat every Saturday from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. in the shop portion of their home. Their most popular items, Becker said, are ribeye steaks, chuck roast and lamb.

"We want to create a place that promotes healthy living," Becker said. "A huge part of healthy living is community. We want to bring people together, support local makers, and create a space that is fun for all ages."

To promote this even further, the couple will be celebrating the opening of their new storefront.

A grand opening was held April 1 for the 1,500-square-foot building that sits on the front portion of their property near the highway.



The storefront is open every Thursday through Sunday from 9 a.m.-6 p.m.

The new storefront building sells goods from other vendors, artisans and their own products as well. These include eggs, plants, houseware items and more.

"We want to support the community, and supporting our local artists provides a sense of community," she added. "By partnering with others we make up for the lack of time, talent and public knowledge we have in some things."

Becker said they love having kids out to the farm where they can pet the animals. They also transport some of their animals for birthday parties and church events.

"It's just a small petting zoo but people love it," she said. "Our animals love being pet and loved on."

Their plans for the farm include the addition of a larger animal petting area for kids and a fresh flower garden.


"We plan on doing this for a long time," Becker said. "I imagine it will continue to expand and grow. I would love to do classes and tutorials at some point in the future."





Make holiday crafting a family affair

amilies gather frequently during the holiday season as everyone enjoys the feasts and festivities that are synonymous with this time of year. Families often bake and decorate together, as these activities are inclusive of people of all ages. This time of year also is one for dabbling in creative pursuits. Now is a prime opportunity to bond with children over a table full of paint, glue, beads, and other crafty supplies. The crafts made during the holidays often become cherished mementos that will be regarded fondly for years to come. Here are some ideas to inspire holiday creativity.

SNOWMAN FAMILY

Handprint crafts are popular among children. Adults and children can dip their hands into washable white paint and make a handprint stamp on a small canvas, wooden palette or even a terracotta flowerpot. Decorate the white fingerprints with black dots to look like the faces of the snowmen and paint on top hats and scarves. In the years to come, artists can marvel at how small their hand prints once were.

WINE CORK REINDEER

Repurpose wine corks by crafting adorable little reindeer. Two corks make up the head and the body, and four vertically will comprise the feet. Stick on googly eyes, and add a small red or black bead for the nose. Pipe cleaners can be bent to form the reindeer's antlers.

FAMILY GARLANDS

This craft also makes use of handprints. Ask all family members to trace their handprints on different colors of construction paper or card stock. Cut out all of the paper hands, punch holes in the tops and then string a ribbon through. Decorate the Christmas tree or a mantle with this garland.

MINIATURE CHRISTMAS TREES

Paint the tips of gathered pine cones with green paint and allow to dry. Add white glitter or paint as "snow." Glue the pine cones to wine corks that will serve as the tree trunks, and attach a small wooden star to the top of the trees for the finishing touch.



DECOUPAGE ORNAMENTS

Purchase wooden or plastic ball ornaments. Cover with small scraps of cut fabric or paper dipped in craft glue or Mod Podge®, and attach to the ornament in an overlapping fashion. Remember to add a string from which the ornament can be hung on the tree. Allow to dry completely before use.

PAPER CHAIN ADVENT CALENDAR

Cut strips of paper to make a link for every day of Advent. Advent begins on Sunday, December 1, 2024, and lasts until Christmas. The top link can be any design artists prefer, but those who need a little inspiration can consider a religious symbol, the face of a reindeer, a snowman, or a Christmas tree. Hang the chain and then children can take turns ripping off a link from the bottom each day as they count down to the holiday.

POPSICLE STICK SNOWFLAKES

Paint four popsicle sticks per snowflake in desired colors. Decorate with glue, pompoms, beads, or other trinkets. Add small looped strings to hang the ornaments.






