



## FISHING THE OFFSEASON

### at Lake of the Ozarks

hile winter and spring become the offseason for recreational boating at Lake of the Ozarks, those seasons offer prime time fishing for bass and crappie anglers. The lake rarely freezes over much anymore and the lack of boating and fishing pressure during the winter gives anglers easier access to their favorite fishing spots. The weather during winter and early spring at the lake can be frigid so anglers need to dress warmly to fish comfortably. Heavy parkas and coats will keep you warm but can also hinder your fishing ability. I prefer wearing layers of lightweight clothes for better mobility. I start layering with a pair of thermal underpants and undershirt covered by a pair of jeans and a cotton sweatshirt. My next layer consists of a pair of insulated coveralls and an insulated pullover. My final layer is a Gore-Tex rain parka and a balaclava cap for my head. I wear a pair of thin insulated gloves while fishing and a motorcycle helmet with face shield for when I am running my boat. A pair of cotton socks and insulated Gore-Tex boots stuffed with foot warmers keep my feet warm on even the coldest winter days.

Bass in the vast open water of Lake of the Ozarks could be swimming anywhere in the wintertime. Good electronics will help you find open water bass by scanning for two underwater clues: baitfish schools and bottom structure. Finding at least one of these clues will eliminate a lot of dead water and pinpoint the largest concentrations of wintertime bass.

Baitfish schools will roam in the open water searching for the warmest water possible on the main lake or in large coves. Bass will follow the forage and hold below the baitfish pods ready to pick off any dying baitfish that flutters down to them.

Finding bottom structure will help you eliminate vast sections of open water and pinpoint winter bass hangouts. Prime winter hangouts for Lake of the Ozarks bass include river or creek channel swings and point drop-offs with rock or brush piles.

You have hit the jackpot if you find baitfish schools roaming around the bass' wintertime hangouts. Then it becomes a matter of pinpointing the depth of the baitfish along the structure to determine the best lure presentation. If you see baitfish and bass suspended at the middepth level then your best bet is to throw a suspending jerkbait or an Alabama rig. Try jigs or spinnerbaits if you see baitfish near the bottom.

Bass start snapping out of their winter doldrums when daylight hours lengthen and water temperatures rise in

the early spring. Lake of the Ozarks bass start migrating towards the spawning coves and can be caught during this time along transition banks with mixed rock (boulders and chunk rock or chunk rock and gravel).

Your lure selection expands during early spring when more bass forage becomes available as shad die off and bluegill and crayfish activity increases. Five lures that catch transitioning bass are a jig and plastic craw, suspending stickbait, crankbait, tube bait and spinnerbait. The jig-and-craw combo, tube bait and brown or red crankbaits best imitate crayfish while suspending stickbaits, spinnerbaits and pearl or chrome crankbaits mimic the lake's baitfish.

Large docks on the main lake are prime spots to find wintertime crappie suspended from 8 to 20 feet deep over water as deep as 70 feet. Large concentrations of crappie will spend the winter at the mouths of coves and creeks throughout the lake.


Vertical jigging or swimming a jig through the schools of crappie can produce a quick limit of the tasty panfish. A 1/16- or 1/8-ounce jighead with a tube bait, plastic shad body or small swimbait in blue/pearl, purple/pearl, white/chartreuse or black/chartreuse colors work best for wintertime crappie at the lake.

By late February or early March crappie start their migration towards the spawning banks. Late winter warm spells of two to three days at the lake can trigger some good shallow action in stained water. My favorite late winter pattern is throwing a jig and bobber rig to schools of crappie congregated on secondary points. After I find the crappie with my electronics, I cast the jig set about 6 to 8 feet below the bobber to the spot where the fish are staging. I let the rig drift with the wind, which imparts enough action on the jig to trigger bites. If the weather is calm, I occasionally twitch the bobber to generate some action on my jig.

Recent mild winters has led to an increase in winter bass tournaments. The Winter Bass Challenge presented by BassingBob features five tournaments running from November through February. Early spring tournaments that will draw around 150 boats are the Anglers in Action tournament on March 8 and the Ozark Mountain Team Trail event on March 15.

While recreational boating dwindles during the offseason, the lake is still buzzing with anglers in pursuit of cold water bass and crappie.

Anglers willing to brave the cold can fish their favorite spots in solitude during wintertime at the lake.

## The Fishing Report

#### Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

#### **Bagnell Dam Report**

The lake level was 657.6, generation of 6,000 CFS (cubic feet per second) throughout the week for a lake level of 657.1 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 42 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 705.3 level. To note: the Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

#### **Tournament Results**

Andy Newcomb and Kevin Freeze won the Fitz Fishing & Tackle Winter Bass Challenge last Saturday with five bass weighing 19.95 pounds.



#### **Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Good on Alabama rigs along steep rock banks. Crappie: Good on small swimbaits around current breaks. White bass and hybrids: Good on 3-inch swimbaits. Walleye: Good on 3-inch swimbaits. Catfish: Good on cut skipjack herring.

#### **Lower Lake**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on Alabama rigs and sinking jerkbaits along secondary points and 17 to 20 feet deep in brush. Crappie: Fair on jigs 10 to 20 feet deep on secondary points. Catfish: Fair on Damiki rigs in the middle of coves.

#### **Gravois**

Water clarity: Clear. Ice covered around the Gravois Mills access area. Black bass: Slow on jigs and Alabama rigs along channel banks and secondary points in creeks. Crappie: Slow on jigs 10 to 20 feet deep in brush along main lake points and halfway back in coves.

#### **Mid-Lake**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on Alabama rigs and Damiki rigs along secondary points and 45-degree banks in coves. Crappie: Good on jigs 20 to 35 feet deep along secondary points and in the middle of coves.

#### **Grand Glaize**

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Fair on Alabama rigs and suspending jerkbaits along steep banks. Crappie: Fair on jigs 15 to 20 feet deep along secondary points and in pockets of coves.

#### Niangua

Water clarity: Clear on the lower end and stained on the upper end. Sections of coves and main lake are covered with ice above Larry Gale access. Most of the Little Niangua is frozen. Crappie: Fair on jigs 8 to 25 feet deep along main and secondary points.

#### **Upper Osage**

The main channel and coves are covered with ice.

#### **Truman Dam spillway**

The spillway and dead-water channel are frozen.

## The different types of golf carts

#### **ELECTRIC CARTS**

If batteries take a particularly long time to charge or are not known for especially long life after each charge, then drivers may find electric carts restrictive.

#### **GAS CARTS**

Gas-powered golf carts may not need as much maintenance as cars and trucks that run on gas, but they tend to require more upkeep than the alternatives. Gas carts are noticeably noisier than electric carts, which can make them less appealing to drivers and their neighbors. Gas-powered carts also emit fumes that are both unhealthy and less than aromatic, which can be disagreeable to drivers and their neighbors.

#### **BATTERIES**

Batteries are another variable to consider when deciding which golf cart is the best fit. According to the Florida-based Advantage Golf Cars, the four types of golf cart batteries are:

- · Flooded lead acid (wet) batteries
- · AGM lead acid batteries
- · Gel lead acid batteries
- · Lithium-ion golf cart batteries

Advantage notes that golf carts typically come with flooded led acid batteries, but such carts typically can be fitted with lithium-ion batteries. Lithium-ion batteries offer greater longevity over lead-acid alternatives, but they also cost more, though prices could drop as these batteries become more popular. Advantage also notes that lithium-ion batteries require no maintenance, weigh less and charge faster.

am sitting at my kitchen table looking at the freshly fallen snow and a temperature of 17 degrees and what do I see in my cove? Yep, people fishing.

While most boats are laid up over winter, there's still plenty of boating in winter to enjoy: in warmer climates for the purpose of fishing or simply cruising, on cold rivers where winter steelhead exist, in coastal waters for migrating species and so forth.

Whether you're boating in winter from an open boat, a boat with a cabin or simply a kayak, you have to respect the elements and be aware of the effects of exposure to cold air and water, even on a warm and windless day. While you should always have all of the normal safety equipment when you go boating, here are 10 tips specific to enjoying cold-water boating in winter.

First and foremost, when boating in the winter, dress for the water temperature, and most of all wear your life jacket.

"I want to start boating in the colder months of the year. What kind of gear do I need?"

Boating in the colder months? Because the question is

much more complex, and it involves your safety, here are some of the factors, in no particular order, that figure into what you need to wear:

- Water temperature Water conducts heat away from your body 25 times more efficiently than air. The best advice is "dress for the swim." The colder the water, the faster your body will lose heat.
- Personal comfort range Here in Missouri we have some folks that wear shorts even in the winter. And, we have others that have heaters running under their desks in the summer months. Only you know how your body works.
- Water conditions Are you fishing from a raft? Are you paddling the inlets of a lazy river, lake observing or hunting wildlife?
- If you do go for a swim, how long are you likely to be in the water? Are you in conditions where you won't be in the water long and can get to shore easily to warm up and get into dry clothes?

The bottom line is: cold water kills. As internationally recognized water safety expert Charlie Walbridge points out in Cold Water Protection and Hypothermia, as the body's internal temperature drops, automatic responses begin in the attempt to keep the major organs and functions protected. These responses rapidly lead to loss of manual dexterity, uncontrollable shivering and diminished mental facilities. These inhibit your ability to self-rescue and make the decisions necessary for your survival.

Okay, so at this point you're probably saying, "Alright, I hear all that, but my original question still stands. What kind of gear do I need for cold water boating?

#### 1. CONSIDER SURVIVAL WEAR

Wearing appropriate clothing and footwear is obviously important for winter boating. However, a float coat or survival suit is a good investment if you'll be venturing out often.

#### 2. HAVE TWO PAIRS OF WARM GLOVES

If you're fishing, one pair will likely get wet. Save the second pair for the ride home.

#### 3. USE HAND AND TOE WARMERS

Put hand warmers in your gloves or at least in your jacket pockets. Use toe warmers in your boots, or maybe electric socks or boot-warming insoles.

#### 4. COVER YOUR FACE AND EYES

Use ski goggles to cover your eyes when the boat is running fast, especially if you're the operator. A warm balaclava should cover all exposed facial flesh. Remember that wind chill is considerable the faster the boat is moving.

#### 5. FACE THE STERN; GO LOW

If you're a passenger, put your back to the bow and face the stern when the boat is running. Get low if possible; some passengers sit on a bean bag on the floor.

#### 6. KEEP YOUR PFD ON

The shock of sudden entry into cold water dictates cold weather boating prudence. If something goes drastically wrong, you have a better chance of survival in cold water if your PFD is already on, secure and properly fitted.

#### 7. MAKE SURE YOUR BOAT/MOTOR IS IN TOP SHAPE

This is not the time for a crippling breakdown that strands you, especially when there are fewer people on the water to come to your assistance. Don't go out unless you have 100% confidence in your vessel.

#### 8. LET SOMEONE KNOW

Have a written float plan to let others know where you are going, what time you expect to be back and who to call in case of emergency.

#### 9. HAVE COMPANY

Take a capable companion (or paddle with another person if you're kayaking) along who can lend a hand if you get into trouble. Whether solo or with someone, let someone else know where you're headed, when you expect to be back and when to raise an alarm if you haven't contacted them.

#### 10. DON'T TAKE CHANCES

Think through your actions. Could you possibly run aground, hit an underwater obstruction and disable your motor, or get stuck behind an ice floe? In each case, you could be in for a long and cold time until you can get out of the predicament. Be realistic about your abilities and the circumstances, especially considering the coldness of the weather and water. Consider how you'd have to deal with an incident that you might otherwise avoid by making a good decision rather than a risky one.

Go out and enjoy cold weather boating! Be safe to enjoy boating another day.







## **Radio-Active Theater**

#### BRINGS UNIQUE ENTERTAINMENT TO THE LAKE

he Lake of the Ozarks is no stranger to live entertainment on a nightly basis, however, some unique options may fly under the radar if you're unaware of them taking place.

One group in particular, the Radio-Active Players, perform a Readers Theater-style show monthly at the Lake, an experience that may not be on your radar if you're not a local.

Radio-Active Theater started in October of 2018. The founders were Will Runyon, Jr., Kris Oliver and Dave Bond.

Around September or October of 2018, Dave and Will performed in a readers theater fund raiser for the library in Jefferson City. Having enjoyed that experience, Will (and his collaborator Kris) enlisted Dave's help putting together a similar show at Great Stone Coffee (now Barista Go Coffee House).

A cast of friends was quickly assembled for the first performance, and they have continued to meet up and perform ever since. The Radio-Active Players offer a unique performance as Reader's Theater is rare these days. The performers are primarily voice acting, with minimal

theatrical equipment (no or few props, costumes, sets, etc.), but are accompanied by sound effects and music. It hearkens back to the pre-TV days of gathering around the radio with friends and family to share some "theater of the mind." The intimate medium and relative simplicity offers some respite from today's over-stimulating world of frenetic imagery and perpetual, disposable content. While expering the audio-only version of the show

encing the audio-only version of the show is perfectly adequate, seeing the show live is where the real magic happens. The chemistry between

where the real magic happens. The chemistry between actor/characters, body language, facial expressions, etc. creates a very unique performance. The thin facade allows actors' personalities to bleed through and make a more personal connection with the crowd. The leanness of the production also allows for more agility and spontaneity, and the flow and content of the show is often influenced by the venue and audience.



"For instance, we have, at times, pulled audience members up to perform in the show, and ad-libbing and improvisation are common.

All that said, we also take advantage of available technology to live stream our monthly performances and publish a bi-weekly podcast," says Runyon.

The group typically performs four original, locally-written pieces, most of which are provided by members of the troupe who also perform. The shows usually consist of three 15-25 minute pieces and one 5-10 minute piece (though it varies from month to month, depending on what scripts are submitted).

Performers are seated on stage and move to the microphones when their parts come up. Sound effects and music are "performed" by Will, who does the sound design and triggers the cues from his laptop during the show. Even though there is an additional layer of entertainment and connection to be had by watching the performers, you can close your eyes (or listen to an audio-only recording/stream) and see the events unfold in your mind.

"Our annual anniversary happens to be in October, so in addition to celebrating that milestone, we appear in costume and encourage the audience to do so as well for some memorable Halloween shows," Runyon said.

Runyon says the groups goal is to entertain and inspire others.

"Beyond giving people a fun reason to get out of the house and socialize, part of what I like about the format is that the whole process is so visible and accessible," he said. "I want people to see us and not only say, 'I want to do that,' but to realize, 'I can do that!'

For the first couple of years the group had an open door policy for writers and performers. They held open casting calls and anyone who showed up would get a chance on stage.

"I don't think we ever rejected a script," Runyon said.

"Fortunately, they were all good enough we didn't have to."

Runyon said the Radio-Active Players aren't currently taking new cast members, but said it would be an honor to someday hear that they inspired someone to start their own similar group.

"We're working on booking more regional shows and growing our online audience in hopes of someday bringing the live Radio-Active Theater experience to audiences all over the world," Runyon said.

Radio-Active Players currently has eight cast members, most of whom are also writers, and a couple other regular contributors: Will Runyon,

Jr., "show-runner," sound design and performance and voice actor; Lori Ann Stuckmeyer, co-author, digital art video presentation design and performance and voice actor; Matt Clemmons, creator, co-author and voice actor; Larry Williams, author and voice actor; Tony Coons, author and voice actor; Angelina LaVonne, occasional author and voice actor; Shaunna Wood, occasional author and voice actor; Sandra Andes, voice actor; Todd Hanks, author; and Jeff and Kathy Johnson, sound engineering, tech and gear assistance.

When asked what their favorite part of the theater group was, each member had a different angle they enjoyed most.

"I enjoy the camaraderie of the group. I'm proud that the show is entirely written and produced by RAT," Coons said.

"What I love about performing in our group is the ability for each of us to be able to bring multiple characters to life in one performance, LaVonne said. "We have four scripts, meaning four different stories we bring to life in an evening, so there are so many characters that are being portrayed. Having some new stories and some that are ongoing series, the possibilities are endless."

"I love being part of Radio-Active Theater because I get to spend time with some of my favorite people in the whole world, Andes said. "I started out working on a theater major but shifted to broadcasting and kind of abandoned my passion for theater for a career in radio. I'm pleased that I no longer have to choose between the two... the occasion is rare within the scope of my career that I am able to convey emotion and stretch my voice dramatically. I deeply appreciate the time I spend with my brothers and sisters in this group and the audience that honors us with their attention every month."




