



Swing into Spring

pring is in the air and it's time to dust off the clubs and hit the links. After a long winter, the Lake Area courses are open and ready for action. In this and upcoming issues we will spotlight a different Lake of the Ozarks golf course and give some history and features of each course. The Lake Area currently features 12 public and one private golf course with a few of them dating back to the 1960s. This issue's featured course is The Oaks Golf Course, located on Highway KK at the Margaritaville Lake Resort at the beautiful Lake of the Ozarks.

Like many of the courses at the Lake, the Oaks features plenty of tree-lined fairways, rolling hills and gorgeous scenery to enhance your golf experience. If you're a nature lover, you will love the Oaks and if you are not, you will be by the time you finish your rounds.

I recently spoke with the Oaks director of golf, Paul Leahy, about the history of the Oaks and everything the course has to offer.

The original course at Margaritaville (then called Tan-Tar-A) was the nine-hole Hidden Lakes course located next to Tan-Tar-A's hotel and lodging facility. In the late 1960s and 1970s, golf was becoming a popular sport in Missouri and the rest of the nation. Hidden Lakes was built in the early '70s in preparation for the Governor's Conference, featuring then governor Warren E. Hearnes, that was held at Tan-Tar-A during that time.

Construction on the Oaks golf course began in the mid 1970s but was halted during the recession and due to the impact that the gas shortages had on the economy. The design team consisted of Bruce Devlin,

an Australian PGA golfer and Robert von Hagge, a course designer with over 250 courses in 20 countries to his credit. Construction resumed in the late '70s and the course was eventually completed and opened to the public in 1980. At the time of construction there were only a few nine-hole courses at the Lake including Hidden Lakes (at the time it was the original nine-hole course owned by Tan-Tar-A (now Margaritaville), Lake Valley and the public courses in Eldon and Versailles. The only other 18-hole course in existence at the Lake was Dogwood Hills, which is no longer in business, however, other 18-hole courses would soon follow.

Par for the course is 71 (36 on the front nine and 35 on the back nine) with a total length of 6,432 yards and a rating of 71.7 and a slope of 135. Now, if you are like me and you enjoy golfing but have absolutely no idea what some of this terminology means, please follow along. A course with a rating lower than par would be easier to play for the average golfer and a course with a rating higher than par, would be a little more difficult. The slope is a similar rating tool (which ranges from 55 to 155), with the higher the number, the more difficult a course would be for the average golfer.

The average slope for the 12 courses at the Lake is 129, meaning that the Oaks is slightly more difficult than the average course at the Lake, which according to Paul Leahy, "is because the fairways are a little narrower than some of the other courses in the area." In addition to the slightly more narrow fairways, the course also features water hazards, some hilly terrain and plenty of trees

I asked Leahy which hole was the most difficult to play and which one he thought was the easiest. After some thought he replied, "The most difficult hole is number nine, which includes a downhill shot over water, which can be a little harder for a number of golfers." Paul added, "Number one is short and if played properly would be the easiest hole for most golfers."

Like most Lake-area courses, the Oaks features memberships, leagues, lessons (including clinics), tournaments and a number of charity outings each year. The club house also has a full-service pro-shop with club fittings, club rentals, a bar with a limited food menu, a pool table and a shuffleboard table.

There are a couple of unique things about the Oaks that differentiate them from the other courses at the Lake. They have one of the few driving ranges where you can actually use your woods to drive the ball. Most courses are irons only due to the length of the driving range, but at the Oaks you have 250 yards and plenty of tee boxes. Paul also reminded me of the fact that part of the course was originally a working ski slope. You can still imagine skiers racing downhill in the winter in the area around holes eight and 10 and on the driving range.

Over the years, the course has seen a number of celebrities enjoy a game of golf including George Brett, Ozzie Smith and John Goodman as well as members of REO Speedwagon, Styx and ZZ Top when they performed at the Ozarks Amphitheater.

You can book tee times online at www.tan-tar-a.com, then go to the "Play" tab and then navigate to "Golf." Rates vary based on time of day with lower rates in the mid to late afternoon and higher rates in the mornings and weekends. If you get thirsty during your game, they have a beverage cart making the rounds the majority of the days they are open. They also offer stay-and-play golf packages and from time-to-time you can find discounts on their website.

The next time you are looking for a way to enjoy the beautiful outdoors at the Lake of the Ozarks, consider the Oaks Golf Resort at Margaritaville and swing into spring!

The Fishing Report

Your guide to catching fish at LOZ!

Bagnell Dam Report

The lake level was 657.1 generation of 30,000 CFS (cubic feet per second) throughout the week for a lake level of 657.5 by the weekend. Surface temperature at Bagnell Dam was 58 degrees. Truman Lake was at the 713.4 level. To note: the Lower Lake is from the dam to the 22-mile mark; Mid-Lake is from the 22- to 44-mile mark, the Upper Osage is from the 44-mile mark to the Route 65 Bridge.

Bagnell Dam spillway/Osage River

Water clarity: Clear. Crappie: Fair on small swimbaits around current breaks. Walleye: Fair on 3-inch swimbaits in the spillway area. White bass: Fair on jigs along gravel banks.

Lower Lake

Water clarity: Clear. Black bass: Slow on wacky-rigged stickworms in gravel pockets and Carolina-rigged plastic lizards on secondary points. Crappie: Fair shooting jigs under docks along secondary points.

Gravois

Water clarity: Stained. Black bass: Fair on Carolina-rigged creature baits, wacky-rigged Senkos, spinnerbaits and finesse jigs along secondary points and pockets of coves. Crappie: Good shooting tube jigs and swimbaits under docks halfway back in coves and on jigs along shallow laydowns.

Mid-Lake

Water clarity: Murky. Black bass: Fair on Wiggle Wart crankbaits, Carolina- or Texas-rigged plastic lizards and Chatterbaits along gravel banks. Crappie: Good on jigs 1 to 3 feet deep along gravel banks in coves.

Grand Glaize

Water clarity: Murky. Black bass: Slow on Rk Crawlers crankbaits and jigs along gravel flats and creek channel banks in coves. Crappie: Good on jig-and-bobber setups 1 to 3 feet deep along gravel banks.



Caden Kowal and Gracelyn Tavis took home the first-place prize at the Angry Pirate Co-ed Fishing Tournament held April 15 at the Gravois Mills Public Access from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The pair ended the tournament with three bass weighing in at a total of 5.79 pounds and scoring them \$240. Niangua

Water clarity: Muddy. Black bass: Slow on Trick Worms and crankbaits along gravel banks. Crappie: Slow on jigs 2 to 4 feet deep along gravel banks.

Upper Osage

Water clarity: Murky. Black bass: Good on jigs and spinnerbaits along chunk rock and gravel banks. Crappie: Good on minnows 3 feet deep along gravel banks. Catfish: Excellent on cut shad and nightcrawlers.

Truman Dam spillway

Water clarity: Stained. Crappie: Good on jig-and-bobber rigs 12 feet deep in the spillway. White bass: Fair on 3-inch Sliders and swimbaits in the evenings. Catfish: Fair on cut shad in the spillway.

ith the arrival of warmer weather, boaters are preparing for another season on the water. As boats get ready to launch, it's the perfect time to talk about an often overlooked–but incredibly important—safety concern: boat fires. Fires on boats can be caused by a variety of factors, including gas leaks, electrical issues or flammable materials such as paper, plastics and even metals. The risk of fire is present, regardless of the boat's size or configuration, so it's crucial to conduct a thorough inspection before hitting the water.

A fire safety plan is essential for every boat, and it should include prevention measures, response procedures and evacuation strategies, all tailored to the specific vessel and its occupants. It's also important to practice the plan regularly to ensure that everyone on board knows their role and can react quickly in an emergency. Understanding the basic principles of fire safety is key: a fire needs three elements—fuel, oxygen and heat. If any one of these is removed, the fire will be extinguished. The best way to deal with a fire is to break the chain by cutting off the fuel source, the heat source or the oxygen supply.



On boats, this can be especially challenging. Fueling systems, electrical wiring and other materials can all be potential fire hazards. To respond effectively, it's essential to know what kind of fire extinguisher to use. For solid materials that leave an ash, use water; for flammable liquids like gasoline, use a CO2 Class B extinguisher (the best choice for boats); and for electrical fires, use a Class C extinguisher to avoid shock hazards. Always use a marine-rated extinguisher, aiming at the base of the flames with a sweeping motion.

In the event of a fire, the first step is to assess the situation and have all passengers put on life vests. Position the boat downwind, if possible, to minimize the spread of smoke and fumes. Next, turn off the electrical power and evaluate the best way to contain or extinguish the fire. If you can't put it out, evacuate and call for help. Keep a lookout for possible reflash, as fires can reignite if they haven't been fully extinguished, or if ventilation is insufficient.

Many common items aboard boats can fuel a fire. A rag used to clean up after fueling, for example, can easily ignite if stored improperly. Other potential fire starters include gasoline, flammable liquids like spray cans, paper, plastic, batteries and even grills. Make it a habit to regularly check compartments for the smell of fuel, and ventilate the boat thoroughly after fueling. If you have an inboard or inboard/outboard engine, always use the blower and open the hatch for added ventilation.

Additionally, when fueling your boat, always remember to properly ground the fueling nozzle to the boat's metal structure before starting. This simple step helps prevent static electricity buildup, which could cause a spark and ignite the fuel vapors. Ensure that you ground the nozzle before any fuel is dispensed, and always recheck the nozzle after fueling for any leaks or signs of damage.

Be sure to inspect all electrical wiring and systems for any signs of wear, such as brittle or cracked wires. If you're installing new equipment, be careful with wiring to prevent short circuits. It's also important to check that fuel is stored correctly, according to your boat's manufacturer

guidelines, and that any flammable liquids are kept off the boat entirely. Avoid smoking near fuel docks and marinas.

Regularly update your fire extinguisher and ensure that smoke and carbon dioxide alarms are installed, with fresh batteries. Testing these alarms is critical to ensure they function properly in case of an emergency.

Captain Mike's Advice to Boat By: "Keep it simple: inspect, prepare and stay aware. Keep your extinguisher updated, test your alarms and double-check everything-espe-

cially after fueling. Fire safety on the water is about smart habits, not just emergency reactions."

By following these tips, you can ensure that your boat is prepared for a safe and enjoyable season on the water.

CAPTAIN'S TIP OF THE MONTH

"Always sniff before you start."


Before starting your engine, take a moment to smell around the engine compartment and fuel storage areas. Even a faint odor of gasoline can signal a leak or buildup of fumes.

Trust your nose—it's one of the best fire prevention tools on your boat.





Trail rides are open seven days a week. Cost is \$75 and trail ride times are 10 a.m., 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Reservations are generally required at least a day in advance. Custom/private horse rides are \$95 per hour.

To make a reservation, contact info@ozarkhorses.com or call (573) 557-5501. Once a reservation request is received, a confirmation email or text with details regarding the payment and directions will be sent. Upon arrival, payment will be finalized and riders will be required to review and sign a waiver. Riders under 18 years old must have a parent or guardian sign the waiver and are required to wear a helmet during the trail ride.

A safety orientation and horse introduction is conducted before each ride to ensure riders well-being and comfort level during their visit.

In addition to horseback riding, there are also options for trail riding lessons, equine clinics, custom guided rides and horse boarding.

Trail ride requirements

- Riders must be eight years old and above. Riders under 15 years old must be accompanied by an adult.
- The weight limit for riders is 250 pounds.
- Helmets are suggested (and provided) for all riders and are required for riders 18 years old or younger.
- Closed-toe shoes are a must. Please don't wear sandals.
- Wearing long pants is recommended.






